Case Study

Defib Project

The Elected Members all agreed that they would like to continue to support the Defib project out of this year's funding. After the successful instillation of a Defib on Greenland's Park they felt that these units are a massive asset to the community for the wellbeing of the residents and wanted to look at adding more around the ward.

Anston Park Infant School had already started a fundraiser for a Defib due to a teacher went into cardiac arrest on the school site. As there wasn't a Defib sadly the teacher passed away and this speared a number of the children to fundraise for their own Defib.

With the support of the Head Teacher, Start a Heart Foundation and the Elected Members, funds were raised to supply and fit an external Defib so that the whole community could use it if an emergency arises.

The unit hasn't been fitted just yet as we are at the last hurdle of picking a location and attaching an electric supply. It is hopeful that this will be completed before the children who raised the initial funds leave in July 2019.
