Case Studies

St Ann's subway murals

RE Cllrs allocated funding to a community arts project aimed at brightening up the subways at St Ann's Road. This work was informed by members of the community who talked to the artist about the heritage of Eastwood to determine what would finally appear.

Work on site began with a clean up of the area before paint was applied to provide a clear background for the murals. It was great that so many people stopped to ask questions and also helped with painting. The end result is a bright subway environment that captures elements of the town's history and which has got people thinking of other ways to enhance this marvellous space.

Bulb planting brightens up Eastwood Village

The ward councillors purchased 500 mixed Spring bulbs for the grass verges at the St Ann's Road end of Selborne and Russell streets. These were planted in November with help from local group Rotherham in Root and Clifton Learning Partnership.

Councillor Cooksey lent a hand planting the bulbs to add to those planted in the same area last year and which provided a lovely splash of colour last Spring. Future years should be even more spectacular with snowdrops and aconites among the flowers planted.

The feedback from residents has been very good and there's a real hope that more of this activity will take place.
