Rotherham Local Plan, Archaeology Scoping Study of Additional Site Allocations

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Executive Summary

Wessex Archaeology was commissioned by the Environment and Development Services team at Rotherham Metropolitan Borough Council (Rotherham MBC) to carry out an archaeological scoping study of a further 66 sites that are being considered for inclusion in Rotherham MBC's Local Plan. This study has been carried out to the same methodology and standard as a previous scoping study "Archaeology Scoping Study of Site Allocations" (Wessex Archaeology March 2012).

Heritage assets and historic landscapes within and around each site have been identified to allow an assessment to be made of the archaeological potential of each site and the likely implications for future development. Where archaeological potential varied within a site it has been subdivided, resulting in a new total of 71 sites.

The results of the assessments are tabulated in **Section 7** of this document and presented as individual site reports and maps in **Section 8**. The assessment identified:

Major archaeological objections to allocation	1 (1.5%) sites with major archaeological objections to allocation. These are not suitable for inclusion in the Local Plan and are shown as RED on the maps.
Potential archaeological objections to allocation	16 (22.5%) sites with potential objections to allocation. These sites are suitable for inclusion in the Local Plan but there is a high risk that they contain heritage assets that will affect any future development proposals. These sites are shown as YELLOW on the maps.
Uncertain archaeological objections to allocation	36 (51%) sites with uncertain objections to allocation. These sites are suitable for inclusion in the Local Plan but there is an unknown level of risk as they could contain heritage assets that pose a risk to development. These sites are shown as YELLOW/GREEN STRIPES on the maps.
Little or no archaeological objections to allocation	18 (25%) sites with little or no objections to allocation. These sites are suitable for inclusion in the Local Plan as there is a low risk that they contain heritage assets that pose a risk to development. These sites are shown as GREEN on the maps.

These four categories are discussed in detail in **Section 5**, with summaries of the likely planning requirements for dealing with archaeological concerns and of the potential risks to Local Plan allocation and future development proposals if significant archaeological remains are present.

1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 **Project summary**

- 1.1.1 Wessex Archaeology undertook a scoping study of an initial 145 sites for inclusion in the Rotherham Local Plan in 2012 (Wessex Archaeology 2012; hereafter 'Phase 1'). The current project (hereafter 'Phase 2') comprises a review of existing archaeological and historic environment character data for an additional 66 preferred sites, in order to assess the presence of designated and/or identified heritage assets within each site and a predetermined study area around it.
- 1.1.2 Heritage assets and historic landscapes, within and surrounding each site have been considered to provide an evidence base for the assessment of the archaeological potential of each preferred site. Recommendations are made regarding the suitability of each preferred development site in terms of heritage constraints.

1.2 Project background

1.2.1 Wessex Archaeology was commissioned by the Environment and Development Services team at Rotherham MBC to carry out an archaeological scoping study (Wessex Archaeology 2012). Rotherham MBC has now identified a further 66 preferred sites for new development to meet Core Strategy targets for new housing and employment land in Rotherham District over the plan period to 2028. These include the identification (within the Core Strategy 2013 as submitted) of 'broad locations' for significant medium to large scale new development - mainly comprising of urban extensions into the Green Belt. They include preferred sites for new housing and employment sites that will be detailed in the emerging Sites and Policies Document. An assessment of the suitability of these sites considered for potential allocation in the Local Plan and possible development, in relation to their archaeological potential, is now required to the same standards and methodology as the previous study (Wessex Archaeology March 2012).

1.3 Planning policy

1.3.1 National planning policy, set out in the National Planning Policy Framework (DCLG 2012) requires that planning authorities deliver sustainable development and requires consideration of the historic environment in policies and decisions concerning the historic environment, this includes recognising the wider importance of the historic environment and measures where:

126. Local planning authorities should set out in their Local Plan a positive strategy for the conservation and enjoyment of the historic environment...

128. In determining applications, local planning authorities should require an applicant to describe the significance of any heritage assets affected, including any contribution made by their setting...

1.3.2 Following on from the Publication Core Strategy, Rotherham MBC has identified proposed sites for new housing and employment in the Draft Sites and Policies Document May 2013. The 2012 Archaeological Scoping Study of Site Allocations (Wessex Archaeology



2012) assessed 145 sites to determine the suitability of these sites for future development, in relation to their archaeological potential. Refinement of the allocations since that time has now identified a further 66 sites requiring assessment for their archaeological potential, necessitating an extension to the earlier archaeological scoping study.

2 AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

2.1 Aims


2.1.1 The overall aim of the project was to collect and collate information on the 66 preferred sites, in order to allow an assessment to be made of the archaeological potential of each preferred site and make recommendations as to their suitability for potential allocation and future development in terms of heritage constraints. The specific aims were:

Aim 1	To collate existing digital data in order to provide an evidence base for assessment.
Aim 2	To compile a geodatabase to identify heritage assets within each preferred site and its study area.
Aim 3	To identify the significance of heritage assets and historic landscapes within each preferred site and its study area.
Aim 4	To assess the archaeological potential of each preferred site and its study area.
Aim 5	To make recommendations as to the suitability of each preferred area for potential allocation and future development in terms of heritage constraints.
Aim 6	To prepare a report identifying, for each preferred area, heritage assets and their significance; archaeological potential; and suitability for allocation.

2.2 Objectives

2.2.1 The objects of the project were:

Objective 1	To contribute to the evidence base of Rotherham MBC's Local Plan to meet national and regional planning policy requirements to ensure that its preparation is based upon an understanding of the local archaeological resource.
Objective 2	To establish the known or expected archaeological potential of the sites identified as 'preferred' for future development by Rotherham MBC.
Objective 3	To provide information that can inform subsequent decisions on whether to include all or only some of these 'preferred' development sites within the Local Plan Sites and Policies Document.





3 METHODOLOGY

3.1 Introduction

3.1.1 A Project Design (Wessex Archaeology 2013) was prepared by Wessex Archaeology in accordance with the guidance set out in Management of Research Projects in the Historic Environment ('MoRPHE', English Heritage 2006). The Project Design was approved by Rotherham MBC and the South Yorkshire Archaeology Service prior to the commencement of the study.

3.2 Data sources

- 3.2.1 The following data sources were consulted:
 - Digital Ordnance Survey base map data and the boundaries of the preferred sites were provided by Rotherham MBC;
 - Digital Historic Environment Characterisation data, Sites and Monuments Record data and aerial photographic cropmark data were provided by the South Yorkshire Archaeology Service;
 - Non-digital data sources (documents, plans etc.) held by the South Yorkshire Archaeology Service;
 - GIS-based data relating to all listed buildings in England, held by Wessex Archaeology;
 - The National Heritage List for England;
 - Historic and modern Ordnance Survey maps, and
 - Online sources for aerial photograph and satellite imagery.

3.3 Data handling and analysis

- 3.3.1 An ArcGIS geodatabase was constructed to support the spatial analysis of the preferred development sites in relation to known heritage assets, modern and historic mapping and aerial photographs. Spatial queries were used to select the heritage assets potentially affected (both directly and indirectly) by the proposed development sites and the resulting lists were used to populate the heritage asset records.
- 3.3.2 Rotherham MBC's existing site reference codes were preserved for this study and the following information was recorded for each proposed development site:
 - A summary of the information consulted.
 - Heritage assets that may be directly affected by the development of the site.
 - Heritage assets and historic landscapes within 250m of the site boundary or that otherwise may be affected by development through effects on their setting.
 - An assessment of the archaeological potential of the proposed site.
 - A recommendation for each preferred site on the suitability of all or part of the site for allocation.
- 3.3.3 A Microsoft Access interface to the system provided a summary view of the data on a site by site basis. The presence and significance of known or potential archaeological heritage assets was considered and assessed and a summary of this information was entered as plain text into the database form.



- 3.3.4 Where areas of significantly differing archaeological potential were identified within a site, the site was split into sub-areas for separate assessment. These areas are uniquely identifiable but remain referenced to the original preferred site.
- 3.3.5 These data were extracted from the geodatabase as the individual site reports that form **Section 8** of this report.

3.4 The assessment process

3.4.1 The significance of identified and potential heritage assets was assigned using professional judgement taking into account the nature of the heritage interest; the extent of the fabric (or site) that holds that interest; and the level of importance of that interest with reference to the heritage values set out in English Heritage's Conservation Principles (2008).

3.5 Consultation with South Yorkshire Archaeology Service

3.5.1 Completed site assessments were submitted to the South Yorkshire Archaeology Service for approval prior to the compilation of this report. Where concerns or comments were raised the assessments have been amended to take account of the additional information provided by the South Yorkshire Archaeology Service.

3.6 Assumptions and limitations

- 3.6.1 The data used to compile this report consists of secondary information derived from a variety of sources, only some of which have been directly examined for the purposes of this Study. The assumption is made that this data, as well as that derived from other secondary sources, is reasonably accurate.
- 3.6.2 The records held by South Yorkshire Sites and Monuments Record are not a record of all surviving elements of the cultural heritage resource, but a record of the discovery of a wide range of heritage assets. The information held within it is not complete and does not preclude the subsequent discovery of further elements of the historic environment that are, at present, unknown.



4 PRESENTATION OF RESULTS

4.1 Summary

- 4.1.1 The results of the assessments are tabulated in **Section 7** and presented as individual site reports in **Section 8**. Location maps of the preferred sites are included in **Section 9**.
- 4.1.2 Combined tables of results from the Phase 1 and Phase 2 assessments are also presented in **Section 7**. Following additional consultation with SYAS, four sites from the Phase 1 assessment were re-assessed. The results of the re-assessment are presented in **Addendum 2**.
- 4.1.3 Each site report includes location information, map, site assessment and a summary list of identified heritage assets. The first page of each site report includes a map of the proposed site that is colour-coded to provide a visual indicator of the likely archaeological implications of development, with red indicating significant archaeological constraints, through yellow and yellow/green stripes, to green indicating little or no archaeological constraints.
- 4.1.4 Each report also includes a site assessment with statements of archaeological significance and recommendations (see **4.2** and **4.3** below). This is followed by a summary of known heritage assets and historic landscapes within the site and the 250m study area and includes English Heritage designations where relevant. Each report concludes with:


a) an assessment of the possibility of encountering heritage assets within the site and the likely significance of each type of asset, and

b) a summary of the predicted survival of heritage assets at the site.

4.2 Definitions: Archaeological significance

- 4.2.1 Each site has been allocated a significance level of International, National, Regional, high Local, medium Local, low Local, Negligible or Unknown depending upon the factors described in the table below.
- 4.2.2 Significance has been assessed taking into account current understanding of the heritage assets. In most cases this does not include any detailed desk-based research or field investigation and therefore the allotted significance should be considered as provisional pending further information. Sites may contain heritage assets of varying levels of significance, in which case the highest level of significance has been applied to the whole site or recorded as 'unknown', depending upon the nature of the heritage assets that are present or anticipated.

4.3 Definitions: Recommendations

4.3.1 The suitability of each site for potential allocation and possible development has been assessed based on heritage constraints, leading to one of the following four recommendations:

Major archaeological objections to allocation		The site contains, or is close to, <i>known</i> archaeological remains of national or regional significance <i>and</i> there has been little or no previous development or disturbance on the site and archaeological survival is predicted to be moderate or good.
Potential archaeological objections to allocation		The site contains, or is close to, <i>known</i> archaeological remains of regional or local significance <i>and</i> there has been little or no previous development or disturbance on the site and archaeological survival is predicted to be moderate or good.
Uncertain archaeological objections to allocation	The site contains, or is close to, <i>known or</i> <i>predicted</i> archaeological remains of local or unknown significance <i>or</i> there has been little or no previous developme or disturbance on the site and archaeological survival is predicted to be moderate or good.	
Little or no archaeological objections to allocation		The site contains no known or predicted archaeological remains <i>or</i> there has been significant previous development or disturbance on the site and archaeological survival is predicted to be poor.

4.3.2 The implications of these recommendations for the Local Plan are discussed in **Section 5** below.

5 RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

5.1 Summary

- 5.1.1 The results of the study are tabulated in **Section 7** and presented as individual site reports in **Section 8**. Maps showing site locations are included in **Section 9**.
- 5.1.2 Where warranted the preferred sites were subdivided to more than one recommendation per site, resulting in a new total of 71 sites.

5.1.3 The assessment identified:

Major archaeological objections to allocation	1 (1.5%) sites with major archaeological objections to allocation. These are not suitable for inclusion in the Local Plan and are shown as RED on the maps.
Potential archaeological objections to allocation	16 (22.5%) sites with potential objections to allocation. These sites are suitable for inclusion in the Local Plan but there is a high risk that they contain heritage assets that will affect any future development proposals. These sites are shown as YELLOW on the maps.
Uncertain archaeological objections to allocation	36 (51%) sites with uncertain objections to allocation. These sites are suitable for inclusion in the Local Plan but there is an unknown level of risk as they could contain heritage assets that pose a risk to development. These sites are shown as YELLOW/GREEN STRIPES on the maps.
Little or no archaeological objections to allocation	18 (25%) sites with little or no objections to allocation. These sites are suitable for inclusion in the Local Plan as there is a low risk that they contain heritage assets that pose a risk to development. These sites are shown as GREEN on the maps.



5.2 Sites with major archaeological objections to allocation

The site contains, or is close to, known archaeological remains of national or regional significance <u>and</u> there has been little or no previous development or disturbance on the site and archaeological survival is predicted to be moderate or good.

Sites

5.2.1 The following site is in this category: LDF0379

Recommendation

5.2.2 It is recommended that this site is not included in the Local Plan as this would result in a conflict with historic environment planning policy.

Planning requirements

- 5.2.3 In the event that, following further consideration, this site is proposed for development, further archaeological investigation will be required, *prior to the submission of a planning application*, to establish the presence/absence, significance and condition of heritage assets at the site. The planning application should be supported by a Heritage Statement that includes an assessment of the impact of the specific development proposals based on the results of a staged evaluation which is likely to involve one or more of the following:
 - Detailed desk-based assessment
 - Geophysical survey
 - Fieldwalking
 - Trial trenches

Archaeological risks

- 5.2.4 If significant archaeological remains are present there is potential for:
 - A recommendation for refusal of the application on heritage grounds
 - A requirement for the re-design of the proposals
 - A requirement for mitigation works, such as detailed excavation

5.3 Sites with potential archaeological objections to allocation

The site contains, or is close to, known archaeological remains of regional or local significance <u>and</u> there has been little or no previous development or disturbance on the site and archaeological survival is predicted to be moderate or good.

Sites

5.3.1 The following sixteen sites are in this category: LDF0023, 0237, 0305, 0327, 0409B, 0433, 0447B, 0480, 0502A, 0514, 0515, 0699, 0773, 0785, 0799, 0800.



Recommendation

5.3.2 These sites are considered to be suitable for inclusion in the Local Plan but developers should be aware that further archaeological information will be required, and there are risks associated with any development.

Planning requirements

- 5.3.3 These sites will require further archaeological investigation, *prior to the submission of a planning application*, to establish the presence/absence, significance and condition of heritage assets at the site, and to allow the final scheme to be designed accordingly, i.e. having taken archaeological constraints into consideration. The planning application should be supported by a Heritage Statement that includes an assessment of the impact of the specific development proposals based on the results of a staged evaluation which is likely to involve one or more of the following:
 - Detailed desk-based assessment
 - Geophysical survey
 - Fieldwalking
 - Trial trenches

Archaeological risks

- 5.3.4 If significant archaeological remains are present there is potential for:
 - A recommendation for refusal of the application on heritage grounds
 - A requirement for the re-design of the proposals
 - A requirement for mitigation works, such as detailed excavation

5.4 Sites with uncertain archaeological objections to allocation

The site contains, or is close to, known or predicted archaeological remains of local or unknown significance <u>or</u> there has been little or no previous development or disturbance on the site and archaeological survival is predicted to be moderate or good.

Sites

5.4.1 The following 35 sites are in this category: LDF0022, 0110, 0134, 0208, 0221, 0229A, 0261, 0270, 0280, 0375, 0392, 0409A, 0413, 0429, 0447A, 0453, 0458, 0462, 0483, 0484, 0498, 0501, 0512, 0533, 0544, 0551, 0565A, 0664, 0691, 0709, 0723, 0767, 0770, 0779, 0793, 0798.

Recommendation

5.4.2 These sites are considered to be suitable for inclusion in the Local Plan but developers should be aware that further archaeological information will be required and there are risks associated with any development.



Planning requirements

- 5.4.3 These sites will require further archaeological investigation to establish the presence/absence, significance and condition of heritage assets at the site. A staged evaluation should be initiated *prior to the submission of a planning application* and the application should be supported by a Heritage Statement that includes an assessment of the impact of the specific development proposals based on the results of a staged evaluation. Further stages of evaluation may be required as a *condition of planning consent*. Developers should consult the South Yorkshire Archaeology Service for site-specific advice. Evaluation is likely to involve one or more of the following stages:
 - Detailed desk-based assessment
 - Geophysical survey
 - Fieldwalking
 - Trial trenches

Archaeological risks

- 5.4.4 If significant archaeological remains are present there is potential for:
 - A recommendation for refusal of the application on heritage grounds
 - A requirement for the re-design of the proposals
 - A requirement for mitigation works, such as detailed excavation

5.5 Sites with little or no objections to allocation

The site contains no known or predicted archaeological remains <u>or</u> there has been significant previous development or disturbance on the site and archaeological survival is predicted to be poor.

Sites

5.5.1 The following eighteen sites are in this category: LDF0014, 0105, 0198, 0209, 0229B, 0289, 0294, 0376, 0397, 0454, 0502B, 0507, 0523, 0563, 0565B, 0599, 0757, 0792.

Recommendation

5.5.2 These sites are considered to be suitable for inclusion in the Local Plan with no significant risks.

Planning requirements

5.5.3 Planning applications to develop these sites should include a copy of the relevant scoping study from this report and the South Yorkshire Archaeology Service should be consulted to establish whether any further archaeological investigation will be required *as a condition of planning consent*.

Archaeological risks

5.5.4 No archaeological work will be required prior to the submission of an application and any planning condition requirements are likely to be limited.


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

There are no statutorily designated heritage assets within the study area. The SMR records five undesignated monuments within the study area including: the site of the now destroyed Knouch Bridge Mill (Cornmill), the remains of which may be under a yard and later building; six flint waste flakes of unknown date; Canklow Wood Iron Age and Romano-British Settlement, approximately 100m to the east of the site, consisting of a complex of Iron Age or Romano-British enclosures, lynchets, drove road and earthworks (including cultivation terraces, field boundaries and enclosures), a number of undated cairns possibly representing stone clearance from agricultural land, post medieval remains consisting of bell pits, a spoil heap and quarry, several surface finds of 1st and 2nd century A.D. pottery and native ware; A small Bronze Age Flat Axe; Roman pottery of 2nd or 3rd century date, walling and road material; and A 13th century pottery kiln was found in 1957 and re-excavated in 1962 within the 500m buffer.

The site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the site.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Unenclosed Land: Regenerated Scrubland 1955-2003 with a fragmentary historic character of Extractive: Deep Shaft Coal Mine 1891-1954 and Enclosed Land: Valley Floor Meadows 1066-1890. The site is assigned to the Post-Industrial character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicate the site changed considerably in the last decade of the 19th century with the establishment of the Rotherham Main Collieries by the 1890s, the associated buildings of which continued to occupy the site until the colliery was closed in 1954 and then cleared in the 1970s. Prior to the establishment of the collieries the site was within enclosed land.

The Modern OS map shows the site to be almost entirely cleared with some remnants of the colliery, particularly the presence of several disused shafts.

Post 1990 Aps show the area to be scrubland.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

There is a high possibility of disturbing 19th and 20th century remains of negligible significance.

Survival

The likely survival of pre-19th century heritage assets at this site is considered to be poor due to the extensive disturbance caused by the establishment of the Rotherham Main Collieries. However, the survival of remains related to the colliery is considered to be moderate.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Modern Industrial 1906 - 2003 with a fragmentary historic character of Industrial 1854 - 1905 and Enclosed Land: Valley Floor Meadows 1066 - 1853. The site is assigned to the Complex Historic Town Cores character zone.

Comparison of historic OS indicate the northwest section of the site was occupied by buildings associated with the Rotherham Old Brewery, establishe din the 1820s, from the 1st edition release until the determination of a brewery disappears from the maps by 1968. By 1980 the brewery buildings in the middle of the site have been demolished and another building with a different footprint erected in their place. The southern portion of the site seems to have remained undisturbed until 1980 when a single building is erected. The area immediately to the north of the site that contained brewery buildings has undergone change since 1955 with several of the buildings having been demolished. The area to the east of the site saw considerable change during the 1930s when the enclosed land was developed as a housing estate.

The modern OS map shows the site to have one standing building indicating the 1980s building has been demolished.

Post 1990 APs show the site to still have one standing building with the rest of the site covered in concrete/tarmac.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Due to the proximity of the site to known heritage assets there is a low possibility for disturbing remains from the Romano-British period could be of high local significance. Although there are no prehistoric or Anglo-Saxon remains within the site, such remains are difficult to predict or exclude, especially within areas with no previous ground disturbance. The possibility of disturbing remains from these periods is uncertain with the significance being recorded as unknown. There is a high possibility of disturbing 19th century remains relating to Rotherham Old Brewewy of high-local significance.

Survival

The likely survival of pre 19th centruy heritage assets is thought to be poor due to the disturbance by the construction of a new building in the 1980s, however, the extent of the disturbance over the rest site may be less as it is primarily under tarmac/concrete.



There are no statutorily designated heritage assets within the study area. The SMR records 22 undesignated monuments within the study area, including a suggested Iron Age or Romano-British trackway running in a north south alignment from Chesterfield towards the Templeborough fort within the site itself. Within the study area are a large number of heritage assets including and related to Templeborough Roman Fort (Morbium) located 250m to the northeast of the site. The fort covered 6.5 acres and was enclosed by a ditch and turf rampart standing on the southern bank of the Don, almost opposite the Brigantian stronghold at Wincobank. A Roman cemetery to the east of the fort contained two Roman burial urns with one probably dating to the 1st century A.D while a later Roman cremation cemetery dated to the 3rd Century AD was identified much closer to the fort than that of the 1st century burials and suggests the forts contraction. A number of Roman roads have been identified within the study area, including the suggested route of a Roman road entering South Yorkshire in the southwest from Brough (Derby), travelling northeast towards the Roman fort at Templeborough and then towards Doncaster, a section of Roman road identified in the 1950s believed to be a junction of the Sheffield to Templeborough road and another road running Brightside past the south of the fort.

Within the wider area further Romano-British remains have been identified, as well as earlier prehistoric remains. These include a mace head dated to the Mesolithic or Neolithic period, a Bronze Age dug out canoe (log boat) C14 dated to 3450 +- 150 BP and a Bronze Age looped palstave. A hoard of Roman brooches and a hoard of 177 Roman coins were recovered, as well as a Roman cinerary urn dated to the middle of the 1st century A.D and a Roman industrial annexe containing glass working and iron working. Later remains identified in the wider area include a mid-6th century Anglo-Saxon Brooch and a medieval bloomery.

Archaeological trial trenching within the study area revealed evidence of good survival of parts of the Roman fort and vicus and a watching brief monitoring geotechnical test pits at the site of the former Templeborough steelworks revealed 1st and 3rd century Roman pottery. Archaeological investigations within the 500m buffer include observations made of ARP (air raid protection) trenches proving the presence of Roman civilian occupation, excavation in 1947 revealed a section of the Roman military road alongside 2 houses and shops. Further excavation at a water treatment site in 1979 revealed clay floors and stone walls; and traces of road metalling were discovered during the inspection of a sewer excavation.

The site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the site.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Commercial: Warehousing 1985-2003 with a with an invisible historic character of Enclosed Land: Open Fields 1066-1539 and Enclosed Land: Strip 1540-1984. The site is within the Post Industrial character zone.

Comparisons of historic OS maps indicate the site has remained largely undisturbed as enclosed land despite the development of the surrounding land. A warehouse was built on the land immediately to the west of the site somewhere between 1970 and 1973 with a series of buildings identified as works being built in the late 1950s to 1960s.

The modern OS map indicates the land remains undeveloped

Post-1990 APs show the site as being covered with tarmac/concrete and used as a car park for the adjacent warehouse.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Given the proximity of the site to known heritage assets, there is a high possibility for disturbing the remains from the Romano-British period that are of regional significance. There is a low possibility of disturbing the remains from the Bronze Age period that could be of regional significance. There is a medium possibility of disturbing medieval remains of low local significance.

Survival

The survival of heritage assets on the site is considered to be high due to little disturbance having taken place on the site aside from the laying of tarmac/concrete to create a car park.

There are no statutorily designated or undesignated heritage assets within the study area.

The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project records one feature within the site consisting of earthworks relating to a 20th century spoil heap or pond.

The HEC records the present character of the site as split between Industrial: Metal Trades (Heavy) 1961-2003 with a partial historic character of Enclosed Land: Open fields 1066-1775, Ornamental, Parkland and Recreational: Private Parkland 1776-1899. The site is assigned to the Industrial character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the River Don ran through the eastern section of the site which remained largely unchanged from the 1st edition until the 1920s when it appears to have been used to store spoil from the operations of the Roundwood Colliery to the southwest. Situated on site the Roundwood Staith first appeared on the 1892 OS, which shows the colliery linked by a tramway to the South Yorkshire Navigations. Demarcated as 'liable to flood' during the 1920's and 30s OS editions. The area to the west of the site changed in the late 19th century with the establishment of the Sheffield and Mexborough Branch line which likely connected the railway and water ways through the staith on site. The site remained unchanged until 1968 when a Slag Reduction works was established to the south and the associated spoil heaps encroached onto the site within the southern section. Around the same time a large rolling mill was erected to the northwest of the site. In the late 1980s the course of the River Don was changed in the eastern part of the site to make way for a new large steel works south-southwest of the site.

The modern OS map indicates the Slag Reduction Works has been destroyed with the rest of the site remaining unchanged since the 1980s.

Post-1990 APs show the site to be covered with spoil heaps and associated material from the steel works.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

There is a low possibility of disturbing post medieval and modern remains of negligible significance.

Survival

The survival of heritage assets on this site is considered to be moderate to poor given the eastern section of the site has been disturbed by the rerouting of the River and the southern end disturbed by modern works.



There are no statutorily designated heritage assets within the study area. The SMR records one undesignated monument within the study area, a late prehistoric flint arrowhead found in a broken state in the plough soils.

The Magenesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping project records two features within the study area relating to post-medieval ridge and furrow with one being within the site boundaries.

The HEC records the present character of the site as being split between Enclosed Land: Strip fields 1540-2003 with a partial historic character of Enclosed Land: Open Fields 1066-1539. The site is assigned to the Strip Enclosure character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicated the site has not changed, remaining as strip fields. Development around the site did not take place until the 1930s when a housing estate was erected to the east and south of the site. 

There are no statutorily designated heritage assets within the study area. The SMR records one undesignated monument within the study area, the suggested route of a Roman road entering South Yorkshire in the southwest from Brough (Derby), which travels north-east towards the Roman fort at Templeborough then towards Doncaster. The route of the road runs directly to the south of the site.

The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping project records one feature within the site relating to a 20th century air raid shelter and four features within the study area, three relating to post-medieval ridge and furrow and a fourth relating to a 20th century worker's hostel.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Ornamental, Parkland and Recreational: Playing Fields/Recreation ground 1922-2003 with a fragmentary historic character of Enclosed Land: Piecemeal Enclosure 1066-1853 and Industrial: Water Powered Site 1854-1921. The site is within the Post Industrial character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the site occupied an enclosed field in the mid-19th century and was adjacent to the Dalton Brook Windmill to the northwest. This windmill is marked as a corn mill of the 1890s map. A school was constructed within the site in the 1920s, with residential housing also constructed south of the site at this time.

The modern OS map indicates the school building still standing on the site.

Post-1990 APs show the site to have a standing building with a tarmac car park and a green area.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

There is a high potential of disturbing 20th century remains of low local significance. The site is located adjacent to a potential Roman road therefore there is medium possibility of disturbing Romano-British remains of unknown significance.

The survival of heritage assets on this site is considered to be poor within the area occupied by the school but moderate within the green area adjacent to the road.





There are no statutorily designated heritage assets within the study area. The SMR records one undesignated monument within the study area, the suggested route of a Roman period road entering South Yorkshire in the southwest from Brough (Derby), travelling north-east towards the Roman fort at Templeborough and then towards Doncaster. Thrybergh Deer Park which has medieval origins dating back to a grant of free warren given to the local lord for the establishment of the park in 1259-1260 is also within 500m of the site.

The Magenesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping project records three features within the study area: One relating to a 20th century air raid shelter and two relating to earthworks from post medieval ridge and furrow.

The HEC records the present character of the site as being split between Commercial: Warehousing 1984-2003 with an invisible historic character of Enclosed Land: Open Fields 1066-1539 and Enclosed Land: Piecemeal Enclosure 1540-1983; and Residential: Planned Estate (Social Housing) 1948-2003 with a fragmentary historic character of Enclosed Land: Open Fields 1066-1539 and Enclosed Land: Piecemeal Enclosure 1540-1947. The site is split between the Industrial Settlements and Municipal Suburbs character zones.

Comparisons of historic OS maps indicate the site remained as fields until the 1920s when a building was erected in the middle of the site immediately adjacent to Old Gate Lane. The development continued into the 1930s on the eastern part of the site when Chesterhill Avenue was constructed to accommodate housing. Further development in the 1960s to the southwest of the site occurred over the previous allotments.

The modern OS map indicates the site has been cleared of a large section of the housing along Chesterhill Avenue and a large building has been built in the previously undisturbed western part of the site.

Post-1990 APs show the site to have been fully cleared of all its former buildings and is now under grass.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

There is an unknown possibility of disturbing medieval remains of unknown significance. There is a low possibility of disturbing post-medieval remains and a high possibility of disturbing 20th century remains of negligible significance

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets at the site is considered low due to modern building disturbance.



There are six designated heritage assets within the study area, most of which are associated with the post-medieval development of Anston. Directly south of the site is the Grade II Listed Lodge Farmhouse dating to the 19th century.

The SMR records seven undesignated heritage assets within the study area. The earliest evidence for activity in the area is a Roman coin of Gallienus, further Roman coins were recovered within the wider area. Medieval remains within the study area include a moated enclosure, dry and mutilated with no building foundations visible with medieval ridge and furrow in two fields east of the moated site. A sherd of 14th century medieval pottery has also been recovered, along with the truss of a timber frame structure surviving in a wall. Post-medieval remains include an early 18th century house.

The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping project records one feature within the study area relating to earthworks from postmedieval ridge and furrow.

The HEC records the present character of the site as being split between Residential: Private Housing Estate 1982-2005 with a fragmentary historic character of Enclosed Land: Open Fields 1066-1839 and Extractive: Quarry 1840-1981; and Residential: Burgage Plots 1066-2005. The site is split between the Nucleated Rural Settlements and Late 20th Century Private Suburbs character zones.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicate the site has remained as open fields with quarrying work having taken place to the immediate north east of the site where old limekilns are identified on the 1890s map. To the east of the site is Anston Hall with considerable evidence of quarrying in the surrounding area. Residential dwellings are in place to the south pre-dating the first edition OS with residential development to the north taking place during the 1980s.

Modern OS maps show the site to be open fields.

Post-1990 APs show the site to be open fields with grass vegetation.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Although there are no known prehistoric, Romano-British or Anglo-Saxon remains within the site, such remains are difficult to predict or exclude, especially in areas with no previous ground disturbance. The possibility of disturbing remains relating to these periods is uncertain with the significance being recorded as unknown. There is an uncertain possibility of disturbing medieval remains of unknown significance. There is a low possibility of disturbing post-medieval remains of a negligible significance.

The survival of heritage assets is considered to be good as the site has remained undisturbed.



The SMR records two monuments within the study area: St James Church, mostly 14th/15th century but may incorporate earlier work with 19th century restoration and medieval ridge and furrow in two fields to the east of a moated site.

The NHLE records two Listed Buildings within the study area: One is the Grade I listed Church of St James, a 14th century church with a 15th century tower and clerestory, restored in 1886 and 1890 and Laurel Bank, mid-late 18th century house with 19th century additions and alterations built with deeply coursed, dressed limestone and a Welsh slate roof.

The SMR records one monument within the study area, a post-medieval timber framed building which may date from before 1700, 68m to the northwest of the site and a further ten monuments within 500m of the site including All Saints Church, a Norman/13th century church with some later work; A Medieval hall surrounded by a moat; and Thornhill Hall, on the site of an important Pre-Conquest and early Medieval Manor, evidence of 15th century ovens.





There are two designated heritage assets within the study area, Brampton Hall, a manor house with a timber-framed core of two builds c1500 and c1550 encased and altered in the 18th and 19th century and a probable mid-18th century house with attached school-room, with the school-room rebuilt 1791. The SMR records a series of well preserved ridge and furrow earthworks within the study area and Brampton Hall, an 18th century timber framed house.

The HEC records the present character of the site as being Enclosed Land: Agglomerated Fields 1989-2004 with an invisible historic character of Enclosed Land: Open Fields 1066-1819 and Enclosed Land: surveyed Enclosure (Parliamentary/Private) 1820-1988. The site is assigned to the Surveyed Enclosure character zones.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the site remained as enclosed land. A small structure, partially within the northwest corner of the site, can be seen on the 1854 map. The 1890 OS map indicates an "Old Coal Pit" in the northwest corner of the site. Other coal pits are present to the south and west of the site, in particular at New Brampton Colliery in the southwest. Residential development began in the 1970s to the north of the site.

The modern OS map indicates the site is still enclosed land and that further residential development has taken place to the west of the site and a new electricity substation has been built to the south.

Post-1990 APs show the site to be enclosed land with grass vegetation.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Although there are no known prehistoric, Romano-British or Anglo-Saxon remains within the site, such remains are difficult to predict or exclude, especially in areas with no previous ground disturbance. The possibility of disturbing remains relating to these periods is uncertain with the significance being recorded as unknown. There is a high possibility of disturbing pre-1854 field boundaries of negligible significance, and 19th century, or possibly earlier, mining remains of potentially high-local significance.

Survival

The survival of heritage assets is considered to be good. The presence of disused mine shafts and indications from archaeological investigations suggest the area may have been disturbed by mining activities. Areas subjected to early mining are considered to have poor preservation of older heritage assets but should be considered assets in their own right. The likely survival of pre-18th century heritage assets in areas unaffected by mining is considered to be good.

There is one designated heritage asset within the study area, a cast iron milepost located southwest of the site. The SMR records one monument within the site consisting of Maltby Main Colliery. Two heritage assets are recorded within the study area including a circular enclosure potentially representing a prehistoric/Romano-British settlement and an earthwork enclosure of probable Romano-British date at Maltby Wood. The rest of the site remained as woodland and enclosed land until the early 1980s when the southern section of the site was developed to make room for an extension to the colliery buildings. The northern section of the site seems to have remained as enclosed land apart from the laying of railway tracks to service the Colliery.





The SMR records further potential Iron Age and Romano-British remains within 500m of the site including an irregular shaped enclosure of possible Iron Age or Roman date, a prehistoric or Romano-British field system, an Iron Age or Romano-British enclosure and field system and lime kiln of probable Romano-British date all located to the east, west and south of the site.

The SMR records four archaeological investigations within the study area. A geophysical survey followed by targeted trial-trenching at Sandy Lane revealed seven late medieval lime kilns dated by archaeomagnetism to the late 15th-16th century and a possible contemporary field system. Geophysical survey undertaken south of Morrisons revealed one large ditch and tentative medieval boundary ditches, while further geophysical survey undertaken at Bawtry Road indicating the presence of a number of linear archaeological features.

The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project records features within the site boundary consisting of cropmarks relating to Romano-British ditches and field boundaries. It also records two features within the study area consisting of earthworks relating to post-medieval ridge and furrow.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Enclosed Land: Agglomerated Fields 1967-2005 with a fragmentary historic character of Enclosed Land: Open Fields 1066-1539 and Enclosed Land: Strip Fields 1540-1966. The site is assigned to the Agglomerated Enclosure character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the site remained as enclosed land with a change in field boundaries occurring in the late 19th century when several boundaries were removed. Further boundary changes occurring the late 1950s. The M18 was constructed to the west of the site in the 1970s

Post-1990 APs show the site is located within an arable field.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

The site contains the remains of Iron Age to Romano-British field boundaries of high local significance



There are no designated or undesignated heritage assets within the study area.

The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project records one feature within the study area relating to post-medieval ridge and furrow.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Enclosed Land: Surveyed Enclosure (Parliamentary/Private) 1800-2005 with a significant historic character of Unenclosed Land: Commons and Greens 1066-1799. The site is assigned to the Surveyed Enclosure character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the site occupied enclosed land until the 1960s when a cattery was built in the northwest corner of the site. Development began outside the site, along its southern edge, in the 1940s with more housing being added throughout the 1950s to 1970s.

The modern OS map indicates the site is enclosed land with two buildings associated with the cattery.

Post-1990 APs show the site to have two cattery buildings on it with the rest of the site enclosed land under grass.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Although there are no known prehistoric, Romano-British or Anglo-Saxon remains within the site, such remains are difficult to predict or exclude, especially in areas with no previous ground disturbance. The possibility of disturbing remains from these periods is uncertain with the significance being recorded as unknown. There is a high possibility of disturbing pre-1854 field boundaries of negligible significance.



There are no statutorily designated heritage assets within the study area. The SMR records three undesignated monuments within the study area: St Mary Magdalen Chapel, pulled down in 1817; Swinton Old Hall which incorporated a 16th century, or earlier, structure; and a Middle Bronze Age barbed and tanged arrowhead.



There are no designated heritage assets within the site, with two Listed Buildings recorded within the study area. These include the remains of the Chapel of St Mary Magdalene c.1200, demolished in 1815 and the church of St Margaret built in 1817 and rebuilt in 1899. The base of the medieval town cross was located within the study area until it was moved in 1961.

The SMR records four undesignated heritage assets within the site. 



There are no designated heritage assets within the site or study area. The SMR records two heritage assets within the Study Area, these relate to the standing and below ground remains of the Don Valley Pottery built c.1801 located 60m northwest of the site. One of the eight kilns associated with this pottery survive above ground.

The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project records one feature within the study area relating to a 20th century air raid shelter.

The HEC records the present character of the site as being Commercial: Business Park 1999-2005 with a fragmentary historic character of Enclosed Land: Valley Floor Meadows 1066-1854, Communications: Train Depot/Sidings 1855-1985 and Unenclosed Land: Regenerated Scrubland 1986-1998. The site is assigned to the Post Industrial character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the site remained as enclosed land until the early part of the 20th century when allotments were established within the site. The allotments remained on the site until the late 1960s-early 1970s when they appear to have been cleared along with any remaining boundaries. Works were established immediately to the south of the site in the 1940s with more works and housing being built to the west.

Post-1990 APs show the site to be grass scrubland, surrounded on all sides by works and industrial buildings.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Although there are no known prehistoric, Romano-British or Anglo Saxon remains within the site, such remains are difficult to predict or exclude, especially in areas with no previous ground disturbance. The possibility of disturbing remains relating to these periods is uncertain with the significance being recorded as unknown. There is moderate possibility for disturbing pre-1854 field boundaries of negligible significance.

Survival

The survival of heritage assets on this site is considered to be good as it has remained undisturbed



There are no designated heritage assets within the study area. The SMR records two monuments within the study area consisting of a spindle whorl of unknown date, and the Swinton Glassworks. The site was subject to documentary research and a walkover survey indicating the buildings associated with the 20th century chemical works which later occupied the site have been entirely demolished.

The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project records three features within the study area including earthworks relating to post medieval ridge and furrow and 20th century remains relating to a spoil heap and an air raid shelter.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Industrial: Chemical 2002-2006 with a fragmentary historic character of Enclosed Land: Open Fields 1066-1539, Enclosed Land: Strip Fields 1540-1890 and Industrial: Chemical 1891-2001. The site is assigned to the Post Industrial character zone.

The first edition OS map shows the site was enclosed land with a railway running along the western boundary and the South Yorkshire Navigation canal along the eastern boundary. The Swinton Iron and Steel Works is located just outside the south eastern corner of the site. By the 1890s the Don Chemical Works has been established within the south eastern corner of the site, with the Swinton Iron and Steel Works now marked as disused. The Chemical Works continues to expand throughout the 20th century, with structures occupying the entire site by the 1950s. A spoil heap is recorded within the northern end of the site in the 1960s and is seen to expand during the 1970s, this area was used for the deposition of lime slurry and other wastes during the operational life of the chemical works. The site appears to have been cleared in the 1990s.

Post-1990 APs show the site to be have been largely cleared, with some buildings still remaining at the northern end of the site. These buildings have been demolished by 2008.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

There is a high possibility for disturbing remains relating to the late 19th century chemical works of low local significance and its subsequent 20th century expansion of negligible significance.

Survival







There are fourteen Listed Buildings within the study area including the Grade I listed Church of All Saints, primarily of 14th and 15th century construction with late 12th century arcades, located 177m southwest of the site and the Grade II* listed Aughan Court (also known as Aston Hall) built c.1772 for Lord Holderness, 241m south of the site. The SMR records two undesignated heritage assets within the study area, the site of the medieval hall located at the site of Aston Hall. Excavation on the land adjacent to Aston Hall revealed backfill consistent with the demolition of the original hall c.1700 with bricks and pottery dating to the 15th and 17th centuries. Shallow pits and postholes contained pottery dating to the 11th and 12th century indicate previous low level activity on the site. Post-medieval timber-framed cottages have also been recorded at the western side of the study area.

The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project records three features within the study area consisting of earthworks relating to medieval lynchets and ridge and furrow, and earthworks and cropmarks relating to post-medieval ridge and furrow, all located to the north and east of the site.

The HEC records the present character of the site as being split between Residential: Villas/Detached Housing 1930-2003 with a partial historic character of Residential: Burgage Plots 1066-1699 and Residential: Vernacular Cottages 1700-1929. The site is assigned to the Nucleated Rural Settlements character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the site occupied enclosed fields with a pond on the northern edge in the mid-19th century. The site is located northeast of the historic core of Aston and northwest of the hamlet of Netherthorpe. A structure appears on the north western edge of the side on the 1890s map, with two additional small glazed roofed structures located here by the 1900s. These may represent sheds and were demolished by the late 1970s.

The modern OS map and post-1990 APs indicates the site is still enclosed fields.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Although there are no known prehistoric, Romano-British or Anglo Saxon remains within the site, such remains are difficult to predict or exclude, especially in areas with no previous ground disturbance. The possibility of disturbing remains relating to these periods is uncertain with the significance being recorded as unknown. There is moderate potential for disturbing medieval and post-medieval remains relating to the development of Aston and Netherthorpe of unknown significance. There is a moderate possibility of disturbing pre-1854 field boundaries of negligible significance.

Survival

The survival of heritage assets on this site is considered to be good as it has remained undisturbed.

There are no statutorily designated heritage assets within the study area. The route of a suggested Roman road running from Chesterfield to Templeborough traverses the western edge of the site, while an assemblage of 18th century pottery has been recorded within the study area.

The site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the site.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Commercial: Commercial Core-Suburban 1960-2003 with a partial historic character of Enclosed Land: Piecemeal Enclosure 1066-1749, Residential: Farm Complex 1750-1902 and Residential: Terraced Housing 1903-1959. The site is assigned to the Industrial Settlements character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicate there was a standing building named as the Swallow Nest Inn at the western end of the site in 1854 with the rest of the site occupied by enclosed fields. By the 1890 map a building, presumably terrace housing, has been built within the eastern end of the site facing the road. By the 1900 map further buildings have been erected in the centre and northern section of the site, with the Swallow Nest Inn demolished by the 1940s. The site remained largely unchanged until the 1970s when the terraced housing in the eastern end were demolished. By the early 1980s the site has been cleared of all buildings.

The modern OS map indicates the site has remained cleared.

Post-1990 APs show the site to be cleared of all buildings and under grass vegetation with some small patches of tarmac visible.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

There is a moderate possibility of disturbing Romano-British remains of unknown significance. There is a high possibility of disturbing 19th century remains, including an inn and terrace housing, of low-local significance.

Survival

The survival of pre-19th century heritage assets on this site is considered to be poor due to 19th century and modern disturbance. The survival of 19th century heritage assets is considered to be poor to moderate as the site has remained undisturbed since their demolition.

There is a high possibility of disturbing medieval and post-medieval agricultural remains associated with the development of Wales of medium local significance. The historic core of Wales village is located directly to the northwest of the site and as such any development within the site may impact upon the setting of the village and its associated heritage assets. This impact, and the impact on the significance of the village, would need to be assessed.

There is a high possibility of disturbing Iron Age/Romano-British remains of regional significance due to the presence of an Iron Age/Roman trackway within the site. There is a high possibility of disturbing pre-1854 remains of negligible significance.

Survival

The survival of heritage assets on the majority of this site is considered to be good due to lack of previous ground disturbance. Survival at the southwest corner is considered to be poor due to 21st century disturbance.

There are no statutorily designated heritage assets within the study area. The SMR records five undesignated monuments within the study area, including onedirectly to the west of the site, a suggested Iron Age or Romano-British trackway running north-south from Chesterfield towards the Templeborough fort. Other Romano-British remains within the study area include a stretch of Roman road running west to east from Catcliffe to Oldcotes, with a spur from the Brough-Doncaster-Templeborough road also recorded. Medieval and post-medieval remains have been identified within Tinsley Park Wood to the southwest of the site, including a medieval bank, post-medieval trackways, pits, shafts, shaft mounds, bell pits, terrace, tree avenue and modern platform and shelter.

The site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping project, so no information is available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the site.

The HEC records the present character of the site as being split between Unenclosed Land: Regenerated Scrubland 1968-2003 and Communications: Train Depot/Sidings 1981-2004 with an invisible historic character of Enclosed Land: Open Fields 1066-1539 and Enclosed Land: Strip Fields: 1540-1967. The site is split between the Extractive and Post Industrial character zones.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the site was located within enclosed land until the early 1900s when the Sheffield District Railway was constructed across the site. The line appears to have become disused by the 1970 map, with Tinsley Marshalling Yard occupying the site at this time. This yard was associated with development of rail sidings to the north.

Post-1990 APs show the site to be currently under scrubland vegetation.





There are no statutorily designated or undesignated heritage assets within the study area. A trial trench excavated within the study area, to the southeast of the site, revealed evidence of medieval ploughing but no earthworks due to modern ploughing activities.

The site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the site.



The SMR records one undesignated asset within the study area consisting of numerous post-medieval bell pits and shafts. Approximately 370m to the east of the site are further examples of bell pits and Kirkstead Grange Abbey associated with iron workings 80m to the north of the site.







There is one designated heritage asset within the study area, the Grade II Listed Woodsetts House. The SMR records two undesignated assets within the study area, a building of a possible 18th to 19th century date and the post-medieval church of St George's located 40m southwest of the site.

The site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping project, so no information is available on any cropmark features in or adjoining the site.

The HEC records the present character of the site as being split between Residential: Vernacular Cottages 1800-2006 and Residential: Private Housing Estate 1967-2006 with a significant historic character of Vernacular Cottages 1066-1799 and fragmentary historic character of Enclosed Land: Open Fields 1066-1539 and Enclosed Land: Strip Fields 1540-1966. The site is split between the Nucleated Rural Settlements and Early to Mid-20th Century Private Suburbs character zones.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the site occupied a series of enclosed fields with a school building and additional structure to the south of the school just within the western edge on the 1854 map. By the 1930s map the school building has been extended, taking up most of the northwest corner of the site, while the eastern section of the site is still occupied by two fields. The school appears to have been extended again in the 1970s, with the structure to the south no longer depicted.

The modern OS map indicates the site has been cleared of the school and the building in the southwest corner.

Post-1990 APs show the site as scrubland, with a small park/playground constructed within the southern half of the site in the late 2000s.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

There is a moderate possibility for disturbing remains of medieval and post-medieval date of high local significance. There is also a high possibility of disturbing 19th century remains of low-local significance and 20th century remains relating to additions to the school of negligible significance.

Survival

The survival of pre-19th century remains is considered to be low due 19th and 20th century disturbance. The survival of 19th century heritage assets relating to the school is considered to be moderate to poor as the 20th century additions to the school, together with the creation of the park/playground, may have impacted earlier remains.

There are no statutorily designated or undesignated monuments within the study area.

The site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available of cropmark features in or adjoining the site.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Enclosed Land: Agglomerated fields 1973-2005 with a fragmentary historic character of Enclosed Land: Open Fields 1066-1539 and Enclosed Land: Strip Fields 1540-1972. The site is assigned to the Agglomerated Enclosure character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the site has changed little since the mid-19th century when it consisted of two fields with a boundary running through the middle on an east-west alignment. An old gravel pit is recorded on the 1st edition OS map to the east of the site. By the 1890s the settlement of Fir Hill has been established to the north of the site, with the construction of terrace housing and a Methodist chapel. Evidence for an increase in quarrying in the surrounding area can be seen with the depiction of further gravel and sand quarries located to the southeast of the site. The northern half of the site is occupied by allotment gardens from the 1920s until the 1970s, with two houses built just outside the site, along its eastern edge, at this time.

Post-1990 APs show the site to remain divided into two by a field boundary and that a modern garden extension with garage has been built in the northwest section of the site.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Although there are no known prehistoric, Romano-British or Anglo Saxon remains within the site, such remains are difficult to predict or exclude, especially in areas with no previous ground disturbance. There is one designated heritage asset within the study area, the Grade II Listed early to mid-18th century house at 44 and 46 Kiveton Lane. The SMR records one undesignated asset within the study area consisting of two Roman coins, Antoniniani of Gallierius (A.D. 253-268, Rome mint) found in a field with 'several others' 130m southeast of the site.

The site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available of cropmark features in or adjoining the site.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Enclosed Land: Agglomerated Fields 1973-2005 with a fragmentary historic character of Enclosed Land: Open Fields 1066-1539 and Enclosed Land: Piecemeal Enclosure 1540-1972. The site is assigned to the Agglomerated Enclosure character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicate the site changed little since the mid-19th century when it occupied an enclosed field immediately adjacent to Goose Carr Lane, 250m west of the historic core of Todwick. Todwick begins to expand from the mid-20th century, with housing established to the southeast at this time. By the 1970s the village has expanded considerable to the southeast, with the site taking its current form.



There are three designated heritage assets within the study area, all located at the southeast corner of the study area. These include the Grade I listed 13th century Church of All Hallows, the Grade II church school house rebuilt in 1721 and early to mid-18th century Glebe farmhouse. The SMR records five undesignated assets within the study area including two unidentified flints found in a field west of Harthill probably dating to the Neolithic or Bronze Age periods, a rectangular 10th century brooch, a 16th/17th century stone house, a pottery assemblage of unknown date and a Scottish silver coin of unknown date.

The site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available of cropmark features in or adjoining the site.

The HEC records the present character of the site as being split between Enclosed Land: Crofts 1066-2005 and Residential: Burgage Plots 1066-2006. The site is split between the Nucleated Rural Settlements and Strip Enclosure character zones.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates shows the eastern side of the site was occupied by farm buildings since at least the mid-19th century. These buildings have expanded by the 1890s and are named as North House. An additional building is visible within the southern section of the site by the 1930s map. The site changes little until the 1970s map when further buildings have been erected within the eastern section of the site.

The modern OS map indicates the buildings erected in the 1970s have been demolished and replaced by several smaller buildings.

Post-1990 APs show the site to have farm buildings still standing adjacent to the road with a small housing development having been erected in the middle of the site where the 1970s buildings stood.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

There is a high possibility of disturbing the standing 19th century or earlier remains of the farmhouse which is potentially of high-local significance. Additionally, the area of the site not covered by the buildings has been identified by the South Yorkshire Historic Environment Characterisation programme as having high archaeological potential relating to the medieval village. There is therefore a medium possibility of disturbing medieval remains of medium-local significance.

Survival

The survival of heritage assets on this site is considered to be good for the standing remains of the 19th century farm buildings and areas undisturbed by modern development. Survival is considered to be poor in the disturbed areas.





There are three statutorily designated Listed Buildings within the study area. Two Grade II Listed Buildings are situated in the northern extent of the study area, consisting of a medieval hall known as Wellgate Old Hall and a 19th century lamp standard. Within the southern extent of the study area is a post-medieval Grade II* Listed Building, Moorgate Hall and attached outbuilding. The SMR records eight undesignated heritage assets within the study area. The remains of a possible Roman building is situated at the south end of the study area, in close proximity to two Roman find spots. A further Roman findspot is located to the north of the site, as is the putative course of the Chesterfield to Templeborough Roman Road. Two ecclesiastical buildings are situated north of the site, one medieval the other post-medieval, with two 19th century structures located south of the site, one a now destroyed drain/ culvert the other a former workhouse.

This site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the site.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Commercial: Offices 1950-2003, with fragmentary historic legibility of Residential: Burgage Plots 1066-1850 and Villas/ Detached Housing 1851-1949. The site is assigned to the Complex Historic Town Cores character zone.

Comparison of present and historic OS maps show the site in the 1850s to be located within enclosed fields, with a vicarage situated immediately west of the site. However, by 1889 only part of this field system remained, with Elmtree Bank and associated grounds occupying the northwest corner of the site. By 1903 a building was constructed within the south of the site and the immediate study area was further developed with buildings constructed to the south and east of the site. The site remains static throughout the first half of the 20th century, with no new buildings constructed, however the former bank does undergo repeated expansion and restructuring during this period. Between 1968 and 1980 the buildings in the south of the site are demolished and the new buildings are constructed in the north.

Post-1990 APs show the site to consist of the former bank building in the northwest of the site, with two ancillary car parks forming the rest of the site. 21st century APs show that between 2008 and 2009 the building on site was demolished, with the most recent AP showing the site to be as of yet undeveloped.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

There is a medium possibility for disturbing Romano-British remains of unknown significance due to the high concentration of Roman find spots and features within the study area. There is also a medium possibility for survival of 19th - 20th century building foundations on site of negligible significance.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets at this site is considered to be poor, due to disturbance associated with the construction and demolition of 19th and 20th century buildings.

A small inn named as the Three Tuns Inn is situated in the north east corner and appears in the 1889 OS with an attached smithy to the west. The surrounding study area consists primarily of a large field system during this period. Additional structures appear within the site in the 1930s. 



The site is assigned to the Post Industrial character zone.

Comparison of present and historic OS maps show the site in the 1850s, situated on the intersection of 4 fields in the north of the site with a brook 'Rookery Bottom' forming part of this intersection. A small rectangular enclosure forms the largest area within the site at this period. By the 1890s the course of Rookery Bottom had diverted to the north, leaving the site situated exclusively within large enclosures. There are no designated heritage assets within the study area. The SMR records one undesignated monument within the site, a boundary from a possible Iron Age/Romano-British field system. Further monuments relating to the possible Iron Age/Romano-British field system are recorded within the study area, 192m to the west of the site and further afield, approximately 359m to the south west of the site.

There are no statutorily designated or undesignated heritage assets within the site. There is one undesignated heritage assets within the wider area, the site of Car House Colliery located 360m northeast of the site. This site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the site.

The HEC records present character of the site as Agglomerated Fields 1938-2011 and Ornamental, Parkland and Recreational: Allotments 1922-2003 and Nursery 1986-2003, with fragmentary historic legibility of both Piecemeal Enclosure 1540-1937 and Open Fields 1066-1539. The site is assigned to the Agglomerated Enclosure character zone.

The 1854 OS map shows the site located across a number of enclosed fields. The north east corner of the site is occupied by Clough House and its associated farm buildings. Clough quarry is located outside the site, directly to the north. By the 1890s the majority of the field boundaries have been removed and many of the buildings associated with Clough House have been demolished. Some small additional structures have been constructed at the north west side of the site and an additional large building constructed north of Clough House, facing on to the road. By the 1920s allotment gardens have been established within the southern end of the site, with no changes noted in and around Clough House. By the 1950s the small structures at the north west of the site have been demolished, as have the two structures surrounding Clough House. Clough quarry is marked as disused at this time and the ceasing of works here may have attributed to the removal of buildings in and around Clough House. Clough House appears on maps up until the mid-1990s.

Current and post 1990 APs show area as arable land with the north west corner occupied by a nursery

Known and Potential Heritage Assets.

Though there are no known prehistoric, Romano-British or early medieval remains within the study area, such remains are known to be difficult to predict or exclude. This is particularly true of locations with little or no previous ground disturbance. Thus the possibility of remains dating from the prehistoric, Romano-British and early medieval periods is recorded as uncertain, and the significance is recorded as unknown. There is a high possibility for disturbing pre-1854 field boundaries of negligible significance and of remains relating to Clough House of medium local significance.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets at this site is considered to be good, although the demolition of Clough House may have caused ground disturbance in the north east corner of the site.



There is one designated heritage asset within study area; a section of the Scheduled Roman Ridge is located 20m north of the site. The SMR records a Mesolithic arrowhead was recovered 50m to the west of the site in the 1950s.

The site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available on the extent of any cropmarks features in or adjoining the site.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Extractive: Reclaimed Coal Mine 1967-2003 with invisible historic legibility of former characters Enclosed Land: Piecemeal Enclosure 1066-1872 and Extractive: Deep Shaft Coal Mine 1873-1966.

Comparison of present and historic OS maps show the site occupied enclosed fields in the mid-19th century, with a gravel pit shown within the site on the 1854 map. By the 1890s a number of small buildings and shafts are shown within the site, these represent a colliery which is marked as 'disused' by this time. By the turn of the century Jordan Colliery is established within the northeast side of the site, with the disused colliery buildings replaced by larger buildings. The colliery is disused by the 1920s, with many of the buildings on site being cleared by the 1950s and areas of spoil throughout the site. Additional buildings were constructed on site in the 1970s.

Post 1990s APs show the site occupied by scrubland with modern buildings at the east side.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Given the proximity of the site to the Roman Ridge there is a medium possibility for disturbing remains of Romano-British date of potential regional significance, the setting of the monument may also be impacted by any future development. There is also high potential for disturbing remains relating to Jordan colliery of medium local significance.

Survival

The likely survival of pre-19th century heritage assets at this site is considered to be poor to moderate due disturbance caused by Jordan colliery





There are one designated heritage asset within the study area, Brampton Grange Listed Building located to the southwest of the site. The route of a potential Roman road from Catcliffe to Oldcotes traverses the site from east to west.

The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire records one feature within the site consisting of earthworks relating to post-medieval ridge and furrow.



There are no designated heritage assets within the site or study area, however, the Scheduled deserted medieval village of Hellaby is located within 500m of the site. The SMR records two monuments within the study area, one relating to a series of possible Iron Age or Romano-British field boundaries directly to the south of the site. Further evidence for Iron Age and Romano-British remains within the study area and wider landscape including field systems and enclosures located to the east, west and south of the study area. Archaeological fieldwork within the study area include geophysical survey followed by targeted trial-trenching at Sandy Lane, 170m southwest of the site, which revealed seven late medieval lime kilns dated to the late 15th-16th century and a possible contemporary field system. The HEC records the present character of the site as Enclosed Land: Agglomerated Fields 1967-2005 with a fragmentary historic character of Enclosed Land: Open Fields 1066-1539 and Enclosed Land: Strip Fields 1540-1966. The site is assigned to the Agglomerated Enclosure character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the site was located across two enclosed fields from the late-19th century until the removal of the field boundary in the 1970s, at this time the M18 motorway was constructed to the west of the site.

Post-1990 APs show the site is located within an arable field.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Due to the proximity of the site to known heritage assets, there is a moderate possibility for disturbing remains from the Iron-Age/Romano-British period of high local significance. There is also moderate potential for disturbing remains relating to medieval activity in the area of high local significance.

There is one designated heritage asset within study area, the Grade II* Church of St. Mary Magdalene. This Church, located on a prominent hill 250m west of the site, retains original 12th century features including the west window, which is now built in to the east wall of the 13th century tower. Further evidence of 15th century re-building can be seen within the structure. The building was extensively re-built in the late 19th century. The SMR records a Roman coin findspot within the study area, 150m west of the site.

The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project does not record any features within the site or study area.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Ornamental, Parkland and Recreational: Sports Ground 1938-2003 with invisible historic legibility of former characters Unenclosed Land: Commons and greens 1066-1822 and Enclosed Land: Surveyed Enclosure (Parliamentary/ Private) 1823-1937.

Comparison of present and historic OS maps show the site occupied an enclosed field in the mid 19th century, located to the east of the historic core of Whiston, which dates to the medieval period and is mentioned in the Domesday book. A number of quarries are noted to the west of the site. The site remains undeveloped throughout the 20th century.

Post 1990s APs show the site occupied by scrubland.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Although there are no known prehistoric, Romano-British or Anglo-Saxon remains within the site, such remains are difficult to predict or exclude, especially in areas with no previous ground disturbance. The possibility of disturbing remains from these periods is uncertain with the significance being recorded as unknown. The site also lies in close proximity to a Listed Church of national significance which is itself located on the edge of a medieval settlement. The medieval village and the setting of the Chruch are considered to be of regional significance. The setting of the Church, and the impact of any development on the significance of the Church, would need to be considered prior to any development on site.



There are no designated heritage assets within site or study area. The SMR records a Roman coin findspot within the study area, 160m south of the site.

The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project does not record any features within the site or study area.




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

There are four statutorily designated Listed Buildings and one Registered Park and Garden within the study area. Wentworth Woodhouse is a Grade II* Registered Park and Garden dating to the 18th and 19th centuries with a number of notable mid-18th century monuments and follies within and around the edge of the park. There are no undesignated heritage assets within the site, one recorded within the study area, Manor Farm on Church Street. This site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the site.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Enclosed Land: Agglomerated fields 1938-2003 and allotments 1923-2003 with fragmentary legibility of former characters piecemeal enclosure 1540-1937, strip fields 1780-1922 and open fields 1066-1539. The 1854 OS map shows the site located across enclosed fields. Sewage filters are recorded at the south eastern corner of the site in the 1890s, these remain until the 1940s. In the 1920s allotment gardens are established at the southern end of the site, adjacent to the sewage filters. The remainder of the site remains as agricultural land throughout the 20th century.

Current and post-1990 APs show the site occupied by arable fields to the north, allotments to the south and scrubland to the south east.

There is one designated heritage asset within study area, the Grade II Listed Bramley Grange Farmhouse located 100m southeast of the site. This is also the site of a possible moat and fishpond and a medieval monastic grange belonging to Roche Abbey, as recorded by the SMR.



Further Mesolithic flints were recovered during fieldwalking 220m west of the site, along with Neolithic flints and a number of undated flint artefacts. There is a high possibility for disturbing below ground remains of post-medieval ridge and furrow of low local significance and pre-1854 field boundaries of negligible significance.

Survival

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The likely survival of heritage assets at this site is considered to be good due to the lack of modern disturbance.



There is one designated heritage asset within the study area, the Scheduled remains of Hellaby deserted medieval village located 230m north of the site. Excavations at the monument revealed two buildings including the medieval manors kitchen building. The SMR records three undesignated assets relating to ditches and enclosures of potential Iron Age/Romano-British date. These features are located to the east and west of the site, with further examples of Iron Age/Romano-British field systems and enclosures located in the wider area. Further medieval activity has been recorded in the wider area, with seven late medieval lime kilns recorded directly west of the M18.

The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project records post-medieval ridge and furrow within the site and enclosures and field boundaries of Iron Age/Romano-British date within the study area.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Enclosed Land: Agglomerated fields 1967-2003 with an invisible historic legibility of former characters Enclosed Land: Open Fields 1066-1539 and Enclosed Land: Strip Fields 1540-1966. The site is located within the Agglomerated Enclosure character zone.

Comparison of present and historic OS maps show the site occupied enclosed fields in the mid-19th century, the site remains as such until the late 1920s when the Hellaby greyhound race course was established at the northwest side of the site. Small structures associated with the race course included a stand, kennels and control tower. The race course appears to go out of use by the late 1930s with the associated structures no longer shown on historic maps of this time. Modern housing developments begin to appear in the surrounding area at this time and continue to develop throughout the mid-late 20th century. A small structure of unknown function can be seen in the centre of the site in the 1950s. Trackways can be seen in the north western corner of the site in the 1980s.

Post 1990s APs show a house was constructed at the centre of the site, with the western side of the site now scrubland and the remainder occupying an arable field.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

There is a high possibility for disturbing below ground remains relating to post-medieval ridge and furrow of low local significance. There is also a medium possibility for disturbing Iron-Age/ Romano-British remains of high local to regional significance.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets at this site is considered to be good due to the lack of modern disturbance except for the area occupied by the modern house.







Rotherham Local Plan Additional Sites



10 ADDENDUM 1

Change of terminology

In response to consultation received following the release of the first Archaeology Scoping Study of Site Allocations (Wessex Archaeology March 2012), the terminology used in the recommendations section of the Phase 2 assessment has been altered to reflect more accurately the purpose of the assessment and its conclusions.

The amended recommendations are as follows:

Major archaeological objections to allocation	The site contains, or is close to, <i>known</i> archaeological remains of national or regional significance <i>and</i> there has been little or no previous development or disturbance on the site and archaeological survival is predicted to be moderate or good.	
Potential archaeological objections to allocation	The site contains, or is close to, <i>known</i> archaeological remains of regional or local significance <i>and</i> there has been little or no previous development or disturbance on the site and archaeological survival is predicted to be moderate or good.	
Uncertain archaeological objections to allocation	The site contains, or is close to, <i>known or</i> <i>predicted</i> archaeological remains of local or unknown significance <i>or</i> there has been little or no previous development or disturbance on the site and archaeological survival is predicted to be moderate or good.	
Little or no archaeological objections to allocation	The site contains no known or predicted archaeological remains <i>or</i> there has been significant previous development or disturbance on the site and archaeological survival is predicted to be poor.	

The new terminology will now also apply to the Phase 1 assessment (*ibid*.). This will not result in a change to any of the original site recommendations; rather it will provide a clearer framework against which the site assessments can be understood.

The Phase 2 assessment refers to 'Rotherham Local Plan', replacing 'Rotherham Local Development Framework' from the Phase 1 assessment (Wessex Archaeology 2012). This change will also now apply to the Phase 1 assessment (*ibid*.).



11 ADDENDUM 2

Changes to Phase 1 assessment

Following completion of the Phase 2 assessment, and as a result of additional consultation with South Yorkshire Archaeology Service, four sites included in the Phase 1 study were re-assessed. These include LDF0170, 0263, 0366 and 0505.

The significance and recommendations for these sites were altered in order to ensure consistency across both phases of the assessment. The assessments were not changed as a result of the change in wording of the recommendations (**Addendum 1**), rather, upon review they were found to be inconsistent with the remainder of the original report and with the Phase 2 assessment.





The SMR records two monuments within the study area, comprising the tree lined avenue of the Grade II* Registered Park and Gardens of Wentworth House to the north, and The Balk, part of the Roman Ridge earthwork, to the northeast. The projected line of the Roman Ridge depicted on current OS maps, much of which is a Scheduled Monument, passes within 100m of the east of the site through the study area. This site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the site.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Playing Field/ Recreation Grounds 1922-2003, with a fragmentary historic character of Piecemeal Enclosure 1066-1921. The site is assigned to the Industrial Settlements character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps show the site was not substantially developed during the modern period. From 1854 the site lay in an area of enclosed fields with farmsteads and houses to the north and northwest which may have partially overlay the site boundary. In the 1940s a nursery was constructed within the centre of the site, shown on the 1958 OS to have been of glass construction with two small buildings to its northeast. The glass house was subsequently demolished in the 1980s.

Post 1990 APs show the site as largely disused with areas of scrub, hardstanding and several steel storage containers.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

The site lies in close proximity to the Roman Ridge and development of the site will affect the monument's setting, an assessment of the impact of any development on the setting and significance of the monument should be carried out prior to any development. Given the sites location close to the Roman Ridge there is potential for Romano-British remains of regional significance to be encountered. Although there are no known prehistoric or early medieval remains within the site, such remains are known to be difficult to predict or exclude. This is particularly true of locations with little or no previous ground disturbance. Thus the possibility of disturbing remains dating from the prehistoric and early medieval periods is recorded as uncertain, and the significance is recorded as unknown. There is also a medium possibility for disturbing remains of post-medieval agriculture and pre-1854 field boundaries of negligible significance, and a high possibility of disturbing modern remains of no significance relating to the former nursery.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets in the site is considered to be moderate due to disturbances associated with the construction and demolition of the 1940s nursery.





There are no statutorily designated heritage assets within the site or study area. There is one undesignated heritage asset within the southeast of the study area, comprising the findspot of a Roman coin. The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project records a possible Iron Age/Roman ditch within the study area to the south of the site. A substantial area of Iron Age/ Romano-British field systems is located within 500m to the east of the site.

The HEC records the site as largely lying within the present character area of Utilities 1989-2006, with an uncertain legibility of historic characters of Surveyed Enclosure 1770-1988 and Commons and Greens 1066-1769. The site is assigned to the Post Industrial character zone.

Historic OS maps show the site as part of an enclosed field and area of woodland towards its northern end in 1854. A reservoir tank is shown at the north end of the site in the 1930s with industrial units on site by 1970.

Current and post-1990 APs show the site containing buildings, industrial units and areas of hard standing.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Due to the proximity of the site to known heritage assets, there is a uncertain possibility for disturbing remains from the Iron Age/ Romano-British period that could be of up to regional significance. There is also a medium possibility for disturbing post-medieval remains of no significance relating to the former reservoir, and a low possibility for disturbing post-medieval remains of negligible significance relating to agricultural practices and pre-1854 field boundaries.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets at this site is considered to be poor due to the likely extend of modern disturbance associated with the construction/demolition of the former reservoir and present industrial units.



There are no statutorily designated heritage assets within the site or study area. There is one undesignated heritage asset within the site; the projected route of a Roman road from Catcliffe to Oldcotes. Within the study area is Rykneild Street, a suggested Iron Age or Romano-British trackway. This site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information is available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the site.

The HEC records the present character of the site as Regenerated Scrubland 1968-2003, with no historic legibility of former characters Strip Fields 1540-1967 and Open Fields 1066-1539. The site is assigned to the Extractive character zone.

The 1854 OS map shows the site within three strip fields, the field pattern remained unchanged until the 1950s when some boundaries were lost and others added. Opencast workings are located south of the site; the site itself does not appear to have been exploited during the lifetime of the workings.

Current APs show the site as an area of scrub land which may have been disturbed in the past.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

The projected route of a Roman road crosses the site; this could be of up to regional significance.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets at this site is considered to be good due to the lack of modern disturbance on the site.
