	Cllr Allen welcomed all to the meeting.			
3.	Notes from Previous Meeting (17 <sup>th</sup> November 2021)			
	Notes had been previously sent out. February's meeting was cancelled due to a low turnout.			
	Actions from the November meeting had all been completed. All agreed they were a true record.			
4.	Nature Recovery	– Helen Francis (Rotherham Climate Action)		
	Helen's colleague Nicky presented an overview of what is happening in the area at the moment in terms of projects and also advice on how Parish Councils can get involved. Slides will be circulated to the group after the meeting.			
	Two main issues: -			
	Climate Crisis Nature Crisis			
	Questions/Thoughts: -			
	Discussion was held around areas including Dinnington and Wales having land that was previously green belt redesignated and now due to be built on. The question of how we can make nature work in these cases was asked.			
		ach allocated site will have a policy around what or nature. She encouraged Parish Councils to		

	speak to the Council and ensure their voices are heard. The Council are currently under resourced in terms of ecology expertise and are relying on consultants.	
	Cllr Allen stated that she understands the views of colleagues but the local plan was approved in 2018 re land. The decision is made, it cannot be overturned but there is an opportunity as sites come on board to argue for the best outcome. Working with partners is important. We need to continue discussions and keep conversations moving forward.	
	Colleagues asked whether an Ecological report was available for each site?	
	Nicky confirmed that a survey would take place prior to development. All developers have to take steps to leave more than they take.	
	<u>D Rowley, Ravenfield PC</u> – 320 houses being built currently by Redrow homes. Can we insist on anything else when talking to them?	
	Nicky stated that there a few things including bat bricks and swift bricks. New policies are currently being put together but are in the early stages. Parish Council's are advised to think about where you would like to see more, Parish Council's can be looking at maps to help decide where more biodiversity needs to go. Can send some advice out after this meeting.	
	Helen stated that they are happy to help signpost Parish Council's.	
	<u>Z Davis, Todwick PC</u> – Is there any funding set aside for this type of work? Ideas are great but expensive.	
	Helen clarified that there is lots of funding available but need to know what we need the funding for initially and then can look into sourcing it.	
	Cllr Allen suggested individual Parish C's want a conversation with Helen/Nicky, to contact them and ask if they would come and see them.	
	<u>D Fenwick-Green, Brampton PC</u> – Currently volunteering myself, struggling to do the work, not enough volunteers. Where can I get the help from?	
	Nicky stated they can help signpost volunteers. Would be a good idea to talk outside of the meeting.	
5.	Tree Planting Programme – Andy Lee (RMBC)	
	Whole department that looks after nature. The service makes sure there is balance with house building and nature. We don't have anyone in an Ecology post at the moment, working with outsourced people for that expertise.	
	Andy gave an overview of tree planting in Rotherham. Slides will be circulated after the meeting.	

• 51 woodlands owned by RMBC.

Andy talked to the group about the benefit of tree planting,

- Sustainable Plan RMBC Commitments/Pulling partners together
- Dedicated land for planting up to 2030
- New Tree Management Protocol used when people approach with enquiries.

What can Parish Councils do? What does it do?

Questions/Thoughts:-

Parish Council colleagues expressed concern that with deprivation/poverty in the area, how can Rotherham Council justify spending money on trees?

Andy clarified that external money was being used to fund rather than Council money.

<u>J Loftus, Dinnington St Johns PC</u> – Explained that she had noticed existing woodlands being deliberately cut down in her area, huge trees had been chopped down. Someone from the council did come to have a look but didn't progress any further. What can be done?

Andy explained that the Woodland budget is £4000 a year for all the woodland area. Hoping to increase this amount this year. There are some resourcing issues. The main issue here is identifying who's cut them down, witnesses are needed to progress via the Police. Would encourage anyone with any information to pass this on.

PC colleagues asked whether the Planting of trees included shrubbery/hedgerows?

Andy confirmed it did, all trees even in the hedgerows.

<u>C Alsop, Laughton Common/Thurcroft PC</u> – Expressed an interest in working with Andy and his team as they have land on Laughton Recreational land – details have already been sent through. Andy will pick this up with Carol out of the meeting.

Parish Council colleagues had identified recently that residents had found Rotherham Council hadn't surveyed a specific tree for 18 years?

	Andy explained that up to 5 years ago Rotherham Council had dealt with surveys reactively, the number of tree officers had doubled in the last 5 years. Applying for funding to resource further. We would ideally like to visit trees every 3 years. Andy is aware of the tree in question and it has been inspected.
6.	Youth Provision – Early Help (RMBC), Cllr Tony Griffin & Jordan Arno (Whiston Parish Council), Gary Whitaker (Active Regen)
	Amanda and other Early Help colleagues provided a brief overview of what is available through the service: -
	<ul> <li>Jo - Family Support: -</li> <li>Staff hold cases, working with families through an assessment process</li> <li>Also work with other partners.</li> <li>TAF– Team around the family - Working with them, not telling them what to do.</li> <li>Work with social care also.</li> <li>Multi skilled link workers helping with parenting, 1:1 basis.</li> <li>Workers work with designated schools that they visit to offer advice and guidance, attendance is also looked at, this then creates a pathway through Rotherham Council.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Rachel – Outreach and Engagement: -</li> <li>0-19 service,</li> <li>Baby yoga, baby massage, toddler yoga.</li> <li>Milestone progression - working with families and groups</li> <li>Looking to set up some outreach work in Aston supporting year 6 pupils</li> <li>Offer support to young people over 16</li> <li>Offer keep on track programme, universal youth provision.</li> </ul>
