

Executive Summary

Wessex Archaeology was commissioned by the Environment and Development Services team at Rotherham Metropolitan Borough Council to carry out an archaeological scoping study of 145 sites that are being considered for inclusion in Rotherham Metropolitan Borough Council's Local Development Framework (LDF).

Heritage assets and historic landscapes within and around each site have been identified to allow an assessment to be made of the archaeological potential of each site and the likely implications for future development. Where archaeological potential carried within a site it has been subdivided, resulting in a new total of 157 sites.

The results of the assessments are tabulated in **Section 7** of this document and presented as individual site reports and maps in **Section 8**. The assessment identified:

Major archaeological objections to development	3 (2%) sites with major archaeological objections to development. These are not suitable for inclusion in the LDF and are shown as RED on the maps.
Potential archaeological objections to development	17 (11%) sites with potential objections to development. These sites are suitable for inclusion in the LDF but there is a high risk that they contain heritage assets that will affect any future development proposals. These sites are shown as YELLOW on the maps.
Uncertain archaeological objections to development	72 (46%) sites with uncertain objections to development. These sites are suitable for inclusion in the LDF but there is an unknown level of risk as they could contain heritage assets that pose a risk to development. These sites are shown as YELLOW/GREEN STRIPES on the maps.
Little or no archaeological objections to development	65 (41%) sites with little or no objections to development. These sites are suitable for inclusion in the LDF as there is a low risk that they contain heritage assets that pose a risk to development. These sites are shown as GREEN on the maps.

These four categories are discussed in detail in **Section 5**, with summaries of the likely planning requirements for dealing with archaeological concerns and, of the potential risks to development if significant archaeological remains are present.

1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Project Summary

- 1.1.1 The project comprises a review of existing archaeological and historic environment character data for each of 145 sites that are proposed for inclusion in Rotherham Metropolitan Borough Council's Local Development Framework (hereafter 'Rotherham MBC' and 'LDF').
- 1.1.2 Heritage assets and historic landscapes, within and around each site have been considered to provide an evidence base for the assessment of the archaeological potential of each preferred site. Recommendations are made regarding the suitability of each preferred development site in terms of heritage constraints.

1.2 Project Background

- 1.2.1 Rotherham MBC has identified 145 preferred sites for new development to meet Core Strategy targets for new housing and employment land in Rotherham District over the plan period to 2027. These include the identification (within the Core Strategy Final Draft) of 'broad locations' for significant medium to large scale new development mainly comprising of urban extensions into Green Belt. They include preferred sites for new housing and employment sites that will be detailed in the forthcoming Sites and Policies Document.
- 1.2.2 The preferred sites for future development cover an area of roughly 931 hectares (441 hectares are within the Greenbelt; 490 hectares are non-Greenbelt). An assessment of the suitability of these sites for future development, in relation to their archaeological potential, is now required.

1.3 Planning Policy

Planning Policy Statement 5: Planning for the Historic Environment

- 1.3.1 Planning Policy Statement 5 (PPS5) Planning for the Historic Environment was published by the Department for Communities and Local Government (DCLG) in March 2010, and sets out the Government's national planning policies on the conservation of the historic environment.
- 1.3.2 The policies in the PPS are a material consideration for development management decisions. To summarise, government guidance provides a framework that:



- recognises that heritage assets are a non-renewable resource;
- requires applicants to provide proportionate information on heritage assets affected by the proposals and an assessment of the impact of the proposed development on the significance of the heritage asset;
- has a presumption in favour of the conservation of designated heritage assets (which include World Heritage Sites, Scheduled monuments, Listed Building, Protected Wreck Sites, Registered parks and Gardens, Registered Battlefields or Conservation Areas) and nondesignated heritage assets demonstrably of equivalent significance;
- protects the setting of such designated heritage assets;
- takes into account the desirability of sustaining and enhancing the significance of heritage assets; and
- ensures the historic environment is integrated into planning policies, promoting place-shaping;
- provides for the recording of assets and for publication of the resulting evidence where the loss of whole or part of a heritage asset's significance is justified.
- 1.3.3 Policy HE2 of PPS5 states that local planning authorities should ensure that they have evidence about the historic environment and heritage assets in their area at a level of detail that is proportionate and sufficient to adequately inform the plan-making process. Local planning authorities should use this evidence to assess the type, numbers, distribution, significance and condition of heritage assets and the contribution that they make to their environment (now and in the future). The evidence should also be used to predict the likelihood that currently unidentified heritage assets, particularly sites of archaeological interest, will be discovered in the future.

Draft National Planning Policy Framework

- 1.3.4 A draft National Planning Policy Framework was issued by the Department for Communities and Local Government (DCLG) in July 2011. This framework is intended to replace the current separate planning policies, including PPS5, with a single document. The policies in the draft Framework apply to the preparation of local and neighbourhood plans and to development management decisions. The historic environment policies (sections 176–191) promote the same aims outlined in 1.3.3 above and include the following objectives:
 - to conserve heritage assets in a manner appropriate to their significance
 - to contribute to our knowledge and understanding of our past by capturing evidence from the historic environment and making this publicly available, particularly where a heritage asset is to be lost.
- 1.3.5 Specifically, policy section 181 states that local planning authorities should identify and assess the significance of heritage assets that may be affected by a proposal (including affects on the setting of a heritage asset) and take account of the significance when considering the impact of a proposal on a heritage asset. Conflicts between the heritage asset's conservation and any aspect of the proposal should be avoided or minimised.



2 AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

2.1 Aims

2.1.1 The overall aim of the project was to collect and collate information on the 145 preferred LDF sites, in order to allow an assessment to be made of the archaeological potential of each preferred area and make recommendations as to their suitability for development in terms of heritage constraints. The specific aims were:

Aim 1	To collate existing digital data in order to provide an evidence base for assessment.
Aim 2	To compile a geodatabase to identify heritage assets within each preferred site and its study area.
Aim 3	To identify the significance of heritage assets and historic landscapes within each preferred site and its study area.
Aim 4	To assess the archaeological potential of each preferred site and its study area.
Aim 5	To make recommendations as to the suitability of each preferred area for development in terms of heritage constraints.
Aim 6	To prepare a report identifying, for each preferred area, heritage assets and their significance; archaeological potential; and suitability for development.

2.2 Objectives

2.2.1 The objectives of the project were:

Objective 1	To contribute to the evidence base of Rotherham MBC's LDF to meet national and regional planning policy requirements to ensure that its preparation is based upon an understanding of the local archaeological resource.
Objective 2	To establish the known or expected archaeological potential of the sites identified as 'preferred' for future development by Rotherham MBC.
Objective 3	To provide information that can inform subsequent decisions on whether to include all or only some of these 'preferred' development sites within the LDF Sites and Policies Document.



3 METHODS

3.1 Introduction

3.1.1 A Project Design was prepared by Wessex Archaeology in accordance with the guidance set out in Management of Research Projects in the Historic Environment ('MoRPHE', English Heritage 2006). The Project Design (Wessex Archaeology 2010) was approved by Rotherham MBC and the South Yorkshire Archaeology Service prior to the commencement of the study.

3.2 Data Sources

- 3.2.1 The following sources were consulted:
 - Digital Ordnance Survey base map data and the boundaries of the preferred sites were provided by Rotherham MBC;
 - Digital Historic Environment Characterisation data, Sites and Monuments Record data and aerial photographic cropmark data were provided by the South Yorkshire Archaeology Service;
 - Non-digital data sources (documents, plans etc) held by the South Yorkshire Archaeology Service;
 - GIS-based data relating to all listed buildings in England, held by Wessex Archaeology;
 - The National Heritage List for England;
 - Historic and modern Ordnance Survey maps, and
 - Online sources for aerial photograph and satellite imagery.

3.3 Data Handling and Analysis

- 3.3.1 An ArcGIS geodatabase was constructed to support the spatial analysis of the preferred development sites in relation to known heritage assets, modern and historic mapping and aerial photographs. Spatial queries were used to select the heritage assets potentially affected (both directly and indirectly) by the proposed development sites and the resulting lists were used to populate the heritage asset records.
- 3.3.2 Rotherham MBC's existing site reference codes were preserved for this study and the following information was recorded for each proposed development site:
 - A summary of the information consulted.
 - Heritage assets that may be directly affected by the development of the site.
 - Heritage assets and historic landscapes within 250m of the site boundary or that otherwise may be affected by development through effects on their setting.
 - An assessment of the archaeological potential of the proposed site.
 - A recommendation for each preferred site on the suitability of all or part of the site for development.
- 3.3.3 A Microsoft Access interface to the system provided a summary view of the data on a site by site basis. The presence and significance of known or potential archaeological heritage assets was considered and assessed and



a summary of this information was entered as plain text into the database form.

- 3.3.4 Where areas of significantly differing archaeological potential were identified within a development site, the site was split into sub-areas for separate assessment. These areas are uniquely identifiable but remain referenced to the original proposed development site.
- 3.3.5 These data were extracted from the geodatabase as the individual site reports that form **Section 7** section of this report.

3.4 The Assessment Process

3.4.1 The significance of identified and potential heritage assets was assigned using professional judgement taking into account the nature of the heritage interest; the extent of the fabric (or site) that holds that interest; and the level of importance of that interest with reference to the heritage values set out in English Heritage's Conservation Principles (2008).

3.5 Consultation with the South Yorkshire Archaeology Service

3.5.1 Completed site assessments were submitted to the South Yorkshire Archaeology Service for approval prior to the compilation of this report. Where concerns or comments were raised the assessments have been amended to take account of the additional information provided by the South Yorkshire Archaeology Service.

3.6 Assumptions and Limitations

- 3.6.1 The data used to compile this report consists of secondary information derived from a variety of sources, only some of which have been directly examined for the purposes of this Study. The assumption is made that this data, as well as that derived from other secondary sources, is reasonably accurate.
- 3.6.2 The records held by South Yorkshire Sites and Monuments Record are not a record of all surviving elements of the cultural heritage resource, but a record of the discovery of a wide range of heritage assets. The information held within it is not complete and does not preclude the subsequent discovery of further elements of the historic environment that are, at present, unknown.



4 PRESENTATION OF RESULTS

4.1 Summary

- 4.1.1 The results of the assessments are tabulated in **Section 7** and presented as individual site reports in **Section 8**. Location maps of the preferred sites grouped into development areas are included in **Section 9**.
- 4.1.2 Each site report includes location information, map, site assessment and a summary list of identified heritage assets. The first page of each site report includes a map of the proposed LDF site that is colour-coded to provide a visual indicator of the likely archaeological implications of development, with red indicating significant archaeological constraints, through yellow and yellow/green stripes, to green indicating little or no archaeological constraints.
- 4.1.3 Each report also includes a site assessment with statements of archaeological significance and recommendations (see **4.2** and **4.3** below). This is followed by a summary of known heritage assets and historic landscapes within the site and the 250m study area and includes English Heritage designations where relevant. Each report concludes with:
 - a) an assessment of the possibility of encountering heritage assets within the site and the likely significance of each type of asset, and
 - b) a summary of the predicted survival of heritage assets at the site.

4.2 Definitions: Archaeological Significance

- 4.2.1 Each site has been allocated a significance level of International, National, Regional, high Local, medium Local, low Local, Negligible or Unknown depending upon the factors described in the table below.
- 4.2.2 Significance has been assessed taking into account current understanding of the heritage assets. In most cases this does not include any detailed desk-based research or field investigation and therefore the allotted significance should be considered as provisional pending further information. Sites may contain heritage assets of varying levels of significance, in which case the highest level of significance has been applied to the whole site or recorded as 'unknown', depending upon the nature of the heritage assets that are present or anticipated.

4.3 Definitions: Recommendations

4.3.1 The suitability of each site for development has been assessed based on heritage constraints, leading to one of the following four recommendations:

Major archaeological objections to development	The site contains, or is close to, <i>known</i> archaeological remains of national or regional significance and there has been little or no previous development or disturbance on the site and archaeological survival is predicted to be moderate or good.
Potential archaeological objections to development	The site contains, or is close to, <i>known</i> archaeological remains of regional or local significance and there has been little or no previous development or disturbance on the site and archaeological survival is predicted to be moderate or good.
Uncertain archaeological objections to development	The site contains, or is close to, known or predicted archaeological remains of regional, local or unknown significance or there has been little or no previous development or disturbance on the site and archaeological survival is predicted to be moderate or good.
Little or no archaeological objections to development	The site contains no known or predicted archaeological remains or there has been significant previous development or disturbance on the site and archaeological survival is predicted to be poor.

4.3.2 The implications of these recommendations for the LDF are discussed in **Section 5** below.

5 RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

5.1 Summary

- 5.1.1 The results of the study are tabulated in **Section 7** and presented as individual site reports in **Section 8**. Maps showing site locations grouped into development areas are included in **Section 9**.
- 5.1.2 Where warranted the preferred LDF sites were subdivided to allow for more than one recommendation per site, resulting in a new total of 157 sites.
- 5.1.3 The assessment identified:

Major archaeological objections to development	3 (2%) sites with major archaeological objections to development. These are not suitable for inclusion in the LDF and are shown as RED on the maps.
Potential archaeological objections to development	17 (11%) sites with potential objections to development. These sites are suitable for inclusion in the LDF but there is a high risk that they contain heritage assets that will affect any future development proposals. These sites are shown as YELLOW on the maps.
Uncertain archaeological objections to development	72 (46%) sites with uncertain objections to development. These sites are suitable for inclusion in the LDF but there is an unknown level of risk as they could contain heritage assets that pose a risk to development. These sites are shown as YELLOW/GREEN STRIPES on the maps.
Little or no archaeological objections to development	65 (41%) sites with little or no objections to development. These sites are suitable for inclusion in the LDF as there is a low risk that they contain heritage assets that pose a risk to development. These sites are shown as GREEN on the maps.



5.2 Sites with Major Archaeological Objections to Development

The site contains, or is close to, known archaeological remains of national or regional significance <u>and</u> there has been little or no previous development or disturbance on the site and archaeological survival is predicted to be moderate or good.

Sites

5.2.1 The following three sites are in this category: 0078, 0139 and 0776B.

Recommendation

5.2.2 It is recommended that these sites are not included in the LDF as this would result in a conflict with historic environment planning policy.

Planning Requirements

- 5.2.3 In the event that, following further consideration, these sites are proposed for development, further archaeological investigation will be required, *prior to the submission of a planning application*, to establish the presence/absence, significance and condition of heritage assets at the site. The planning application should be supported by a Heritage Statement that includes an assessment of the impact of the specific development proposals based on the results of a staged evaluation which is likely to involve one or more of the following:
 - Detailed desk-based assessment
 - Geophysical survey
 - Fieldwalking
 - Trial trenches

Archaeological Risks

- 5.2.4 If significant archaeological remains are present there is potential for:
 - A recommendation for refusal of the application on heritage grounds
 - A requirement for the re-design of the proposals
 - A requirement for mitigation works, such as detailed excavation

5.3 Sites with Potential Archaeological Objections to Development

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The site contains, or is close to, known archaeological remains of national or regional significance <u>and</u> there has been little or no previous development or disturbance on the site and archaeological survival is predicted to be moderate or good.



Sites

5.3.1 The following seventeen sites are in this category: 0060, 0070, 0102, 0170, 0176, 0181, 0211, 0215, 0216, 0218, 0220, 0292A, 0470A, 0747A, 0747B, 0765C and 0776A.

Recommendation

5.3.2 These sites are considered to be suitable for inclusion in the LDF but developers should be aware that further archaeological information will be required and there are risks associated with any proposed development.

Planning Requirements

- 5.3.3 These sites will require further archaeological investigation, *prior to the submission of a planning application*, to establish the presence/absence, significance and condition of heritage assets at the site, and to allow the final scheme to be designed accordingly, i.e. having taken archaeological constraints into consideration. The planning application should be supported by a Heritage Statement that includes an assessment of the impact of the specific development proposals based on the results of a staged evaluation which is likely to involve one or more of the following:
 - Detailed desk-based assessment
 - Geophysical survey
 - Fieldwalking
 - Trial trenches

Archaeological Risks

- 5.3.4 If significant archaeological remains are present there is potential for:
 - A recommendation for refusal of the application on heritage grounds
 - A requirement for the re-design of the proposals
 - A requirement for mitigation works, such as detailed excavation

5.4 Sites with Uncertain Archaeological Objections to Development

The site contains, or is close to, known or predicted archaeological remains of regional, local or unknown significance <u>or</u> there has been little or no previous development or disturbance on the site and archaeological survival is predicted to be moderate or good.

Sites

Recommendation

5.4.2 These sites are considered suitable for inclusion in the LDF but developers should be aware that further archaeological information will be required and there may be risks associated with development.

Planning Requirements

- 5.4.3 These sites will require further archaeological investigation to establish the presence/absence, significance and condition of heritage assets at the site. A staged evaluation should be initiated *prior to the submission of a planning application* and the application should be supported by a Heritage Statement that includes an assessment of the impact of the specific development proposals based on the results of a staged evaluation. Further stages of evaluation may be required as a *condition of planning consent*. Developers should consult the South Yorkshire Archaeology Service for site-specific advice. Evaluation is likely to involve one or more of the following stages:
 - Detailed desk-based assessment
 - Geophysical survey
 - Fieldwalking
 - Trial trenches

Archaeological Risks

- 5.4.4 If significant archaeological remains are present there is potential for:
 - A recommendation for refusal of the application on heritage grounds
 - A requirement for the re-design of the proposals
 - A requirement for mitigation works, such as detailed excavation

5.5 Sites with Little or No Archaeological Objections to Development

The site contains no known or predicted archaeological remains <u>or</u> there has been significant previous development or disturbance on the site and archaeological survival is predicted to be poor.

Sites

Recommendation

5.5.2 These sites are considered suitable for inclusion in the LDF with no significant risks.



Planning Requirements

5.5.3 Planning applications to develop these sites should include a copy of the relevant scoping study from this report and the South Yorkshire Archaeology Service should be consulted to establish whether any further archaeological investigation will be required as a condition of planning consent.

Archaeological Risks

5.5.4 No archaeological work will be required prior to the submission of an application and any planning condition requirements are likely to be limited.


Figure 1	Key to Figures 2.1 – 2.15



The SMR records 9 monuments within 250m of the site. To the north of the site the SMR records a possible Romano-British period building and mould for a figure of the Roman goddess Diana; a destroyed Victorian Drain; and the now largely demolished 1840 Rotherham Union Workhouse. To the northeast of the site is the recorded location of a Roman coin hoard. East of the site there is Boston Park and Moorgate Cemetery, both Grade II Registered Parks and Gardens, and the Grade II Listed Building of Boston Castle. To the south of the site a sherd of post-medieval pottery is recorded

Within 500m of the site are: the Roman Road from Brough to Doncaster to the northwest, and the Scheduled remains of an Iron Age/Romano-British period enclosure of Canklow Wood to the south (SAM SY 382). Topographic surveys of Canklow Woods in 1988, 1992 and by the Fuelling the Revolution project in 2004 recorded Iron Age/Roman banked enclosures, banks and terraces within the scheduled area, along with a brickfield pattern field system of a similar date, and a post-medieval banked trackway.

This site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the site.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Planned Estate (Social Housing) 1938-2003 with a fragmentary historic character of Allotments 1900-1937, Piecemeal Enclosure 1540-1899, and Open Fields 1066-1539. The site is assigned to the Municipal Suburbs character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicate the site has had considerable changes during the modern period. In the 1850s the site lay in enclosed land. By the 1920s there was piecemeal development on Canklow Road to the west, and areas of allotments had been established within the site. The site was developed as a housing estate in the 1940s.

Post 1990 APs show the area of the site to the east of Rother View Road to have been cleared of houses between 2002 and 2008 and regenerated as grassland.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Due to the proximity of the site to known heritage assets, there is a medium possibility for disturbing remains from the Romano-British period that could be of up to regional significance. There is also a low possibility for disturbing remains of post-medieval agriculture of negligible significance, and a high possibility for disturbing modern remains of no significance corresponding to the former 1940s housing on the site.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets at this site is considered to be poor due to extensive disturbances created by the construction and subsequent demolition of 20th century semi-detached housing.

Note

Despite the proximity of nationally and regionally significant remains, the significance of the potential heritage assets on this site is interpreted as high local rather than regional due to their predicted poor survival.

The SMR records the discovery of a prehistoric flint knife within the study area to the north of the site, and the projected route of the former Roman road from Templeborough to Chesterfield approximately 260m to the south of the site. The SMR records 5 monuments within the study area around the site. To the west of the site is the rough location of George Taylor's Pottery Works that was founded in 1826. The SMR records 8 monuments within the study area around the site. To the north is the site of the early 18th century Low Pottery. To the northeast is the location of several medieval pottery kilns, and to the northwest is the presumed location of George Taylor's 1826 Pottery Works. To the west of the site medieval pottery and kiln wasters have been found. Just to the south is the site of the 1790 Top Pottery that was converted to a house and blacksmith shop in 1858 and later demolished. Further south is the Grade II Listed St Mary's Church built 1752 with a 12th century graveyard cross in the porch, and Grade II Listed railings to the north. Opposite the church is the Grade II* Listed rectory.

This site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the site.

The HEC records the site as largely lying within a present character area of Shopping Centre 1967-2005, with an invisible historic character of Burgage Plots 1066-1966. The site is assigned to the Nucleated Rural Settlements character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicate the site has changed considerably in the modern period. In 1854 the site contained burgage plots with houses facing onto High Street to the west and Stock's Lane to the north. The centre of the site was largely undeveloped gardens. By the 1930s several of the buildings fronting the burgage plots had been rebuilt and a picture house ('the Regal') had been built in the southwest corner of the site. The site was cleared in the 1960s (apart from the cinema) and a large shopping centre was built.

Post 1990 APs show a shopping centre occupying the centre of the site, a row of small buildings backing High Street. The former Regal cinema still stands in the southeast corner of the site and shows signs of significant modern alterations.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

There is a medium possibility for disturbing medieval to post-medieval remains of regional significance relating to the rear gardens of burgage plots where middens and small-scale industries, including pottery kilns, could be located. There is also an unknown possibility of historic fabric surviving in the former Regal cinema.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets at this site is considered to be moderate due to disturbances created by the construction of the present shopping centre. Survival is likely to rise to good in car park areas in the southeast of the site.

Note

Despite the possibility of regionally significant remains, the significance of the potential heritage assets on this site is considered to be unknown due to modern development on the site.





In the 1950s Westfield Nurseries was built on the southeast edge of the site and by the 1960s a road crossed the west of the site with a few dwellings.

Post 1990 APs show the site largely as overgrown allotments.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Although there are no known prehistoric, Romano-British or early medieval remains within the study area, such remains are known to be difficult to predict or exclude. This is particularly true of locations with little or no previous ground disturbance. Thus the possibility of disturbing remains dating from the prehistoric, Romano-British and early medieval periods is recorded as uncertain, and the significance is recorded as unknown. There is also a medium possibility for disturbing remains of post-medieval agriculture of negligible significance, and a high possibility for modern remains of negligible significance relating to allotments and Westfield Nurseries.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets at this site is considered to be good with modern disturbances largely limited to the southern and western edge of the site..





The SMR records 3 monuments within the study area comprising the projected route of the Roman road from Brough to Doncaster to the north of the site, and findspots for two coins to the southeast (one undated coin and one Roman coin dated between AD 337-346). To the north of the site is the River Don Navigation, part of which was recorded archaeologically in 1994. There are no statutorily designated heritage assets within the site or study area.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicate the site remained undeveloped until the 1920s when terraced housing was built along Saville Street within the site to the northwest and the rest of the site was used as allotment gardens. In the late 1940s a miners' hostel was built to the northwest with a few structures located within the site. This was redeveloped as low rise flats in the 1980s and the part lying within the site became a compound and single industrial/commercial unit.

Post 1990 APs show the demolition of the terraces on Saville Street in the early 2000s. Part of the site remained in use as allotments.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Although there are no known prehistoric or early medieval remains within the study area, such remains are known to be difficult to predict or exclude. This is particularly true of locations with little or no previous ground disturbance. Thus the possibility of disturbing remains dating from the prehistoric and early medieval periods is recorded as uncertain, and the significance is recorded as unknown. Due to the proximity of the site to the predicted route of a Roman road, there is a low possibility for disturbing remains from the same period that could be of up to regional significance. There a high possibility for modern remains of negligible significance relating to the allotments and miners' hostel.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets at this site is considered to be good, with areas of disturbance limited to the north and northwest of the site.





The SMR records 5 monuments within the study area comprising three coin findspots including two Roman coins and one coin of unknown date, and a medieval timber-framed building at Dalton Parva. A farmhouse on Dalton Lane to the south the site is a Grade II Listed Building, dating to the late 18th century.

The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project recorded post-medieval ridge and furrow within the east of the site with more recorded in the study area to the southeast. A curvilinear bank, believed to be of medieval origin, is also recorded as entering the site from the southeast, with two parallel lynchets in the study area beyond. In addition, an Iron Age or Romano-British enclosure was recorded within 500m to the east of the site.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Agglomerated Fields 1958-2003 on the northern edge of the possible shrunken medieval village of Dalton Parva. There is a partially legible historic character of Strip Fields 1540-1957 and Open Fields 1066-1539. The site is assigned to the Agglomerated Enclosure character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps show the site in the 19th century to lie within fields to the north of the village of Dalton Parva with little change during the modern period. There has been minor loss of pre-1854 field boundaries within the site.

Post 1990 APs show the site as lying within an area of pasture to the south and arable land to the north and east.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Although there are no known prehistoric, Romano-British or early medieval remains within the study area, such remains are known to be difficult to predict or exclude. This is particularly true of locations with little or no previous ground disturbance. Thus the possibility of disturbing remains dating from the prehistoric, Romano-British and early medieval periods is recorded as uncertain, and the significance is recorded as unknown. Possible medieval earthworks have been identified within and at the edge of the site and Dalton Parva has been identified as a possible shrunken medieval village, there is consequently a high possibility for disturbing remains of the medieval village that could be up to regional significance. There is also a high possibility for disturbing remains of post-medieval ridge and furrow and pre-1854 boundaries of negligible significance.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets at this site is considered to be good due to the lack of modern disturbance.

Note

The medieval village may have shrunk in the post-medieval period, meaning that medieval remains may lie outside the current settlement and could be well-preserved.





Comparision of historic OS maps shows the site in the 1850s as enclosed land with a number of coal shafts situtated within 150m to the south. The site was developed in the mid 20th century as part of a recreation ground with a cricket ground, bowling greens, tennis court and football ground; a pavilion and club house lie with the site. The playing fields were developed as a private housing estate in the 1980s, whilst the site remained separate and the club house was redeveloped as a public house.

Post 1990s APs show the site as a carpark with an area of grass to the southeast and buildings to the northwest. The buildings are evidently of three or more phases, but it is uncertain whether any of the earlier club house survives.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

There is a low possibility for disturbing remains of post-medieval agriculture of negligible significance. There is also an unknown possibility of any mid 20th century fabric within the standing structures.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets at this site is considered to be moderate due to the modern disturbances associated with the construction of the current structures and carpark. The building may contain elements of an earlier structure within a largely modern building.



There are no statutorily designated heritage assets or undesignated heritage assets within the site or study area. This site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the site.

The HEC records the site as lying largely within the present character area of Other Industry 1967-2005 with a fragmentary historic character of Terraced Housing 1891-1966, Strip Fields 1540-1890 and Open Fields 1066-1539. The site is assigned to the Post Industrial character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicate that the site has changed substantially during the modern period. In 1854 the site contained only Granby House and gardens situated within the eastern end of the site. By the 1890s Christ Church and a school had been built in the west of the site, fronting onto Aldwarke Road, and a further building named Bryn-y-mor House had been built on a narrow plot in the east of the site. By the 1900s Sarum House had been built on the western edge of the site, and by the 1920s Craven Street had been formed through the centre of the site with a row of terraces to the north. By the 1930s Sarum House had been extended and was labelled a Working Man's Club. In the 1950s the school was a works building, Granby House included a large extention to the west of the main building, and a number of possibly light industrial buildings or garages had been built to the north of the church. In the 1970s Christ Chruch and the former school were pulled down, and light industrial developmed grew up in their place. Bryn-y-mor House was also demolished and a new building was constructed associated with Granby House.

Post 1990 APs show the Sarum House and Granby House structure still in use and the centre of the site cleared of terraces and historic structures and developed with light industrial units.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

There is a high potential for disturbing remains relating to the former 19th century church and school of medium local significance, and terrace housing and town houses of negligible significance. Granby House dates to the early 19th century and there is a medium potential for disturbing remains of its former gardens and out-buildings of medium local significance. The former Sarum House dates to the late 19th century and is of low local significance.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets within the site is considered to be poor due to the extent of construction and demolition of structures across the site. It is, however, likely that the foundations of the church and school will survive to a greater degree. Two 19th century standing buildings survive within the site with at least moderate additions/alterations evident.





There is also a fragmentary historic characters of Racecourse 1891-1933, Surveyed Enclosure 1764-1890 and Moorland 0-1763. Consequently the site is assigned to both the Early to Mid 20th Century Private Suburbs and Municiple Suburbs character zones.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicate the site was initially developed in the 1890s as part of a racecourse, with the track running northwest-southeast through the site and paddocks to the south. By the 1920s the track had been removed and housing developed along Broom Road in the study area to the southwest of the site, and partly within the southern spur of the site. By the early 1930s a pavilion occupied the centre of the site, serving the playing fields to the northeast, with a smaller structure to its west. In the 1980s additional structures were built to the west and south of the pavilion, including a large glasshouse. This was replaced in the 1990s by a long steel framed structure that served as a nursery for the council's park service.

Post-1990 APs show the site as having been cleared of standing structures with some areas of hardstanding still evident.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

There is a high possibility for disturbing the remains of modern nursery and pavilion buildings of low local significance.

Surviva

The likely survival of heritage assets on this site is considered to be poor due to the density and level of disturbance from a sequence of development and clearance on the site. It is, however, likely that there will be a good level of survival for the most recent structures.



The SMR records two findspots within the study area; a prehistoric flint knife to the northwest and a Roman coin of 43 AD to the west. The SMR records one monument within the study area to the north of the site comprising Westfield Pumping Station, a Grade II Listed building built in 1823 to house a Newcomen Engine. This site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the site.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Allotments 1930-2005, with a fragmentary historic character of Strip Fields 1540-1929 and Open Fields 1066-1539. The site is assigned to the Municipal Suburbs character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps show the site in 1854 as lying between Westfield Road and the former Low Stubbin Incline railway. A shaft was indicated within the study area to the west of the site, with the land to the east comprising gardens and a dwelling. The land east of the site was developed with terraces by 1890, whilst the land west of the site became allotments by the 1920s. By the 1950s the land within the site, lying between the road and the railway, had also become allotments, and several small structures were shown fronting Westfield Road. The railway was dismantled in the 1980s.

Post-1990s APs show the site as scrubland with several small sheds fronting Westfield Road.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

There is a low possibility for disturbing remains of post-medieval field boundaries of negligible significance, and a high potential for disturbing remains relating to a 19th century mineral railway of low local significance.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets within the site is considered to be poor due to repeated disturbances associated with groundworks during the construction and dismantlement of the railway, works to Westfield Road, and in making the site suitable for allotments in the 1940s. Whilst the railway has been dismantled a shallow cutting remains in the southern end of the site where a tunnel goes beneath Greasbrough Road.





The SMR records one monument within the study area to the north of the site comprising the remains of a moated site, likely medieval in date but proposed by J Hunter in 1831 to have been Romano-British. There are no statutorily designated heritage assets within the site or study area.

The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project records the moat in the north of the study area, and 20th century spoilheaps/ponds within the site and in the study area to the east and north.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Regenerated Scrubland 1931-2004, with fragmentary historic character of Deep Shaft Coal Mine 1891-2004 and Valley Floor Meadows 1066-1890. The site is assigned to the Post Industrial character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicate the site was substantially developed during the modern period. In 1854 the site lay largely in enclosed fields with the North Midlands Railway along its western edge. A parish boundary crosses the southern end of the site. By 1890 the Sheffield and Mexbrough Branch of the MS & LR railway had been formed along the eastern edge of the site, and Roundwood Colliery built within the southwest end of the site with sidings and ancillary buildings extending north to a spoilheap. In the 1920s the colliery shrunk in size, and by 1960 it is no longer named and only a few buildings shown. By the 1980s the spoil heaps within the site appear to have been removed.

Post-1990 APs show the site as scrubland between 1999 and 2007, with the spoil heaps sorted for coal in 2008.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

There is a medium potential for disturbing modern remains of medium local significance relating to the spoils heaps and buildings of Roundwood Colliery.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets within the site is considered to be poor due to extensive groundworks during the operation of the colliery, its subsequent demolition, and more recently during the sorting of the spoilheaps.







The SMR records one monument within the site and five within the study area. Located along the western edge of the site is a section of the Scheduled Ancient Monument of the Roman Ridge (No. 1004807), a linear ditch and bank earthwork thought to date to either the Iron Age/Romano-British Period or the Anglo-Saxon period. In the study area to the east of the site is a findspot for a Roman coin; to the north is the site of a former medieval barn and the findspot of a Bronze Age flint knife; and to the southwest is the findspot for a Mesolithic arrow head.

In 1992-3 archaeological investigations were undertaken prior to the excavation of a gas pipeline through the site and monument. A watching brief was also undertaken during the development and identified no features within the easement where it crossed the site.

This site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the site.

The HEC records the site as split between the present character areas of Reclaimed Coal Mine 1967-2003 and Planned Estate (Social Housing) 1948-2993. The site has an invisible historic character of Deep Shaft Coal Mine 1873-1966 and Piecemeal Enclosure 1066-1872 to the south and Stripfields 1797-1947 and Open Fields 1066-1796 to the north. The site is assigned to both the Post Industrial and Municipal Suburbs character zones.

Comparison of present and historic OS maps indicate that the site has seen minimal disturbance during the modern period. In 1854 the site lay in fields to the north of Jordan Colliery. By the 1950s a housing estate had been developed in the study area to the north of the site whilst the site itself remained undeveloped.

Post 1990 APs show the site as pasture with the Roman Ridge visible as an earthwork along the western edge of the site. In the eastern end of the site is a small paddock area.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

The Scheduled Monument of the Roman Ridge bounds the west of the site, and there is a high possibility of development to disturb remains of national significance that relate to it as well as having an impact on the setting of the monument. There is also an uncertain possibility for disturbing additional remains from the prehistoric, Romano-British and early medieval period- of unknown significance, with known heritage assets of these periods situated within the study area. In addition there is a high possibility for disturbing remains of post-medieval agriculture and pre-1854 field boundaries of negligible significance.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets within the site is considered to be good due to the lack of modern disturbances, beyond the limited excavations associated with gas pipeline.

The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project records post-medieval ridge and furrow within the site.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Agglomerated fields 1982-2005, with an area of Woodland: Plantation 1768-2005 in the southwest. There is also a partially legible historic character comprising of both Surveyed Enclosure 1797-1981 and Open Fields 1066-1766. The site is allocated to the Surveyed Enclosure character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates considerable loss of field boundaries and the removal of White Quarry Plantation since 1854. Windmill Plantation survives unaltered in the southwest of the site. Maps from 1900s illustrate a small quarry to the south of White Quarry Plantation, whilst Windmill Plantation likely refers to Anston Windmill (labelled as disused in the 1900s) to the southwest of the site. In addition, the centre of the site is crossed by the boundary between the parishes of Dinnington and Anston, a historically important landscape feature.

Post 1990 APs show the area to be pasture.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Due to the proximity of the site to a Neolithic monument/early medieval cemetery and possible Romano-British earthworks there is a medium possibility of disturbing remains from the prehistoric, Romano-British and early medieval periods that could be up to regional/national significance. There is a high possibility for disturbing remains of post-medieval agriculture and pre-1854 field boundaries of negligible significance. There is also a high possibility of disturbing remains of a pre-1854 parish boundary of medium local significance, and post-medieval quarries of medium local significance.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets at this site is considered to be good, although there is likely to be localised areas of ground disturbance created by post-medieval to modern quarrying and woodland planting and clearance..

There are no statutorily designated or undesignated heritage assets within the site or its study area. The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project records an air raid shelter within the site, and further features in the study area including further air raid shelters to the northwest and northeast; post-medieval ridge and furrow earthworks to the northwest; and earthworks associated with Dinnington Colliery in the west.

The HEC records the present character of the site to be largely School 1930-2004 with a lost historic character of Surveyed Enclosure 1774-1929 and Open Fields 1066-1773. The southeast corner of the site falls into a present character area of Terraced Housing 1930-2005. This site is assigned to the Nucleated Rural Settlements character zone.

Examination of historic OS maps indicates substantial changes to the site during the modern period. In 1850s the site contained Doe Quarry in its northeast quarter; an opencast limestone quarry. The quarry was infilled in the 1920s-30 for a playing field when the western half of the site was developed as a junior and infants school and a row of terraces, known as Dinnington Terrace, were constructed along the southwest side of the site. A small mortuary was also constructed in the site towards the centre of the north side facing onto Doe Quarry Lane, which was demolished in the 1960s-70s. Since 2000 the whole of the site has been cleared, although foliage remains along the edge of the former terrace plot.

Post 1990 APs show the site as scrubland.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

There is a medium possibility for disturbing the remains of post-medieval limestone quarries. The potential remains of Doe Quarry are considered to be of high local significance due to its influence in the naming of Doe Quarry Lane and the adjacent Doe Quarry Terraces. There is also a high possibility for disturbing modern remains relating to the school of low local significance.

Survival

The potential survival of pre-19th century heritage assets at this site is considered to be poor due to later disturbance. The survival of remains relating to the quarry is likely to be good due to the lack of development over that area of the site.



There are no statutorily designated or undesignated heritage assets within the site or its study area. The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project records no features within the site or its study area.

The HEC records the ppresent character of the site as split between Sports Ground 1930-2005 to the northwest, and Planned Estate (Social Housing) 1930-2005 to the southeast. The site is also recorded as possessing a fragmentary historic character of Surveyed Enclosure 1774-1929 and Open Fields 1066-1773. The site is assigned to the Nucleated Rural Settlements character zone.

Examination of historic OS maps indicates that the site corresponds with an enclosure mapped in the 1850s with a small limestone quarry towards the centre of the site. By the 1890s the quarry was no longer marked and the site remained undeveloped until the 1920s-30s when there was some minor development fronting Lorden's Hill and the remainder of the site was used as allotment gardens. By 1970s the southeast half of the site had been redeveloped and all but one of the buildings fronting Lorden's Hill had been demolished. The site also contained a small commercial unit with car park.

Post 1990 APs show the northwest half of the site as overgrown allotments. To the southeast the commercial unit has been cleared leaving an area of hardstanding whilst the 1920s-30s and 1970s buildings remain in the south corner of the site.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

There is a high possibility for disturbing remains of a post-medieval limestone quarry of low local significance, and a high possibility for encountering modern remains of no significance relating to the sites use as allotments.







There are no statutorily designated heritage assets or undesignated heritage assets within the site or study area. The HEC records present the character of the site as Agglomerated Fields 1989-2004, with no historic legibility of former characters of Surveyed Enclosure 1820-1988 and Open Fields 1066-1819. The site is assigned to the Surveyed Enclosure character zone.

The 1854 OS map shows the site as a series of enclosed fields with an old sandstone quarry located at the northern end of the site. No development occurs within the site in the late 19th- early 20th centuries but the surrounding areas become occupied by a colliery, sewage works and housing. By the 1940s an access track is located at the southern end of the site, leading from Cortonwood Colliery to West Field Road.

Current and post-1990 APs show the site as an overgrown greenfield area with substantial planting and a small area of hardstanding at the north.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Although there are no known prehistoric, Romano-British or early medieval remains within the study area, such remains are known to be difficult to predict or exclude. This is particularly true of locations with little or no previous ground disturbance. Thus the possibility of disturbing remains dating from the prehistoric, Romano-British and early medieval periods is recorded as uncertain, and the significance is recorded as unknown. There is also a high possibility for disturbing the remains of pre-1854 field boundaries of negligible significance, and a 19th century quarry of low local significance.

The likely survival of heritage assets at this site is considered to be good due to the lack of modern disturbance on site.

There is also a high possibility for disturbing pre-1854 field boundaries and the remains of Grange Lane of negligible significance.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets at this site is considered to be good due to the lack of modern disturbance on site.
