

There is one statutorily designated heritage asset within the site; an 18th century farm complex. There are also 4 other listed buildings within the study area ranging in date from the medieval period to 19th century. There is one undesignated heritage asset within the site, comprising the site of a medieval timber-framed house that was demolished in the 1980s. This site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the site.

The HEC records present character of the site as Farm Complex 1650-200, with no historic legibility of its former character of Crofts 1066-1649. The site is assigned to the Nucleated Rural Settlements character zone.

The 1854 OS map shows the site as within two enclosed fields adjacent to farm buildings, with a path in the western field. The farm complex had been extended by the 1890s with further field boundaries also added.

Current and post-1990 APs show the site as residential housing, farm buildings and enclosed greenfields.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

There is a high possibility for disturbing remains related to a medieval house and additional evidence relating to the medieval village of West Melton that would be considered to be of regional signifiacnce. There is also a high possibility of disturbing remains related to the pre-1854 farm complex which would be of medium local significance.

Survival

The likely survival of medieval heritage assets at this site is considered to be medium due to the presence of disturbance caused by 19th and 20th century construction.

There is one statutorily designated heritage asset within the study area; an 18th century farm complex. There are also 4 other listed buildings within the study area ranging in date from the medieval period to 19th century. There is one undesignated heritage asset within the study area; comprising the site of a medieval timber-framed house that was demolished in the 1980s. This site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the site.

The HEC records present character of the site as Farm Complex 1650-2003, the site itself is a green space to the north of the farm buildings. The site has no historic legibility of its former character of Crofts 1066-1649. The site is assigned to the Nucleated Rural Settlements character zone.

The 1854 OS map shows a series of buildings at the southern end of the site, with a field boundary and track leading from one of the buildings northwards. The site remains a green space throughout the 20th century.

Current and post-1990 APs show the site as enclosed greenfields.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Although there are no known prehistoric, Romano-British or early medieval remains within the study area, such remains are known to be difficult to predict or exclude. This is particularly true of locations with little or no previous ground disturbance. Thus the possibility of disturbing remains dating from the prehistoric, Romano-British and early medieval periods is recorded as uncertain, and the significance is recorded as unknown. There is also a high possibility of disturbing post-medieval remains of negligible significance relating to agricultural practices and pre-1854 boundaries.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets at this site is considered to be good due to the lack of modern disturbance at the site.





There are no statutorily designated heritage assets within the site or study area. There is one undesignated heritage asset within the study area; a record of two possible Iron Age/Romano-British enclosures and a track identified as cropmarks. This site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available on the extent of any cropmark features in the site itself, however Iron Age and Roman remains are recorded by the project within the wider area.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Agglomerated fields 1946-2003 with partial historic legibility of former characters Surveyed Enclosure 1814-1945 and Open Fields 1066-1813. The site is assigned to the Surveyed Enclosure character zone.

The 1854 OS map shows the site as a series of enclosed fields. Although there has been some boundary loss, a number of these boundary still remain. By the 1930s allotment gardens occupied the northwest corner of the site.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

There are cropmarks of possible Iron Age/Romano-British date in the study area but these features have not been confirmed by excavation. The possibility of disturbing remains dating from the prehistoric, Romano-British and early medieval periods is greater than on greenfield sites with no cropmarks, but is still recorded as uncertain, and the significance is recorded as unknown. There is also a high possibility for disturbing pre-1854 field boundaries of negligible significance, including a number of surviving enclosure hedgerows.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets at this site is considered to be good due to the lack of modern disturbance on site.

There are no statutorily designated heritage assets or undesignated heritage assets within the site or study area. This site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available on the extent of any cropmark features in the site, however, the project does record a 20th century colliery to the north and northeast.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Sports Ground 1903-2003, the site itself is a green space north of the existing sports grounds. The site has no historic legibility of its former characters of Surveyed Enclosure 1814-1902 and Commons and Greens 1066-1813.

The 1854 OS map shows the site as a number of enclosed fields with the South Yorkshire Railway running along the site's southern edge. By the 1890s a series of railway tracks, connected to Wath upon Dearne Main Colliery to the north of the site, traverse the site with additional tracks added in the 20th century. These railways were in use until the 1980s.

Current and post-1990 APs show the site as an area of scrubland.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

There is a high possibility of disturbing remains relating to late 19th and 20th century railways of negligible significance.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets relating to the railway is considered to be high.

There are no statutorily designated heritage assets or undesignated heritage assets within the site or study area. The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project records the edge of a clay pit within the site and post-medieval ridge and furrow within the study area; the ridge and furrow has now been destroyed by modern development.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Clay Pits/ Brickworks 1948-2005, the site itself is an area of scrub land to the south of the existing clay pit. The site has no historic legibility of former characters Strip Fields 1540-1947 and Open Fields 1066-1539. The site is assigned to the Post Industrial character zone.

The 1854 OS map shows the site within a strip field with a lane running north to south along the western edge, this lane is no longer in use by the 1930s. A brickworks was established north of the site by the 1930s and its associated clay pit expands throughout the 20th century. From historic maps, it does not appear that the clay pit entended into the site.

Current and post-1990 APs show the site as an area of scrubland.

Known and Potential Heritage Asset

Although there are no known prehistoric, Romano-British or early medieval remains within the study area, such remains are known to be difficult to predict or exclude. This is particularly true of locations with little or no previous ground disturbance. Thus the possibility of disturbing remains dating from the prehistoric, Romano-British and early medieval periods is recorded as uncertain, and the significance is recorded as unknown. There is also a high possibility for disturbing pre-1854 field boundaries of negligible significance.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets at this site is considered to be good due to the lack of modern disturbance on site.







The HEC records the present character of the site as Planned Estate (Social Housing) 1975-2003, the site itself is a green space surrounded by housing. The site has no historic legibility of former characters Surveyed Enclosure 1814-1974 and Open Fields 1066-1813. The site is assigned to the Municipal Suburbs character zone.

The 1854 OS map shows the site within a large enclosed field with a footpath traversing the north end. The surrounding housing estates were constructed from the 1950s to 1980s and the site may have been landscaped during this time. The parish boundary for Wath upon Dearne and Brampton Bierlow is located within the site, and is a historically important landscape feature.

Current and post-1990 APs show the site as a greenfield area.

Potential Heritage Assets

Although there are no known prehistoric, Romano-British or early medieval remains within the study area, such remains are known to be difficult to predict or exclude. This is particularly true of locations with little or no previous ground disturbance. Thus the possibility of disturbing remains dating from the prehistoric, Romano-British and early medieval periods is recorded as uncertain, and the significance is recorded as unknown. There is also a high possibility for disturbing pre-1854 field boundaries of negligible significance and a high possibility for disturbing the pre-1854 parish boundary of medium local significance.

Survival

The potential survival of heritage assets at this site is unknown due to the possible landscaping of the site during the construction of the surrounding housing estate.

There are eight Grade II Listed Buildings dating from the medieval period to 19th century within the study area to the west of the site. The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project records post-medieval ridge and furrow within the Study Area to the east of the site; this has since been destroyed by residential development.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Vernacular Cottages 1851-2005 within the historic core of Wickersley village. This area has significant historic legibility of previous characters comprising Vernacular Cottages 1066-1850. The site is assigned to the Nucleated Rural Settlements character zone.

The 1854 OS map shows the site within two burgage plots to the rear of houses facing on to the main street of the village. Housing had been constructed in the study area to the east of the site by the 1930s, by which time interior property boundaries had been removed.

Current APs show the site as a greenfield area.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Although there are no known prehistoric, Romano-British or early medieval remains within the study area, such remains are known to be difficult to predict or exclude. This is particularly true of locations with little or no previous ground disturbance. Thus the possibility of disturbing remains dating from the prehistoric, Romano-British and early medieval periods is recorded as uncertain, and the significance is recorded as unknown. The site is located just outside of the known developed historic core of Wickersley, on land that could have been associated with Wickersley Hall. Consequently there is also a possibility of disturbing medieval and post-medieval remains of unknown significance. There is also a high possibility of disturbing remains of pre-1854 boundaries of negligible significance.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets at this site is considered to be good due to the lack of modern disturbance on site.







There are no statutorily designated heritage assets within the site or study area. There are two undesignated heritage assets within the study area, comprising a probable post-medieval conduit possibly connecting with infilled quarries to the south of the site, and a 20th century Royal Observer Corps Monitoring Post to the north of the site. The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project records possible Iron Age/Roman cropmark enclosures and field boundaries within the study area to the west of the site, and post-medieval ridge and furrow to the east of the site that has since been destroyed by residential development.

The HEC records present character of the site as Agglomerated Fields 1985-2003 with partially legible historic characters of Strip Fields 1663-1957 and Open Fields 1066-1662. The site is assigned to the Agglomerated Fields character zone.

Comparison of present and historic OS maps show the site in 1854 as encompassing parts of three enclosed fields within an area named Church Fields. Sandstone quarries were situated within the study area to the east and northwest of the site. The 1854 OS map shows buildings associated with Fence Colliery including an engine house, shafts, tram road, access road and field boundaries. 'Air shafts' are detailed on the 1890s map as well as a branch of a railway line. Allotment gardens are noted on maps from 1920. The colliery appears to have become disused by the 1950s. Industrial units were constructed at the site in the 1970s and demolished in the mid-2000s.

Current and post-1990s APs show the site is currently an area of hard standing.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

There is a high possibility for disturbing 19th to 20th century mining remains of medium to high local significance.

Survival

The likely survival of pre 20th century heritage assets at this site is considered to be low due to the likely high level of disturbance caused by the mining activities, demolition of the colliery and construction of the industrial units.

The 1854 historic OS map shows the site as enclosed fields with an access track to Fence Farm. These boundaries no longer survive.



The SMR records the presence of post-medieval bell pits in Smithy Wood that extend into the western side of the study area. Archaeological investigations (topographic and geophysical surveys) in the west of the study area in 1999-2000 identified bell pits and possible industrial activity extending east towards the site. There are no statutorily designated monuments within the site or its study area. This site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the site.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Private Housing Estate 1995-2003 with a lost historic character of Nursery 1982-1994 and Piecemeal Enclosure 1066-1981. The site is assigned to the Late 20th Century Private Suburbs character zone.

Examination of historic OS maps show the site lay within a large irregular enclosed field east of Smithy Wood until the 1920s-30s when it was divided in association with a mixed residential and agricultural development on Upper Wortley Road in the north of the study area. By the 1950s a row of small structures had been built in the centre of the site and a further 5 or 6 structures around it. A detached house was built within the site in the 1980s-90s.

Post-1990 APs show the site divided into two areas with agricultural style buildings surrounded by scrubland in the western two-thirds of the site, and a dwelling with gardens in the eastern third.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Although there are no known prehistoric, Romano-British or early medieval remains within the study area, such remains are known to be difficult to predict or exclude. This is particularly true of locations with little or no previous ground disturbance. Thus the possibility of disturbing remains dating from the prehistoric, Romano-British and early medieval periods is recorded as uncertain, and the significance is recorded as unknown. There is a low possibility for disturbing remains of post-medieval mines (bell pits) of medium local significance and a high possibility for disturbing modern remains of no significance.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets at this site is considered to be moderate due to disturbance from localised areas of modern development across the site.

The SMR records several monuments within the site and its study area. Within the east corner of the site is the approximate location of St Anne's Well that dates from the medieval period and was used into the 19th century. Running adjacent to the northwest boundary of the site is the suggested route of the Roman Road between Brough and Doncaster with coins and pottery recorded along its route in the south of the study area. Other records within the study area comprise: the possible site of a bronze age burial mound; the medieval College of Jesus; the medieval bridge chapel of Our Lady on the Don; post-medieval windmills, and the 19th century Church of St Stephen. There are 7 statutorily designated heritage assets within the study area, comprising 6 Grade II Listed Buildings and the Grade II Registered Park and Garden of Clifton Park. The site is not visible from any of these assets.

This site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the site.

The HEC records the present character of the area around the site as Civil & Municipal Buildings 1967-2003, with a lost historic character of Terraced Housing 1893-1966, Surveyed Enclosure 1776-1892 and Valley Floor Meadows 1066-1775. The site is assigned to the Rotherham Replanned Centre character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicate the site has undergone considerable change during the modern period. In the 1850s the site lay within enclosed land and was crossed by Eastwood Lane. The 1:1056 scale town plan of this date shows the land north of the lane as probable allotment gardens including two wells that appeared to lie just within the site. By the 1890s the site had been developed to include two blocks of terrace housing with yards and outhouses behind them that could also be the site of small scale industry. In the 1970s-80s the blocks were pulled down to create a car park and Eastwood Lane truncated to the south of the site.

Post 1990 APs show the site to be paved and in use as a car park.

Whilst there is likely extensive disturbances created by the construction and subsequent demolition of 19th century terraces, there are also yard areas in the northwest and southeast of the site which will have been less disturbed.







The SMR records these sites as lying within the area of the former Dinnington Colliery that was open between 1905 and 1991. There are no statutorily designated monuments within the site or its study area. The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP mapping project records the sites as lying within an area of earthworks associated with the former Dinnington Colliery, with the central sites of two pithead baths. Furthermore there are areas of post-medieval ridge and furrow in the study area to the northeast and south of the sites; and earthworks in the study area to the south associated with a former brick works, and additional spoilhead and slagheaps of Dinnington Colliery.

The HEC records the present character of the sites as Regenerated Scrubland 1991-2005 with invisible historic characters of Deep Shaft Coal Mine 1905-1900, Strip Fields 1540-1904 and Open Fields 1066-1539. The site is assigned to the Post Industrial character zone.

Examination of historic OS maps show the sites were undeveloped in 1854, comprising a mixture of strip fields and agglomerated fields either side of the northwest-southeast aligned Eel Mires Dike. By the 1930s Dinnington Colliery occupied the sites north of the Dike with a spoil heap expanding into the northeastern site. Development south of the Dike was slightly different, comprising sidings and tracks of the colliery's mineral railway within the southwest site whilst the southern site remained as undeveloped scrubland on the edge of the straightened Dike.

Post 1990 APs show the sites within scrubland following the closure and demolition of the colliery, whilst the most recent APs illustrate the present industrial estate that has been constructed. All the sites north of the Dike appearing to have already been cleared and readied for development.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

There is a low possibility for disturbing remains of pre-1854 filed boundaries of negligible significance within the southern site and a medium possibility for modern remains of high local significance relating to Dinnington Colliery across all sites.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets at this site is considered to be poor due to likely extent of remediation during the preparation of the area for the present industrial estate and the disturbances created during the demolition and clearance of the colliery.

The SMR records lckles Corn Mill within the site, and the proposed route of the Roman road from Brough to Doncaster within the study area along the southern boundary of the site. The HEC records the site as lying within the present character area of Regenerated Scrubland 1968-2003 with a fragmentary historic character of Utilities 1923-1967, Water Powered Site 1250-1922 and Valley Floor Meadows 1066-1249. The site is assigned to the Post Industrial character zone.

Comparison of present and historic OS maps show the site to have been substantially developed during the modern period. The 1854 OS map shows the site with lckles Corn Mill towards its eastern end with enclosed land to the west. The mills dam ran parallel to Sheffield Road along the southern boundary of the site. Situated to the east and west of the mill were structures identified as domestic in nature during the archaeological mitigation of the site. In the 1920s the land west of the mill was developed a pumping station for Sheffield Corporation, which was expanded over the following two decades. The mill was demolished in the 1960s and the water works in the 1990s.

Post 1990s APs show the site as divided by Phoenix Riverside to the south side of which two-storey office blocks have been developed. The remaining area of the site is undeveloped scrubland.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

There is a high possibility for disturbing remains of the post-medieval lckles Corn Mill of medium local significance (but see note below) and a high possibility for disturbing remains of the modern Sheffield Corporation water works of low local significance.

Survival

The survival of heritage assets within this site is considered to be moderate due to disturbances associated with modern demolition.

Note

Based on the results of recent archaeological evaluation and mitigation of the site, no further archaeological work is recommended.

The SMR records lckles Corn Mill in area A to the west of the site, and the proposed route of the Roman road from Brough to Doncaster in the study area to the south of the site. The mill was archaeologically excavated in 2007 following an evaluation of site A in 2006. Three phases of the mill building were identified and dated to the post-medieval period. Although no medieval remains were discovered, documentary evidence indicates there had been a corn mill within the vicinity from the 13th century. The evaluation identified no further significant remains within the site, but highlighted the potential for sealed alluvial deposits.

This site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the site.

The HEC records the site as lying within the present character areas of Regenerated Scrubland 1968-2003 and Business Park 1986-2003. The site has a fragmentary historic character of Train Depot/ Sidings 1922-1985, Elite Residence 1854-1921 and Valley Floor Meadows 1066-1853. The site is assigned to the Post Industrial character zone.

Comparison of present and historic OS maps shows the site to have been successively developed during the modern period. The 1854 OS map shows the site as encompassing lckles House and gardens towards the north, and a complex of buildings to the southeast comprising a malthouse, smithy and possibly terraced housing. By the 1890s a row of terraces had been built in the site to the southwest, facing onto Sheffield Road, with St Paul's Mission chapel and school between them and the earlier complex. By 1903 a mineral railway had been constructed, on a large raised embankment, across the northern end of the site and south through the study area to the east of the site. Ickles House, the former malthouse and the smithy had been demolished by 1923 and railway sidings formed across the centre of the site. A narrow opensided shed was built over one of the sidings in the 1930s, and expanded in the 1940s. In the 1970s the terraces were been pulled down and the number of sidings reduced. The remaining sidings and narrow structure were removed in the late 1980s, followed by St Paul's Mission Chapel in the 1990s.

Post 1990 APs show the site as cleared, undeveloped land.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

There is an unknown possibility of disturbing medieval remains relating any earlier phases of lckles House, that would be of high local to regional significance. In addition there is also an unknown possibility of disturbing remains of the medieval lckles Corn Mill which was not identified during excavations of the later mill but is indicated in documentary evidence to have been within the vicinity of the site. There is a medium possibility of disturbing post-medieval remains of medium local significance relating to lckles house and associated buildings. There is a high possibility for modern remains relating to terraced housing, the chapel of St Paul's, and railway sidings of negligible significance.

Survival

The survival of heritage assets within this site is considered to be poor-moderate due to disturbances associated with mulitple phases of modern development.

Note

Despite the possibility of high local or regionally significant remains, the significance of the potential heritage assets on this site is interpreted as unknown rather than regional due to their predicted poor survival.





There are no statutorily designated heritage assets within the site or study area. There is one undesignated heritage asset within the study area; the site of Manvers Main Colliery. The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project records a possible Iron Age/Roman field boundary within the northern site and a complex of enclosures, field boundaries and ditches of the same period within the study area.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Business Park 1989-2003, and the northern site itself is a green space to the north of the existing business park; the southern site is a green space within the business park. The site has no historic legibility of former characters of Deep Shaft Coal Mine 1868-1988, Surveyed Enclosure 1814-1867 and Commons and Greens 1066-1813.

The 1854 OS map shows the site within strip fields with the Midland Railway running south of the site. By the 1890s the Midland and Northeastern Railway had been constructed directly to the east of the site. The site appears to remain undisturbed during the 20th century.

Current APs show the site as areas of scrubland.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Cropmarks in the site and study area indicate there is a possibility of disturbing remains dating to the Iron Age/Romano-British periods of unknown significance.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets at this site is considered to be medium due to possibility of disturbance associated with the construction of the nearby railway and adjoining business park.

The SMR records the projected route of the Roman road between Chesterfield and Templebrough running approximately northwest-southeast through the study area to the west of the site, and the location of Swinden Technology Centre to the south of the site. Swinden Technology Centre was purpose built as an experimental facility for steel production dating from the 1950s and centred on the 19th century Swinden House. It was recorded in 2002 by EH prior to a then proposed redevelopment. There are no statutorily designated heritage assets within the site or study area.

This site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the site.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Planned Estate 1964-2003, with a fragmentary historic character of Strip Fields 1540-1963 and Open Fields 1066-1539. The site is assigned to the Municipal Suburbs character zone.

Comparison of present and historic OS maps indicate the site was not developed during the modern period. In the later 19th century streets were laid out around the site and large villas built in the study area to the south of the site. The area was still undeveloped in 1900 but a boundary belt and clump of trees had been established within the site. In the 1950s semi-detached housing was built in the study area to the north and south of the site and a lane was created along the eastern site boundary. By the 1970s the lane is raised on a bank that sloped down into the site.

Post 1990 APs show the site as undeveloped.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Although there are no known prehistoric, Romano-British or early medieval remains within the site, such remains are known to be difficult to predict or exclude. This is particularly true of locations with little or no previous ground disturbance. Thus the possibility of disturbing remains dating from the prehistoric, Romano-British and early medieval periods is recorded as uncertain, and the significance is recorded as unknown. There is also a medium possibility for disturbing remains of post-medieval agriculture and pre-1854 field boundaries of negligible significance.

Survival





This is particularly true of locations with little or no previous ground disturbance. Thus the possibility of disturbing remains dating from the prehistoric, Romano-British and early medieval periods is recorded as uncertain, and the significance is recorded as unknown. There is also a high possibility for disturbing post-medieval remains of negligible significance relating to agricultural practices and pre-1854 boundaries.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets at this site is considered to be good due to the lack of modern disturbance.







There are four Grade II Listed Buildings dating from the medieval period to 18th century within the study area to the east of the site. There are no undesignated heritage assets within the site or study area. The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project records post-medieval ridge and furrow within the study area to the south of the site, now been destroyed by residential development.

The HEC records present character of the site as Private Housing Estate 1989-2005, the site itself is a green space surrounded by housing. The site also has historic legibility of former characters Strip Fields 1817-1988 and Open Fields 1066-1816. The site is assigned to the Late 20th Century Private Suburbs character zone.

Historic OS maps show the site in 1854 as part of a large enclosed field. By 1890 the field had been subdivided, there was a building in the study area to the north of the site, and a lane crossed the centre of the site. The subdivision of the field had been removed by the 1930s, and an additional building was located in the study area to the north of the site. Further housing was built along the outside of the southern boundary of the site in the 1980s.

Current and post-1990 APs show the site as undeveloped but adjacent to housing facing on to the A631 and St. Albans Way.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Although there are no known prehistoric, Romano-British or early medieval remains within the study area, such remains are known to be difficult to predict or exclude. This is particularly true of locations with little or no previous ground disturbance. Thus the possibility of disturbing remains dating from the prehistoric, Romano-British and early medieval periods is recorded as uncertain, and the significance is recorded as unknown. There is also a high possibility for disturbing post-medieval remains of negligible significance relating to agricultural practices and pre-1854 boundaries.





The SMR records 17 heritage assets within the site's study area. The majority of these assets relate to the remains of Templeborough Roman Fort and Vicus comprising barracks, granaries and wells within the fort; defensive earthworks around it; a bathhouse to the north, and a cemetery to the south. The Roman road between Brough and Doncaster passes east-west to the south of the fort and there is a road out from the fort to it. A trackway has also been identified leading south from the main road, and further roads to the southwest of the fort. There are also associated finds from the Romano-British period recorded in the vicinity of the fort including pottery, coins, a lead weight, a brooch, and a bronze bell.

In addition to Romano-British remains a Neolithic macehead and a Bronze Age palstave were found within the area of the fort, whilst a Bronze Age cance was found in river deposits to the west of the site, just outside of the study area.

There has been numerous archaeological investigations over the site of the fort including a watching brief of geotechnical testpits some of which were within the site. The results of the investigations have identified substantial areas of disturbance, up to 4.5m in places, associated with the construction of Templeborough Steel Works. There has been no specific evaluation of the presence and survival of heritage assets within site A.

This site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the site.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Metal Trades (Heavy) 1917-2003 with an invisible historic character of Valley Floor Meadows 410-1916 and Fortified Site 54-409. The site is assigned to the Industrial character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps show the site to have been substantially developed in the modern period. In the 1850s the site lay in enclosed fields when earthworks of the fort still were still visible. By the 1890s Ekin Street had been formed to the west of the site and by the 1900s buildings had been constructed along it including terraces and a Methodist chapel within the western edge of the southern area of site A. In 1917 Templeborough Steel Works was built, and the 1920s OS map shows buildings within both areas of site A. By the 1950s and 60s these buildings had expanded, although an access road was maintained east-west through the centre of the northern area of site A. The works closed in 1994 and much of the eastern half of the works, over the area of the fort, was pulled down. The remaining buildings were pulled down around 2007 and new commercial and warehousing units constructed across the plots adjacent to the site.

Post 1990 APs show the site as undeveloped land within a newly developed industrial estate.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Due to the proximity of the site to known prehistoric heritage assets, there is a medium possibility for disturbing remains from the same period that could be of up to regional or national significance. There is a medium possibility of disturbing Romano-British remains relating to activity and possible settlement around the fort of national significance. There is a high possibility of disturbing remains of the modern Templeborough Steel Works of medium local significance.

Survival

Previous archaeological excavations within the area of Templeborough Steel Works suggest that the likely survival of heritage assets within the site varies from poor to moderater, with a high level of truncation within former buildings and associated structures. However, the level of disturbance has been shown to vary and there are isolated areas of good survival.

Note

Despite the proximity of nationally and regionally significant remains, the significance of the potential heritage assets on this site is interpreted as regional rather than national due to their predicted poor survival.

The SMR records one heritage asset within the site, and 21 heritage assets within the site's study area. Recorded within the site is a Roman cinerary urn that was found in the 1930s. The majority of the assets within the study area relate to the remains of Templeborough Roman Fort and Vicus comprising barracks, granaries and wells within the fort; defensive earthworks around it; a bathhouse to the north of the fort; a vicus and industrial annexe just discovered just outside of the site to the east of the fort and believed to extend over the site; and a cemetery to the south of the fort. The Roman road between Brough and Doncaster passes east-west to the south of the fort and there is a road out from the fort to it. There are also associated finds from the Romano-British period recorded in the vicinity of the fort including pottery, coins, an iron ferrule, a lead weight, a brooch, and a bronze bell.

In addition to Romano-British remains a Neolithic macehead, a Bronze Age palstave, and a 6th century medieval brooch were found within the area of the fort. The site of the Lady's Well, a medieval holy well, is recorded in the study area to the east of the site. Beyond the well to the southeast is the site of the medieval hall of Ickles Hall, and in the study area west of the site is a point recording the approximate location of a medieval bloomery. The site of Coronation Bridge, a railway bridge built in 1953 over the Don, is also recorded in the study area to the north of the site.

There have been archaeological investigations within the site including an archaeological evaluation in 2006, and a watching brief on geotechnical testpits. These investigations identified substantial areas of disturbance, up to 4.5m in places, associated with the construction of Templeborough Steel Works. Two evaluation trenches were dug in the site revealing truncated remains of Romano-British occupation in one and only modern disturbance in the other.

This site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the site.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Metal Trades (Heavy) 1917-2003 with an invisible historic character of Valley Floor Meadows 410-1916 and Fortified Site 54-409. The site is assigned to the Industrial character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps show the site to have been substantially developed in the modern period. In the 1850s the site lay in enclosed fields when earthworks of the fort still were still visible. By the 1900s a bank of spoil was illustrated to the east of the site, between the river and the Sheffield Road. In 1917 Templeborough Steel Works was built, and the 1920s OS map shows a building within the southwest of the site and railway tracks across the centre of the site. By the 1930s the building had expanded further east into the site, whilst the railway continues around the eastern edge of the site. The works closed in 1994 and much of the eastern half of the works, including the building within the site, was pulled down. The remaining buildings were pulled down around 2007 and new commercial and warehousing units constructed across the plots adjacent to the site.

Post 1990 APs show the site as undeveloped land within a newly developed industrial estate.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Due to the proximity of the site to known prehistoric heritage assets, there is a medium possibility for disturbing remains from the same period that could be of up to regional or national significance. There is a medium possibility of disturbing Romano-British remains relating to settlement activity around the fort of up to national significance. There is a high possibility of disturbing remains of the modern Templeborough Steel Works of medium local significance.

Survival

Previous archaeological excavations within the area of Templeborough Steel Works suggest that the likely survival of heritage assets within the site varies from poor to moderate, with a high level of truncation known to have taken place in areas of the site. However, the level of disturbance has been shown to vary across the former steelworks site, depending on the nature of site levelling and construction and there may be isolated areas of good survival.

Note

Despite the proximity of nationally and regionally significant remains, the significance of the potential heritage assets on this site is interpreted as regional rather than national due to their predicted poor survival.



There are no statutorily designated heritage assets within the site or study area. 

The SMR records 2 heritage assets within the study area, comprising the possible route of the Roman road between Brough and Doncaster to the south, and the site of the now demolished, formerly Grade II Listed, stable building of Aldwarke Hall to the north of the site. Discussion with SYAS indicates that the stables did, in fact, lie outside of the study area. Aldwarke Bridge, a Grade II Listed Building, is also in the study area to the north of the site. The site lies on the western edge of the area surveyed by the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, which records post-medieval ridge and furrow in the study area to the east of the site, and the site of a 20th century workers hostel to the southeast.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Other Industry 1965-2003 with an invisible historic character of Surveyed Enclosure 1764-1964 and Open Fields 1066-1763. The site is assigned to the Industrial character zone.

Comparison of present and historic OS maps show the site was developed in the late 20th century. Part of the site corresponds with the position of an oxbow lake (later named The Elbow) that had been separated from the original course of the River Don in the mid 18th century during the construction of Aldwarke Lock for the River Don Navigation. In 1854 the site is also shown as overlying the corner of the historic parish boundaries of Rotherham, Ecclesfield (Detached) and Dalton, with the boundary between Rotherham and Dalton following a raised path and stream. The original Aldwarke Lane also crossed the site at its eastern end. In the 1960s the western half of The Elbow was truncated for new playing fields raised over the western half of the site, with spoil heaps shown over the eastern half. By the 1970s the lake had fully gone and by the 1980s two warehouses were located within the site.

Post 1990s APs show a warehouse and car park within the site, now demolished.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Due to the proximity of the site to the presumed route of a Roman road, there is a uncertain possibility for disturbing remains from the Romano-British period of unknown significance. There is a moderate possibility of disturbing remains of the medieval to post-medieval route of Aldwarke Lane of low local significance, a low possibility of disturbing remains of post-medieval parish boundaries of medium local significance and a low possibility of disturbing remains of post-medieval parish boundaries of medium local significance and a low possibility of disturbing remains of post-medieval agriculture of negligible significance. Survival

An archaeological desk based asessment in 1999 covered an area that encompassed the site. The work recorded post late 17th century bell pits for ironstone extraction within the site. The pits were still visible in APs from 1968 but not by 1980 as they had been partially cleared and backfilled by Rotherham MBC. The report on the investigations also records communications with Clifton Park Museum in 1999 who indicated that several of the bell pits had been sealed and retained as examples of early industrial features. Observations by SYAS in 1990, and the HLC from aerial photographs taken in 1999, recorded earthworks as still visible within the site.

This site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the site.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Annular Spoil Heap (Bell Pit earthworks) 1800-2005 with a lost historic character of Assarts 1540-1799 and Ancient Woodland 1066-1539. The site is assigned to the Assarted Enclosure character zone.

Examination of historic OS maps show the site to have had very little modern interference. On the 1854 OS map the site is shown to be divided into four rectangular enclosures that contain between 11 and 16 shafts (labelled as 'shafts' to the west and 'ironstone shafts' to the east). By the 1890s these appear to be disused, however the earthworks remain on the maps until the 1970s when the area is shown to be rough pasture with a small refuse tip within the south of the site. By the 1990s the refuse tip had gone and the site had become partially wooded.







Bassingthorpe Area proposed development sites





Bramley/Wickersley Area proposed development sites

















Rotherham Town Centre proposed development sites






Rotherham Urban Area (southeast) proposed development sites




