

## Prime Areas of Learning

### COMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE

- Join in with the repeated refrain in the story 'It's only one!' and use expression in your voice.
- Sing songs linked to the theme e.g. Mary, Mary Quite Contrary, Lavenders Blue, Don't Drop Litter.
- Teach children associated vocabulary including refuse, reduce, recycle and rot.
- Name the different animals that live in Sunnyville.



### PSED

- Discuss the feelings words shared in the story including not happy, fuming and grumpy. Can you think of any other words to describe how you'd feel if you saw someone hurt the environment?
- Ask the children to bring in recyclables from home to use in the workshop area and tell parents about the importance of recycling.
- Download the Earth Cubs app to help children learn more about helping the environment.
- Circle time – what happens to the rubbish if we drop it on the floor?

### PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

- Go on a litter pick around your local area.
- Go on a walk in the local area and be environmental detectives by looking for things that make us feel happy and those that make us feel sad.
