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Rotherham Local Plan

Archaeology Scoping Study of Additional Potential Site Allocations 2015

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Executive Summary

Wessex Archaeology was commissioned by the Environment and Development Services team at Rotherham Metropolitan Borough Council (Rotherham MBC) to carry out an archaeological scoping study of a further 35 sites that are being considered for inclusion in Rotherham MBC's Local Plan.

Heritage assets and historic landscapes within and around each site have been identified to allow an assessment to be made of the archaeological potential of each site and the likely implications for future development. Where archaeological potential varied within a site it has been subdivided, resulting in a new total of 38 sites.

The results of the assessments are tabulated in **Section 7** of this document and presented as individual site reports and maps in **Section 8**. The assessment identified:

Major archaeological objections to allocation	5 (13%) sites with major archaeological objections to allocation. These are not suitable for inclusion in the Local Plan and are shown as RED on the maps.
Potential archaeological objections to allocation	10 (26%) sites with potential objections to allocation. These sites are suitable for inclusion in the Local Plan but there is a high risk that they contain heritage assets that will affect any future development proposals. These sites are shown as YELLOW on the maps.
Uncertain archaeological objections to allocation	20 (53%) sites with uncertain objections to allocation. These sites are suitable for inclusion in the Local Plan but there is an unknown level of risk as they could contain heritage assets that pose a risk to development. These sites are shown as YELLOW/GREEN STRIPES on the maps.
Little or no archaeological objections to allocation	3 (8%) sites with little or no objections to allocation. These sites are suitable for inclusion in the Local Plan as there is a low risk that they contain heritage assets that pose a risk to development. These sites are shown as GREEN on the maps.

These four categories are discussed in detail in **Section 5**, with summaries of the likely planning requirements for dealing with archaeological concerns and of the potential risks to Local Plan allocation and future development proposals if significant archaeological remains are present.

1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Project summary

- 1.1.1 Wessex Archaeology undertook a scoping study of an initial 145 sites for inclusion in the Rotherham Local Plan in 2012 (Wessex Archaeology 2012; hereafter 'Phase 1'). A further 66 preferred sites were assessed in 2013a (Wessex Archaeology 2013a; hereafter 'Phase 2') with an additional 40 sites assessed in 2014 (Wessex Archaeology 2014; hereafter 'Phase 3'). The current project (hereafter 'Phase 4') comprises a review of existing archaeological and historic environment character data for an additional 35 potential preferred sites, in order to assess the presence of designated and/or identified heritage assets within each site and a pre-determined study area around it.
- 1.1.2 Heritage assets and historic landscapes, within and surrounding each site have been considered to provide an evidence base for the assessment of the archaeological potential of each potential preferred site. Recommendations are made regarding the suitability of each potential preferred development site in terms of heritage constraints.

1.2 Project background

1.2.1 Wessex Archaeology was commissioned by the Environment and Development Services team at Rotherham MBC to carry out an archaeological scoping study (Wessex Archaeology 2012, 2013a & 2014). Rotherham MBC has now identified a further 35 potential preferred sites for new development to meet Core Strategy targets for new housing and employment land in Rotherham District over the plan period to 2028. These include the identification (within the Core Strategy 2014 as submitted) of 'broad locations' for significant medium to large scale new development - mainly comprising urban extensions into the Green Belt. An assessment of the suitability of these sites considered for potential allocation in the Local Plan and possible development, in relation to their archaeological potential, is now required to the same standards and methodology as the previous studies (Wessex Archaeology 2012, 2013a & 2014).

1.3 Planning policy

- 1.3.1 National planning policy, set out in the National Planning Policy Framework (DCLG 2012) requires that planning authorities deliver sustainable development and requires consideration of the historic environment in policies and decisions concerning the historic environment, this includes recognising the wider importance of the historic environment and measures where:
 - 126. Local planning authorities should set out in their Local Plan a positive strategy for the conservation and enjoyment of the historic environment...
 - 128. In determining applications, local planning authorities should require an applicant to describe the significance of any heritage assets affected, including any contribution made by their setting...
- 1.3.2 The initial Archaeological Scoping Study of Site Allocations (Wessex Archaeology 2012) assessed 145 sites to determine the suitability of these sites for future development, in



relation to their archaeological potential. Refinement of the allocations in 2013 identified a further 66 sites requiring assessment for their archaeological potential, necessitating an extension to the earlier archaeological scoping study (Wessex Archaeology 2013a). In 2014, a further 40 sites were identified for assessment which form an additional extension to the 2012 and the 2013 scoping studies (Wessex Archaeology 2014). In 2015, an additional 35 sites were identified for assessment forming a further extension of the previous three scoping studies.

2 AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

2.1 Aims

2.1.1 The overall aim of the project was to collect and collate information on the 35 potential preferred sites, in order to allow an assessment to be made of the archaeological potential of each potential preferred site and make recommendations as to their suitability for potential allocation and future development in terms of heritage constraints. The specific aims were:

Aim 1	To collate existing digital data in order to provide an evidence base for assessment.
Aim 2	To compile a geodatabase to identify heritage assets within each potential preferred site and its study area.
Aim 3	To identify the significance of heritage assets and historic landscapes within each potential preferred site and its study area.
Aim 4	To assess the archaeological potential of each potential preferred site and its study area.
Aim 5	To make recommendations as to the suitability of each potential preferred area for potential allocation and future development in terms of heritage constraints.
Aim 6	To prepare a report identifying, for each potential preferred area, heritage assets and their significance; archaeological potential; and suitability for allocation.

2.2 Objectives

2.2.1 The objects of the project were:

Objective 1	To contribute to the evidence base of Rotherham MBC's Local Plan to meet national and regional planning policy requirements to ensure that its preparation is based upon an understanding of the local archaeological resource.
Objective 2	To establish the known or expected archaeological potential of the sites identified as a potential preferred site for future development by Rotherham MBC.
Objective 3	To provide information that can inform subsequent decisions on whether to include all or only some of these potential 'preferred' development sites within the Local Plan Sites and Policies



Document.

3 METHODOLOGY

3.1 Introduction

3.1.1 A Project Design (Wessex Archaeology 2013b) was prepared by Wessex Archaeology in accordance with the guidance set out in Management of Research Projects in the Historic Environment ('MoRPHE', English Heritage 2006). The Project Design was approved by Rotherham MBC and the South Yorkshire Archaeology Service prior to the commencement of the study.

3.2 Data sources

- 3.2.1 The following data sources were consulted:
 - Digital Ordnance Survey base map data and the boundaries of the potential preferred sites were provided by Rotherham MBC;
 - Digital Historic Environment Characterisation data, Sites and Monuments Record data were provided by the South Yorkshire Archaeology Service;
 - Aerial photographic cropmark data were provided by the South Yorkshire
 Archaeology Service and derives from data collect from the National Mapping
 Project (NMP) entitled 'Magnesian Limestone AP in South and West Yorkshire
 Mapping Project';
 - Non-digital data sources (documents, plans etc.) held by the South Yorkshire Archaeology Service;
 - GIS-based data relating to all listed buildings in England, held by Wessex Archaeology;
 - The National Heritage List for England;
 - Historic and modern Ordnance Survey maps, and
 - Online sources for aerial photograph and satellite imagery.

3.3 Data handling and analysis

- 3.3.1 An ArcGIS geodatabase was constructed to support the spatial analysis of the potential preferred development sites in relation to known heritage assets, modern and historic mapping and aerial photographs. Spatial queries were used to select the heritage assets potentially affected (both directly and indirectly) by the proposed development sites and the resulting lists were used to populate the heritage asset records.
- 3.3.2 Rotherham MBC's existing site reference codes were preserved for this study and the following information was recorded for each proposed development site:
 - A summary of the information consulted.
 - Heritage assets that may be directly affected by the development of the site.
 - Heritage assets and historic landscapes within 250m of the site boundary or that otherwise may be affected by development through effects on their setting.
 - An assessment of the archaeological potential of the proposed site.



- A recommendation for each potential preferred site on the suitability of all or part of the site for allocation.
- A Microsoft Access interface to the system provided a summary view of the data on a site 3.3.3 by site basis. The presence and significance of known or potential archaeological heritage assets was considered and assessed and a summary of this information was entered as plain text into the database form.
- 3.3.4 Where areas of significantly differing archaeological potential were identified within a site, the site was split into sub-areas for separate assessment. These areas are uniquely identifiable but remain referenced to the original potential preferred site.
- 3.3.5 These data were extracted from the geodatabase as the individual site reports that form Section 8 of this report.

3.4 The assessment process

3.4.1 The significance of identified and potential heritage assets was assigned using professional judgement taking into account the nature of the heritage interest; the extent of the fabric (or site) that holds that interest; and the level of importance of that interest with reference to the heritage values set out in English Heritage's Conservation Principles (2008).

3.5 **Consultation with South Yorkshire Archaeology Service**

3.5.1 Completed site assessments were submitted to the South Yorkshire Archaeology Service for approval prior to the compilation of this report. Where concerns or comments were raised the assessments have been amended to take account of the additional information provided by the South Yorkshire Archaeology Service.

3.6 **Assumptions and limitations**

- 3.6.1 The data used to compile this report consists of secondary information derived from a variety of sources, only some of which have been directly examined for the purposes of this Study. The assumption is made that this data, as well as that derived from other secondary sources, is reasonably accurate.
- 3.6.2 The records held by South Yorkshire Sites and Monuments Record are not a record of all surviving elements of the cultural heritage resource, but a record of the discovery of a wide range of heritage assets. The information held within it is not complete and does not preclude the subsequent discovery of further elements of the historic environment that are, at present, unknown.

PRESENTATION OF RESULTS

4.1 Summary

- 4.1.1 The results of the assessments are tabulated in **Section 7** and presented as individual site reports in Section 8. Location maps of the potential preferred sites are included in Section 9.
- 4.1.2 Combined tables of results from the three scoping studies are also presented in **Section** 7.



- 4.1.3 Each site report includes location information, map, site assessment and a summary list of identified heritage assets. The first page of each site report includes a map of the proposed site that is colour-coded to provide a visual indicator of the likely archaeological implications of development, with red indicating significant archaeological constraints, through yellow and yellow/green stripes, to green indicating little or no archaeological constraints.
- 4.1.4 Each report also includes a site assessment with statements of archaeological significance and recommendations (see **4.2** and **4.3** below). This is followed by a summary of known heritage assets and historic landscapes within the site and the 250m study area and includes English Heritage designations where relevant. Each report concludes with:
 - a) an assessment of the possibility of encountering heritage assets within the site and the likely significance of each type of asset, and
 - b) a summary of the predicted survival of heritage assets at the site.

4.2 Definitions: Archaeological significance

- 4.2.1 Each site has been allocated a significance level of International, National, Regional, high Local, medium Local, low Local, Negligible or Unknown depending upon the factors described in the table below.
- 4.2.2 Significance has been assessed taking into account current understanding of the heritage assets. In most cases this does not include any detailed desk-based research or field investigation and therefore the allotted significance should be considered as provisional pending further information. Sites may contain heritage assets of varying levels of significance, in which case the highest level of significance has been applied to the whole site or recorded as 'unknown', depending upon the nature of the heritage assets that are present or anticipated.

4.3 Definitions: Recommendations

4.3.1 The suitability of each site for potential allocation and possible development has been assessed based on heritage constraints, leading to one of the following four recommendations:

Major archaeological objections to allocation	The site contains, or is close to, <i>known</i> archaeological remains of national or regional significance and there has been little or no previous development or disturbance on the site and archaeological survival is predicted to be moderate or good.	
Potential archaeological objections to allocation	The site contains, or is close to, <i>known</i> archaeological remains of regional or local significance and there has been little or no previous development or disturbance on the site and archaeological survival is predicted to be moderate or good.	
Uncertain archaeological objections to allocation	The site contains, or is close to, <i>known or predicted</i> archaeological remains of local or unknown significance or there has been little or no previous development or disturbance on the site and archaeological survival is predicted to be moderate or good.	
Little or no archaeological objections to allocation	The site contains no known or predicted archaeological remains or there has been significant previous development or disturbance on the site and archaeological survival is predicted to be poor.	

4.3.2 The implications of these recommendations for the Local Plan are discussed in **Section 5** below.

5 RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

5.1 Summary

- 5.1.1 The results of the study are tabulated in **Section 7** and presented as individual site reports in **Section 8**. Maps showing site locations are included in **Section 9**.
- 5.1.2 Where warranted the potential preferred sites were subdivided to more than one recommendation per site, resulting in a new total of 38 sites.

5.1.3 The assessment identified:

Major archaeological objections to allocation	5 (13%) sites with major archaeological objections to allocation. These are not suitable for inclusion in the Local Plan and are shown as RED on the maps.
Potential archaeological objections to allocation	10 (26%) sites with potential objections to allocation. These sites are suitable for inclusion in the Local Plan but there is a high risk that they contain heritage assets that will affect any future development proposals. These sites are shown as YELLOW on the maps.
Uncertain archaeological objections to allocation	20 (53%) sites with uncertain objections to allocation. These sites are suitable for inclusion in the Local Plan but there is an unknown level of risk as they could contain heritage assets that pose a risk to development. These sites are shown as YELLOW/GREEN STRIPES on the maps.
Little or no archaeological objections to allocation	3 (8%) sites with little or no objections to allocation. These sites are suitable for inclusion in the Local Plan as there is a low risk that they contain heritage assets that pose a risk to development. These sites are shown as GREEN on the maps.



5.2 Sites with major archaeological objections to allocation

The site contains, or is close to, known archaeological remains of national or regional significance <u>and</u> there has been little or no previous development or disturbance on the site and archaeological survival is predicted to be moderate or good.

Sites

5.2.1 The following five sites are in this category: LDF0101, 0383, 0407, 542 and 0802.

Recommendation

5.2.2 It is recommended that these sites are not included in the Local Plan as this would result in a conflict with historic environment planning policy.

Planning requirements

- 5.2.3 In the event that, following further consideration, this site is proposed for development, further archaeological investigation will be required, *prior to the submission of a planning application*, to establish the presence/absence, significance and condition of heritage assets at the site. The planning application should be supported by a Heritage Statement that includes an assessment of the impact of the specific development proposals based on the results of a staged evaluation which is likely to involve one or more of the following:
 - Detailed desk-based assessment
 - Geophysical survey
 - Fieldwalking
 - Trial trenches

Archaeological risks

- 5.2.4 If significant archaeological remains are present there is potential for:
 - A recommendation for refusal of the application on heritage grounds
 - A requirement for the re-design of the proposals
 - A requirement for mitigation works, such as detailed excavation

5.3 Sites with potential archaeological objections to allocation

The site contains, or is close to, known archaeological remains of regional or local significance <u>and</u> there has been little or no previous development or disturbance on the site and archaeological survival is predicted to be moderate or good.

Sites

5.3.1 The following ten sites are in this category: LDF0163, 0251, 0259, 0417, 0515, 0667, 0677, 0696, 0697 and 0698.



Recommendation

5.3.2 These sites are considered to be suitable for inclusion in the Local Plan but developers should be aware that further archaeological information will be required, and there are risks associated with any development.

Planning requirements

- 5.3.3 These sites will require further archaeological investigation, *prior to the submission of a planning application*, to establish the presence/absence, significance and condition of heritage assets at the site, and to allow the final scheme to be designed accordingly, i.e. having taken archaeological constraints into consideration. The planning application should be supported by a Heritage Statement that includes an assessment of the impact of the specific development proposals based on the results of a staged evaluation which is likely to involve one or more of the following:
 - Detailed desk-based assessment
 - Geophysical survey
 - Fieldwalking
 - Trial trenches

Archaeological risks

- 5.3.4 If significant archaeological remains are present there is potential for:
 - A recommendation for refusal of the application on heritage grounds
 - A requirement for the re-design of the proposals
 - A requirement for mitigation works, such as detailed excavation

5.4 Sites with uncertain archaeological objections to allocation

The site contains, or is close to, known or predicted archaeological remains of local or unknown significance <u>or</u> there has been little or no previous development or disturbance on the site and archaeological survival is predicted to be moderate or good.

Sites

5.4.1 The following twenty sites are in this category: LDF0040, 0056A, 0059, 0114, 0163, 0257, 0411, 0452, 0461, 0500, 0546, 0612, 0692, 0693, 0729, 0738, 0787, 0801, 0803 and 0833.

Recommendation

5.4.2 These sites are considered to be suitable for inclusion in the Local Plan but developers should be aware that further archaeological information will be required and there are risks associated with any development.



Planning requirements

- 5.4.3 These sites will require further archaeological investigation to establish the presence/absence, significance and condition of heritage assets at the site. A staged evaluation should be initiated *prior to the submission of a planning application* and the application should be supported by a Heritage Statement that includes an assessment of the impact of the specific development proposals based on the results of a staged evaluation. Further stages of evaluation may be required as a *condition of planning consent*. Developers should consult the South Yorkshire Archaeology Service for site-specific advice. Evaluation is likely to involve one or more of the following stages:
 - Detailed desk-based assessment
 - Geophysical survey
 - Fieldwalking
 - Trial trenches

Archaeological risks

- 5.4.4 If significant archaeological remains are present there is potential for:
 - A recommendation for refusal of the application on heritage grounds
 - A requirement for the re-design of the proposals
 - A requirement for mitigation works, such as detailed excavation

5.5 Sites with little or no objections to allocation

The site contains no known or predicted archaeological remains <u>or</u> there has been significant previous development or disturbance on the site and archaeological survival is predicted to be poor.

Sites

5.5.1 The following three sites are in this category: LDF0056B, 0701 and 0801.

Recommendation

5.5.2 These sites are considered to be suitable for inclusion in the Local Plan with no significant risks.

Planning requirements

5.5.3 Planning applications to develop these sites should include a copy of the relevant scoping study from this report and the South Yorkshire Archaeology Service should be consulted to establish whether any further archaeological investigation will be required as a condition of planning consent.

Archaeological risks

5.5.4 No archaeological work will be required prior to the submission of an application and any planning condition requirements are likely to be limited.





The SMR records one undesignated heritage asset within the Study Area, the findspot of a flint scraper approximately 160m south of the Site.

The Site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information was available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the Site.

The HEC records the present character of the Site as Ornamental, Parkland and Recreational: Playing Fields/Recreation Ground 1934-2003 with a fragmentary historic character of Enclosed Land: Open Fields 1066-1539 and Enclosed Land Piecemeal Enclosure 1540-1933. The Site is assigned to the Municipal Suburbs character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the Site comprised a single field on the First Edition OS map with a single field boundary running along the eastern edge. The Site remains relatively unchanged until the 1940s OS Map when it is noted as a 'Sports Ground' with a small pavilion and access track having been built in the north-east corner. The 1980s OS map suggests the pavilion may have been extended. Outside of the Site, Dalton House is constructed sometime before 1920 to the east of the house with a row of terrace houses built by 1930 along the northern edge of the Site. By the 1940s the Site is surrounded by residential dwellings.

Post-1990 APs show the Site to still be in used as a sports ground with areas currently not used covered by long grass and occasional trees. The pavilion in the north-east corner has had a car park added to the north-east.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Although there are no known prehistoric, Romano-British or Anglo-Saxon remains within the Site or the Study Area such remains are difficult to predict or exclude, especially in areas with no previous ground disturbance. The possibility of disturbing remains relating to these periods is uncertain with the significance being recorded as unknown. From the HEC and historic OS maps evidence of agricultural activity from the medieval period to the early 20th century can be expected but would be of negligible significance.

Surviva

The likely survival of heritage assets on this Site is considered to be good aside from within the area of the pavilion where survival is considered to be moderate.





There are no statutorily designated heritage assets within the Site although three sections of the Scheduled Roman Ridge are recorded within the wider landscape, 500m, to the north of the Site.

The SMR records two undesignated heritage assets within the Study Area, both of which relate to Roman coin hoards found during the creation of a tramway in the early 20th century. One is located 30m to the west with the other 240m to the south.

The Site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information was available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the Site.

The HEC records the present character of the Site as being Enclosed Land: Surveyed Enclosure (Parliamentary/Private) 1781-2004 with a probable historic character of Unenclosed Land: Commons and greens 1066-1780. The Site is assigned to the Surveyed Enclosure character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the Site was split over five fields on the First Edition OS map. Little changes within the Site until the 1957 OS map when a boundary across the middle field is added. The 1968 OS map indicates the north-eastern corner of the Site is being used as a 'Refuse Heap' for the adjacent tip. By the late 1970s OS map all the boundaries within the Site have been removed except for that separating the now former 'Refuse Heap' from the rest of the Site. The former heap is recorded as being under grass. By the mid-1980s the whole Site is recorded as being under grass.

Post-1990 APs show the northern section of the Site to be under grass with a track running through to the eastern end with the southern and western sections seemingly used for farming.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

The Site's proximity to known heritage assets from the Romano-British period, including the Scheduled Roman Ridge, increases the likelihood of encountering remains from this period which could be up to regional significance. Although there are no known prehistoric or Anglo Saxon remains within the Site or the Study Area such remains are difficult to predict or exclude, especially in areas with no previous ground disturbance. The possibility of disturbing remains relating to these periods is uncertain with the significance being recorded as unknown. Other works appear to have been begun within the Site with the field boundaries having been removed and hachure marks suggesting landscaping/excavation works have been undertaken, one of these is noted as a 'Reservoir'. Little changes within the Site until the 1930s OS map when the buildings in the northern section of the Site have disappeared with the notation of 'Old Shaft' now present in this area. The 1940s OS map shown the northern section of the Site to have several spoil heaps within it. The 1968 OS map indicates the Site is now being used as a 'Refuse Tip'. Little changes on the Site until the mid-1980s when it is recorded as being covered in grass.





There a no statutorily designated heritage assets within the Site or the Study Area.

The SMR records one feature within the Study Area relating to the potential site of George Taylor's pottery works which was opened in 1826. The SMR notes that the exact location is at present unknown. Within the wider landscape, there are four other pottery works/kilns, with the works dating mainly from the 19th century and the kilns from the post-medieval period.

The SMR also records on archaeological investigation within the Study Area consisting of a fieldwalking survey undertaken in 1994 which recorded finds from the prehistoric to the medieval period.

The Site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information was available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the Site.

The HEC records the present character of the Site as Extractive: Reclaimed Coal Mine 1978-2004 with a probable historic character of Extractive: Deep Shaft Coal Mine 1916-1977, Enclosed Land: Surveyed Enclosure (Parliamentary/Private) 1781-1915 and Unenclosed Land: Moorland 1066-1780. The Site is assigned to the Post Industrial character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the Site was split between three fields with a track running through the middle on the First Edition OS map. Within the Site an 'Old Coal Pit' is recorded with the north-eastern edge of the bounded by a 'Viaduct'. By the 1890s OS map the trackway has gone as have the references to the 'Viaduct' and the' Old Coal Pit'. Little changes within the Site until the 1930s OS map when one of the field boundaries has been removed. By this time a large residential estate has been constructed to the east of the Site. By the 1940s OS map, all the field boundaries have been removed. Little changes on the Site throughout the rest of the 20th century. The late 1970s to early 1980s OS maps indicate the area to the north-east of the Site has been landscaped and two houses built along the south-eastern edge.

Post-1990 APs suggest the Site is currently used for agriculture.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

While the HEC records the Site as being within the New Stubbin Colliery site, the cartographic evidence viewed as part of this assessment does not support this. Due to the Site's proximity to known heritage assets relating to pottery production there is an increased likelihood of encountering similar remains, although likelihood this must be recorded as unknown. The presence of an 'Old Coal Pit' leads to an increased likelihood in encountering mining remains which would be of low local value. Although there are no known prehistoric, Romano-British or Anglo Saxon remains within the Site or the Study Area such remains are difficult to predict or exclude, especially in areas with no previous ground disturbance. The possibility of disturbing remains relating to these periods is uncertain with the significance being recorded as unknown. From the historic OS maps evidence of agricultural activity from the medieval period to the early 20th century can be expected but would be of negligible significance.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets on this Site is considered to be unknown due to the presence of a former coal pit on the Site and the possibility it formed part of the New Stubbin Colliery site. The areas not affected by former extraction are considered to be good.

The site of the New Stubbin Colliery is located approximately 700m to the west of the Site.



There is one statutorily designated heritage asset within the Site, which is also recorded by the SMR, the Grade II Listed Pumping House dated to 1823, although the tower may be earlier. The pump house contained a Newcomen Pumping Engine claimed to be the most efficient ever. The engine was replace by electric pumps in 1926 and dismantled in 1934. Within the broader landscape lies the Grade II* St Mary's Rectory.

The Site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information was available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the Site.

The HEC records the present character of the Site as Extractive: Other Mineral Extraction & Processing 1829-2005 with a probable historic character of Extractive: Deep Shaft Coal Mine 1800-1828 and Enclosed Land: Open Fields 1066-1799. The Site is assigned to the Municipal Suburbs character zone. The HEC also notes the Site was originally attached to the 'Newbiggin Colliery' in 1851.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the Site had numerous buildings within it including the Grade II Listed Pump House. The most prominent building is a long rectangular one within the centre of the Site. The Site also contains numerous coke ovens in a backwards-E configuration along its western edge and a single railway line. By the 1890 OS map, the building and coke ovens have been removed. The pump house and railway line remain, along with an oblong shaped feature which is possibly a pond. The 1920s OS map notes the Site to be part of the 'Fitzwilliam Pumping Shaft'. By the 1930s OS map the railway line has been removed and the Site is now labelled as the 'Westfield Pumping Station'. By the 1950s OS map, the Site has been built over with several new buildings constructed.

Post-1990 APs show the 1950s buildings to still be standing within the Site, with areas of hard standing between them.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

The Site contains a designated heritage asset which is of at least regional significance. The historic mapping evidence suggests there is a high likelihood of encountering remains relating to mineral extraction and processing of 19th century date, and potentially earlier, which could also be of up to regional value. Although the presence of prehistoric, Romano-British and Anglo-Saxon remains are difficult to predict, given the probable disturbance across the Site due to the industrial activity the potential for encountering these remains is low.

Survival

The likely survival of potential heritage assets on the Site is mixed, with the pump house still present. In areas where buildings have been constructed the likely survival of 19th century building remains is unknown, but likely moderate to poor depending on the construction methods used. In areas of hardstanding, preservation of remains is considered to be moderate to good, depending on whether any landscaping work was carried out prior to construction. Preservation of remains of an earlier date are considered to be poor.

There are five statutorily designated heritage assets recorded within the Study Area. These include the Grade II* Listed St Mary's Rectory, built in 1752, is located approximately 150m south-east of the eastern extension of the Site. The other statutorily designated heritage assets within the Study Area comprise the Grade II Listed the Church of St Mary and its railings and walled enclosure approximately 140m south of the eastern extension, the Grade II Listed Buildings Glossop Lodge approximately 225m west of the Site and the Grade II Listed Pumping House located approximately 120m east of the eastern edge of the Site.

The SMR records one undesignated heritage within the Site, a Second World War heavy anti-aircraft battery. Within the Study Area the SMR records the find of medieval pottery and kiln wasters immediately to the east of the Site. Also within the Study Area is the location of 'Top Pottery' works founded in 1790 approximately 75m east of the Site and the 'Low Pottery' works founded at the same time lying approximately 230m east of the Site.

The SMR also records a series of archaeological investigations within the Study Area including a programme of field walking immediately adjacent to the north-western edge of the Site which uncovered finds from the prehistoric to medieval periods; an excavation at Bellows Road, approximately 80m east of the eastern extension of the Site which uncovered a range of buildings, including a substantial cellar which was likely part of the Top Pottery works. A watching brief at Rawmarsh Rectory uncovered a single 19th-century feature associated with the pottery production in the area.

The Site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information was available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the Site.

The HEC records the presence character of the Site as mainly Enclosed Land: Agglomerated Fields 1966-2003 with an invisible historic character of Enclosed Land: Strip Fields 1540-1965 and Enclosed Land: Open Fields 1066-1539. This large section is assigned to the Surveyed Enclosure character zone. The eastern extension of the Site is split between Unenclosed Land: Regenerated Scrubland 1938-2005 with a partial historic character of Extractive: Deep Shaft Coal Mine 1800-1937 and Woodland: Ancient Woodland 1066-1799 and Enclosed Land: Surveyed Enclosure (Parliametary/Private) 1999-2005 with an invisible historic character of Enclosed Land: Strip Fields 1540-1998. The extension is split between the Agglomerated Enclosure and Municipal Suburbs character zones.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the Site comprised a large number of fields, with the 'Swallow Wood Colliery' noted in the middle with several shafts also referenced on the First Edition OS map. There are also several buildings noted within the Site, one close to the colliery with the others within the eastern extension. A railway line also runs along the eastern edge of the Site, cutting through the eastern extension. By the 1890s OS map the colliery has gone out of use with the shafts now labelled as 'Old'. The buildings within the eastern extension have been noted as 'New Deep' with an additional building constructed within the Site referenced as 'Bassett Cottage'. The railway line is recorded as 'Low Stubbin Incline'. Little changes within the Site, aside from the removal of field boundaries, until the 1920s OS map when an additional railway line is added within the northern section of the Site with an 'Old Shaft' also noted around the area of 'New Deep'. A 'Tunnel Entrance' is also noted in the area of one of the old shafts. By the 1930s OS map, further lines have been added to the railway which are serving the 'New Stubbin Colliery' to the north. The buildings at 'New Deep' have been removed. By the 1940s OS map further field boundaries have been removed and a series of buildings have been constructed within the south-west section of the Site. By the 1957 OS map the buildings within the south-west section have been identified as belonging to 'Red Ash Hill Camp'. Little changes within the Site, aside from the removal of further field boundaries and the addition of others, until the 1971 OS map when the camp has been removed and replaced by a series of buildings labelled as 'Mangham House'. This was removed by the late 1980s and early 1990s, by which time the railway line is noted as being disused.

Post-1990 APs show the Site to comprise six large fields with an area of trees separating the main part of the Site from the eastern extension.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Due to the proximity of the Site to known heritage assets from the 19th century there is a high likelihood of encountering remains relating to coal mining considered to be of medium-local significance and an increased likelihood of encountering remains relating to the local pottery industry considered to be of high-local significance. There is also a high likelihood of encountering remains relating to 19th century railways and modern military activity which are considered to be of low-local significance. The proximity of the Site to known heritage assets relating to pottery production from the medieval period lead to an increased likelihood in encountering similar remains which would be of at least high-local significance. From the HEC and historic OS maps evidence of agricultural activity from the medieval period to the early 20th century can be expected but would be of negligible significance. Although there are no known heritage assets from the prehistoric, Romano-British or Anglo-Saxon periods, such remains are difficult to predict or exclude, especially in areas with no previous ground disturbance. The possibility of disturbing remains relating to these periods is uncertain with the significance being recorded as unknown.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets within the Site is considered to be good due to a general lack of previous disturbance. The exception to this may be where 19th century and later mining and quarrying activities may have impacted on earlier remains, although the area of impact is small and the mining remains are considered to be heritage assets in their own right.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the Site was split between three fields with a small track/road running through the north-eastern section of the Site on the First Edition OS map. By the 1900s OS map with track within the Site has been removed. Little changes within the Site until the 1956 OS map when an additional field boundary has been added. By the 1960s OS maps the field boundaries within the Site appear to have all been removed.





There are two statutorily designated heritage assets within the Study Area, the Grade I Listed Church of St James, located approximately 170m west of the Site and the Grade II Listed South Anston Manor House (also recorded by the SMR), located approximately 240m west of the Site. Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the Site was contained within three fields bounded by a road to the south on the First Edition OS map. The Site remains relatively unchanged until the 1930s OS map when a new road is constructed along its northern boundary. By the 1940s OS map all the boundaries have been removed from the Site. A field boundary is added to the Site by the 1950s OS maps but is subsequently removed by the 1980s.

Post-1990 APs show the Site to be currently under grass.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

The proximity of the Site to known heritage assets leads to an increased likelihood of encountering remains from the prehistoric and Romano-British periods which would be of regional significance. 



Undated earthworks likely representing a rectilinear enclosure are recorded approximately 75m west and an enclosure and ditch are also recorded approximately 250m to the north.

The HEC records the present character of the Site as Enclosed Land: Agglomerated Fields 1967-2005 with an invisible historic character of Enclosed Land: Surveyed Enclosure (Parliamentary/Private) 1768-1966, Unenclosed Land: Commons and Greens 410-1767 and Enclosed Land: Prehistoric Field Systems -800-409. The Site is assigned to the Surveyed Enclosure character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the Site was split over four fields with a notation indicating it was part of 'North Anston Low Common'. Little changes on the Site until the 1930s OS map when a railway line is constructed along the eastern edge of the Site. By the late 1950s and early 1960s, one of the field boundaries has been removed with little changing throughout the rest of the 20th century.

Post-1990 APs show the Site to be mainly under grass and in use for farming with the south-eastern section having been covered in hard standing.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Due to the proximity of the Site to known heritage assets identified by cropmarks from aerial photographs there is an increased likelihood of encountering associated remains. However, due to the fact these features have not yet been confirmed through excavation the possibility of disturbing them is recorded as uncertain with the significance recorded as unknown. There is a high likelihood of encountering medieval to 19th century remains relating to agricultural activities which are considered to be of negligible significance.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets on this Site is considered to be good due to a general lack of disturbance.





There are six Grade II Listed Buildings recorded within the Study Area. These comprise the United Reform Church, approximately 75m north-west of the Site, Christ Church, approximately 100m west of the Site, 131-133 Melton High Street, approximately 200m east of the Site, Barn to the north of Nos 143 and 145, approximately 150m east of the Site, Highfield Farm, approximately 35m north of the Site and Beech House, approximately 50m north-west of the Site.

The SMR also records 131-133 Melton High Street as a post-medieval timber barn with some elements of the fabric likely dating to before 1700. Only one other feature is recorded by the SMR within the Study Area, the site of Old Hall farm, a timber-framed house demolished in 1980.

The Site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information was available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the Site.

The HEC records the present character of the Site as mainly Enclosed Land: Agglomerated Fields 1855-2003 with a fragmentary historic character of Enclosed Land: Piecemeal Enclosure 1066-1854. A small section of the Site is recorded as Commercial: Commercial: Core-Suburban 1900-2003 with a partial historic character of Residential: Vernacular Cottages 1066-1899. The Site is split between the Surveyed Enclosure and Nucleated Rural Settlements character zones. The HEC notes that some of the plots along Melton High Street are long and thin, suggesting an origin as crofting plots.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the Site was mainly contained within one field on the First Edition OS map with a small section within the eastern extent within the rear garden of a building fronting onto the High Street. By the 1890s OS map the Site contains part of a building and most of its garden within the north-east corner adjacent to the High Street. Little changes within the Site until the late 1960s to early 1970s when a small building is construction along the northern edge of the Site which has been removed by the late 1980s.

Post 1990 APs show the Site to have been subdivided with a long boundary separating the eastern extension from the rest of the Site.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Due to the location of the Site along the High Street and its proximity to areas exhibiting evidence of crofting, there is a medium to high likelihood of encountering medieval remains which would be of up to medium local significance. Although there are no known prehistoric, Romano-British or Anglo Saxon remains within the Site or the Study Area such remains are difficult to predict or exclude, especially in areas with no previous ground disturbance. The possibility of disturbing remains relating to these periods is uncertain with the significance being recorded as unknown. There is a high likelihood of encountering post-medieval to 19th century remains relating to agricultural activities which are considered to be of negligible significance.

Survival

The survival of heritage assets on this Site is considered to be good due to a lack of previous disturbance, although the presence of potential medieval remains may have disturbed those from earlier periods.





There are three designated heritage assets within the Study Area. The Grade II Listed Remains of the Chapel of St Mary Magdalene, the base of a cross and the Church of St Margaret all located immediately adjacent to the south-eastern edge of the Site. The Chapel of St Mary was built c.1200 and demolished in 1815 with the remains incorporated into the current church yard wall.

The SMR also records the Chapel and the cross. Within the broader landscape, a series of Iron Age/Romano-British enclosures and earthworks are recorded by the SMR approximately 320m north of the Site.

Archaeological investigations immediately to the north of the Site revealed a number of anomalies during a geophysical survey with subsequent trial trenching uncovering a ditch, bank and trackway of unknown date.

The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project records earthworks relating to post-medieval ridge and furrow approximately 220m south-east of the Site and a Second World War air raid shelter approximately 100m to the west of the Site. The HEC records the present character of the Site as being split between Institutional: Religions (Worship) 1817-2004 with a fragmentary historic character of Enclosed Land: Strip Fields 1066-1816 and Institutional: Cemetery 1930-2006 with a fragmentary historic character of Enclosed Land: Strio Fields 1540-1929 and Enclosed Land: Open Fields 1066-1539. The Site is split between the Nucleated Rural Settlement and Municipal Suburbs character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the Site lay within two fields on the First Edition OS map with a single boundary within the Site, which has been removed by the 1890 OS map. The 1900 OS map notes that the 'Roman Ridge' runs along the northern edge of the Site. Given the proximity of the Site to known heritage assets, both from the SMR and aerial photographs, there is a high likelihood of encountering similar remains which could be of up to regional significance. The Site is recorded in the HEC as being part of the land associated with the Church of St Margaret and a religious institute is recorded here from the 13th century. The proximity of the Site to known heritage assets from the medieval period leads to a high likelihood of encountering remains from this period which could be of up to high-local significance. Although there are no known heritage assets from the prehistoric or Anglo-Saxon periods, such remains are difficult to predict or exclude, especially in areas with no previous ground disturbance. The possibility of disturbing remains relating to these periods is uncertain with the significance being recorded as unknown. From the HEC and historic OS maps evidence of agricultural activity from the medieval period to the early 20th century can be expected but would be of negligible significance.

There are no statutorily designated heritage assets within the Site or the Study Area. Within the broader landscape, 500m, lie the Scheduled Deserted Medieval Settlement at Hellaby, and the Grade II* Listed Hellaby Hall, approximately 360m west of the Site.

The SMR records one findspot within the Study Area, a Roman coin found approximately 220m east of the Site. Within the broader landscape, 500m, the SMR records the medieval settlement at Hellaby in conjunction with other medieval features which include a well and a medieval house uncovered through excavations. In addition, an Iron Age/ Romano-British D-shaped enclosure has been identified through cropmarks from aerial photographs approximately 430m west of the Site.

The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project records the presence of a 20th century clay pit and earthworks relating to post-medieval ridge and furrow within the Site. Other ridge and furrow earthworks are noted within the Study Area approximately 160m south-east of the Site as well as a series of 20th century military structures. Within the broader landscape, 500m, the AP Mapping Project records the location of Iron Age/Romano-British enclosures approximately 300m west of the Site in association with other undated earthworks.

The HEC records the present character of the Site as Extractive: Clay Pits/Brickworks 1948-2005 with an invisible historic character of Enclosed Land: Strip Fields 1540-1947 and Enclosed Land: Open Fields 1066-1539. The Site is assigned to the Post Industrial character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the Site to be split over numerous fields on the First Edition OS map. By the 1890s OS map several of the field boundaries within the Site have been removed, a process which continues into the early 20th century. By the 1930s OS map further field boundaries have been removed and a brickworks having been built, with a large area of extraction adjacent to it. A railway line has also been constructed along the western edge of the Site and a small complex of buildings, including a large circular one, has also been constructed adjacent to the railway line. By the 1940s OS map further field boundaries have been removed with the extraction pit extended. By the late 1950s and early 1960s the extraction pit has extended further to now cover most of the northern and north-western sections of the Site with the brickworks buildings seemingly extended or replaced. The complex of buildings has reduced to two and is noted as a 'Depot'. By the late 1960s the brickworks building has been extended, as has the extraction pit. The depot is now noted as an 'Engineering Works'. By the 1980s, the railway line is noted as having been dismantled. Little changes throughout the rest of the 20th century.

Post-1990 APs show the Site to be scarred by the extraction process associated with the former brickworks with only relatively small areas within the northern and southern sections of the Site remaining under grass. A building with a carpark has been constructed next to the Engineering Works.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

There is a high likelihood of encountering remains from the 19th and 20th century brickworks and railway line which are considered to be of low-local significance. Due to the Site's proximity to known heritage assets from the medieval period and through earthworks identified during the AP Mapping Project, there is medium to high likelihood of encountering remains from this period, which may be of up to low-local significance. Due to the proximity of the Site to known heritage assets identified by cropmarks from aerial photographs dating to the Iron Age/Romano-British period, there is an increased likelihood of encountering associated remains. However, due to the fact these features have not yet been confirmed through excavation the possibility of disturbing them is recorded as uncertain with the significance recorded as unknown. Although there are no known remains from the Anglo-Saxon period, such remains are difficult to predict or exclude, especially in areas with no previous ground disturbance. The possibility of disturbing remains relating to these periods is uncertain with the significance being recorded as unknown.

Survivial

The likely survival of heritage assets on this Site is mixed. Within the areas used for clay extraction, survival is considered to be poor. In areas outside of the extraction pit and where 20th century buildings have been constructed survival is considered to be good. The survival of the remains of buildings associated with brickworks is unknown and is dependent on the construction methods used when the buildings were replaced in the 20th century.





There are eleven statutorily designated heritage assets within the Study Area. These include the Grade I Listed Church of All Saints, a church with 12th century origins, mainly of 14th century construction located approximately 150m west of the Site. The Grade II* Listed Aughton Court, an 18th century country house formerly known as Aston Hall, located approximately 50m west of the Site. The remaining designated assets are Grade II Listed Buildings, many of which are associated with Aughton Court.

The SMR also records the Church of All Saints and Aston Hall. No undesignated heritage assets are recorded.

The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project records the presence of medieval banks and medieval to post-medieval ridge and furrow earthworks and cropmarks within the Site with and an area of post-medieval ridge and furrow immediately adjacent to the western edge.

The HEC records the present character of the Site as Ornamental, Parkland and Recreational: Public Park 1948-2003 with an invisible historic character of Ornamental, Parkland and Recreational: Private Parkland 1752-1947 and Unenclosed Land: Commons and Greens 1066-1751. The Site is assigned to the Private Parkland character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the Site was used as a private park associated with Aston Hall. A summer house is noted on the Site's western edge. A small section of the south-eastern edge of the Site is within an enclosed field. The Site is noted as 'Aston Park' on the 1890s OS map. The Site remains relatively unchanged throughout the 20th century with only the addition and removal of trees noticeable. By the 1990s a road has been constructed along the eastern edge.

Post-1990 APs show the Site to be mainly under grass with some trees, including a large area within the south-east corner.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Due to the presence of heritage assets identified during the AP mapping project, there is a high likelihood of encountering remains relating to medieval to post-medieval landscaping within the former park, which could be of up to regional significance. There is also potential for evidence of medieval to post-medieval agricultural activity, which are considered to be of negligible significance. Although there are no known heritage assets from the prehistoric, Romano-British or Anglo-Saxon periods, such remains are difficult to predict or exclude, especially in areas with no previous ground disturbance. The possibility of disturbing remains relating to these periods is uncertain with the significance being recorded as unknown.

Survival

The survival of heritage assets on this Site is considered to be good due to a lack of previous disturbance.



There is one statutorily designated heritage asset within the Study Area, the Grade II Listed Bramley Grange Farmhouse, a 16th century farmhouse formerly the site of a grange to Roche Abbey, approximately 220m south of the Site.

The SMR records four undesignated heritage assets within the Study Area all clustered around Bramley Grange Farmhouse. These include the possible site of a medieval monastic grange, the current farmhouse and a possible moat around it, a medieval fishpond and a findspot of a medieval lead token.

The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project records numerous cropmarks relating to Iron Age/Romano-British enclosures within the Study Area to the east and south-east of the Site and areas of post-medieval ridge and furrow to the west and south-west of the Site

The HEC records the present character of the majority of the Site as Enclosed Land: Agglomerated Fields 1938-2005 with a fragmentary historic character of Enclosed Land: Strip Fields 1540-1937 and Enclosed Land: Open Fields 1066-1539 with the small northern extension recorded as Enclosed Land: Surveyed Enclosure (Parliamentary/Private) 1770-2005 with a partial historic character of Unenclosed Land: Commons and Greens 1066-1769. The Site is split between the Agglomerated Enclosure and Surveyed Enclosure character zones.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the Site was split between numerous long rectangular fields on the First Edition OS map with Hellaby Brook running along the northern edge. Little changes within the Site until the 1930s OS map when a small building is constructed within the northern extension of the Site which has been removed by the 1940s OS map. The Site remains largely unaltered throughout the 20th century aside from the removal of field boundaries.

Post-1990 APs show the Site to have had almost all of its field boundaries removed and a farm complex constructed within the south-eastern corner. Within the northern extension several small buildings have also been constructed.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Due to the proximity of the Site to heritage assets of probable Iron Age/Romano-British period there is a potential for encountering similar remains which could be up to regional significance. Although there are no known heritage assets from the prehistoric or Anglo-Saxon periods, such remains are difficult to predict or exclude, especially in areas with no previous ground disturbance. The possibility of disturbing remains relating to these periods is uncertain with the significance being recorded as unknown. From known heritage assets identified from aerial photographs, the HEC and historic OS maps evidence of agricultural activity from the medieval period to the early 20th century can be expected but would be of negligible significance.

Survival

The survival of heritage assets on this Site is considered to be good due to a lack of previous disturbance aside from the area which is now occupied by the farm complex where survival is considered to be moderate.





There is one statutorily designated heritage asset within the Study Area, the Grade II Listed early 19th century Dog Kennels Bridge approximately 20m north of the north-east corner of the Site.

The SMR records three features within the Study Area, the Chesterfield Canal running along the northern edge of the Site, the purported route of a Roman road adjacent to the north-western corner of the Site and the site of a post-medieval lime kiln approximately 200m north of the Site. Within the broader landscape, 500m, the SMR records the location of an additional lime kiln and a possible Palaeolithic cave site to the north of the Site.

The Site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information was available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the Site.

The HEC records the present character of the Site as Industrial: Metal Trades (Heavy) 1967-2005 with an invisible historic character of Enclosed Land: Strip Fields 1540-1966 and Enclosed Land: 1066-1539. The Site is assigned to the Industrial character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the Site was split between eight fields on the First Edition OS map. By the 1900s OS map some field boundaries shave been removed leaving six fields. The map also indicates some landscaping work has been carried out along the northern edge of the Site, although this may be an initial notation of banks adjacent to the canal. The map also suggests a small building has been constructed within the north-eastern corner. The 1930s OS map indicates a U-shaped building, and smaller ancillary building, have been constructed within the eastern section of the Site. By the 1956 OS map a large Wire Works has been built in the centre of the Site. the buildings within the north-eastern corner have been extended and added to whilst a filter bed and settling tank have been built in the northern section of the Site. By the 1974 OS map the works buildings have been extended and added to and are labeled as a 'Steel Rolling Mill'. Additional building and tanks have also been constructed. By the 1980s a long building has been added to the works complex.

Post-1990 APs show the Site to still be occupied by the works complex with some additional buildings having been added. Areas not occupied by buildings are under hard standing. The south-west section of the Site is under grass and appears to have remained undisturbed.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Due to the proximity of the Site to known heritage assets there is an increased likelihood of encountering remains from the Romano-British period of regional significance. From the HEC and historic OS maps evidence of agricultural activity from the medieval period to the early 20th century can be expected but would be of negligible significance. Although there are no known heritage assets from the prehistoric or Anglo-Saxon periods within the Study Area, such remains are difficult to predict or exclude, especially in areas with no previous ground disturbance. The possibility of disturbing remains relating to these periods is uncertain with the significance being recorded as unknown.

Survival

The likely survivial of heritage assets within the works complex is considered to be poor with survival in the south-western section considered to be good due to a general lack of disturbance.





There is one statutorily designated heritage asset within the Study Area, the Grade II Listed Manor Farmhouse, located approximately 240m south of the Site. Within the broader landscape, 500m, lies the Scheduled Monument and Grade II* Listed Glass Cone built in c. 1740.

There are no undesignated heritage assets recorded within the Study Area. Within the broader landscape, 500m, the SMR records the route of a Roman Road, approximately 380m south of the Site and the location of the Glass Cone.

The Site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information was available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the Site.

The HEC records the present character of the Site as Enclosed Land: Valley Floor Meadows 1066-2003. The Site is assigned to the Wetland Enclosure character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the Site was split over five fields with the route of a railway line and its embankment along its eastern edge, on the First Edition OS map. Little changes within the Site until the late 1960s when the M1 motorway is constructed along its northern edge causing several of the field boundaries within the Site to be removed. By the 1981 OS map another roadway has been constructed along the southern edge of the Site with only one field boundary remaining.

Post-1990 APs show the Site to be currently under grass with the field boundary still in place.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Although there are no known heritage assets from the prehistoric, Romano-British or Anglo-Saxon periods, such remains are difficult to predict or exclude, especially in areas with no previous ground disturbance. The possibility of disturbing remains relating to these periods is uncertain with the significance being recorded as unknown. From known heritage assets identified through the HEC and historic OS maps evidence of agricultural activity from the medieval period to the early 20th century can be expected but would be of negligible significance.



There are two statutorily designated heritage assets recorded within the Study Area. The Grade II Listed Nos 41 and 43 and attached outbuildings, a farmhouse with a late 15th to early 16th century core, is located immediately to the south of the Site. The Grade II Listed Monks Smithy House, also known as Kirkstead Abbey Grange, a 16th or 17th century farmhouse which reused a variety of medieval material in its construction is located approximately 120m south of the Site.

The SMR records the presence of a number of landscape features recorded during a walkover survey, approximately 250m north of the Site, that suggest the presence of a late prehistoric field system which included a bank, ditch and a number of lynchets. Other features within the Study Area include Nether Fold Farm, thought to have medieval origins and consists of a small rectangle of buildings, cottages and barns located immediately south of the Site within the area of the Grade II Listed farmbuildings. Also recorded are a series of bell pits around the area of Kirkstead Abbey Grange.

The Site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information was available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the Site.

The HEC records the present character of the Site as Enclosed Land: Agglomerated Fields 1967-2005 with a partial historic character of Enclosed Land: Strip Fields 1540-1966 and Enclosed Land: Open Fields 1066-1539. The Site is assigned to the Agglomerated Enclosure character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the Site comprised numerous fields in a strip configuration on the First Edition OS map. A sandstone quarry and gravel pit are noted along the northern edge of the Site but it is unclear as to whether they encroach into it. By the 1900s OS map several of the field boundaries have been removed with evidence of spoil heaps within the western section of the Site and on its northern edge. By the 1940s OS map one of the spoil heaps is noted as an 'Air Shaft', while elsewhere in the Site, further field boundaries have been removed. By the 1957 OS map the Site has been further subdivided through introduction of additional field boundaries. The 1980s to 1990s OS maps indicate the removal of further field boundaries, including those introduced in the 1950s.

Post-1990 APs show the Site to comprise several large fields with some of the original field boundaries still remaining. A large complex associated with Nether Fold Farm have been constructed within the south-western corner of the Site.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Due to the proximity of the Šite to heritage assets recorded as being of prehistoric date there may be an increased potential of encountering remains from this period, which would be of regional signifinance. The dating of these earthworks have yet to be confirmed, however. Due to the proximity of the Site to known heritage assets from the medieval to post-medieval periods there is a high likelihood of encountering remains relating to agricultural activity which is considered to be of negligible significance and an increased likelihood of encountering residual settlement evidence considered to be of low-local significance.

Survival

The survival of heritage assets on this Site is considered to be good due to a lack of previous disturbance aside from the area where farm buildings were constructed in the late 20th or early 21st century where survival is considered to be unknown but likely moderate to poor depending on construction methods.





There are four statutorily designated heritage assets within the Study Area, all of which are Grade II Listed Buildings. The Church of the Holy Trinity and its War Memorial approximately 75m to the west of the Site, Monk's Smithy House which formed part of a monastic grange from the medieval period, approximately 160m south of the Site and Nos 41 and 43 located approximately 120m south of the Site.

The SMR records two undesignated heritage assets within the Site. A number of landscape features which are suggestive of late prehistoric land division recorded during a fieldwalking survey. Also recorded within the Site are a series of post-medieval bell pits which are recorded as shafts and ironstone shafts in 1801. Within the Study Area, further bell pits are recorded approximately 250m south of the Site as is Nether Fold Farm, thought to have medieval origins, approximately 120m south-east of the Site. The location of a building is noted approximately 230m east of the Site, although the SMR notes this may be the result of confusion with Scholes in West Yorkshire.

The Site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information was available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the Site.

The HEC records the present character of the Site as mainly Enclosed Land: Agglomerated Fields 1967-2005 with a partial historic character of Enclosed Land: Strip Fields 1540-1966 and Enclosed Land: Open Fields 1066-1539. Two smaller character areas within the Site comprise Enclosed Land: Surveyed Enclosure (Parliamentary/Private) 1891-2005 with a fragmentary historic character of Woodland: Ancient Woodland 1066-1890 and Residential: Planned Estate (Social Housing) 1938-2003 with an invisible historic character of Enclosed Land: Surveyed Enclosure (Parliamentary/Private) 1800-1937 and Unenclosed Land: Commons and Greens 1066-1799. The Site is split between the Agglomerated Enclosure and Early to Mid-20th Century Private Suburbs character zones.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the Site was split over numerous fields and contained a large area of woodland noted as 'Oaken Greave Wood' on the First Edition OS map. Also noted are the presence of several 'Ironstone Shafts' and 'Old Ironstone Shafts' within the south-western section of the Site. Along the southern edge of the Site a 'Sandstone Quarry' and 'Gravel Pit' are labelled. By the 1890s OS map the area of the wood has decreased dramatically with several field boundaries within the Site also removed. The workings along the southern edge of the Site are labelled as 'Scholes Old Colliery' with a reservoir also shown in the vicinity. By the 1900s OS map several buildings around the area of 'Scholes Old Colliery' are visible, as are notations of 'Shafts'. Within the northern section of the Site a number of buildings have also been constructed with a 'Shaft' noted in the area. By the 1920s OS map the number of buildings within the north of the Site has been extended and is now labelled as 'Smith Wood Colliery' which includes the 'Thorpe Pumping Station'. Elsewhere within the Site several field boundaries have been removed with Oaken Greave Wood having shrunk in size due to the construction of a sewage works. By the 1930s OS map a building noted as 'Baths' has been constructed within the northern section. Little changes within the Site, aside from the removal of field boundaries, until the 1970s to early 1980s when the sewage works is noted as 'disused'.

Post-1990 APs show the Site to comprise large agricultural fields with the buildings within the northern section and the sewage treatment works having been removed. Only a small section of Oaken Greave Wood remains.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Due to the proximity of the Site to known heritage assets thought to date from the prehistoric period there is a high likelihood of encountering remains from this period which would of at least regional significance. Due to evidence gathered from historic maps there is a high likelihood of encountering 19th century remains relating to mining and quarrying activities which are considered to be of low-local value. There is also a high likelihood of encountering mining and quarrying remains from the post-medieval period which are considered to be of medium-local value. Although there are no known heritage assets from the Romano-British or Anglo-Saxon periods, such remains are difficult to predict or exclude, especially in areas with no previous ground disturbance. The possibility of disturbing remains relating to these periods is uncertain with the significance being recorded as unknown. From the HEC and historic OS maps evidence of agricultural activity from the medieval period to the early 20th century can be expected but would be of negligible significance.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets on this Site is considered to be good due to a general lack of previous disturbance. The exception to this may be where 19th century and later mining and quarrying activities may have impacted on earlier remains, although the area of impact is small and the mining remains are considered to be heritage assets in their own right.





There is one statutorily designated heritage asset within the Study Area, the Grade II Listed end sections of two outbuildings located approximately 240m south-east of the Site. Within the broader landscape, 500m, lies the Scheduled Manor House moated site approximately 360m north-east of the Site and the Grade II* Listed Church of St Peter and St Paul approximately 290m north-east of the Site.



There is one statutorily designated heritage asset within the Study Area, the Grade II Listed Anston Bridge which was built in the 18th century, approximately 70m west of the Site. Within the broader landscape, the Grade II Listed Todwick Old Hall lies approximately 320m south of the western edge of the Site.

The SMR does not record any undesignated heritage assets within the Site or the Study Area. Within the broader landscape, 500m, the SMR records six undesignated heritage assets dating to the medieval period within North Anston, including the sites of two medieval timber-framed houses, approximately 400m east of the western edge of the Site.

The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project records earthworks relating to extensive areas of medieval to post-medieval ridge and furrow and a rectilinear enclosure and ditch of uncertain date.

The HEC records the present character of the Site as Enclosed Land: Agglomerated Fields 1967-2005 with a fragmentary historic character split between Enclosed Lands: Strip Fields 1540-1966 and Enclosed Land: Open Fields 1066-1539, and Enclosed Land: Surveyed Enclosure (Parliamentary/Private) 1768-1966, Unenclosed Land: Commons and Greens 410-1767 and Enclosed Land: Prehistoric Field Systems -800-409. The Site is split between the Agglomerated Enclosure and the Surveyed Enclosure character zones.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the Site comprised numerous fields with 'Anston Brick Yard' along the northern edge, on the First Edition OS map. By the 1890s OS map, the brick works has expanded with some of the field boundaries having been removed, a process which continues throughout the 19th and 20th centuries. Little changes within the Site until the 1930s OS map when a railway line is constructed along, and through a section of, the eastern edge of the Site with a bridge over the line encroaching into the Site. If both trace their origin to the 19th century their significance is considered to be low-local, if the brickworks is demonstrated to be post-medieval in origin it is considered to be of medium-local significance. 



The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project records earthworks relating to post-medieval ridge and furrow within the Site as well as in the Study Area to the north and the west. 



There are no statutorily designated heritage assets within the Site or the Study Area

The SMR records five undesignated heritage assets within the Study Area, four of which date to the Iron Age/Romano-British period. These include two Roman coins, one located approximately 110m east of the Site with the other located approximately 190m west of the Site, and a Roman brooch located approximately 180m north of the Site. An Iron Age or Romano-British field system, approximately 200m east of the Site, was initially identified from aerial photographs and confirmed through geophysical survey, trial trenching and excavation. These investigations also revealed five kilns, assumed to be for the processing of lime and dated to the late medieval to early post-medieval period. The only other feature within the Study Area comprises ridge and furrow identified through geophysical survey approximately 200m east of the Site. Within the broader landscape, 500m, a further Iron Age or Romano-British field system has been identified as cropmarks on aerial photographs approximately 260m south-east of the Site.

The SMR also records an archaeological evaluation approximately 170m north-east of the Site which revealed a number of ditches forming a premedieval field system.

The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project records a linear cropmark thought to represent an Iron Age/Romano-British ditch within the Site in addition to several other cropmarks indicative of field boundaries of the same period located approximately 200m east of the Site. Other cropmarks relating to post-medieval ridge and furrow agriculture are located immediately adjacent to the western edge of the Site and a further 160m to the west.

The HEC records the present character of the Site as Enclosed Land: Agglomerated Fields 1950-2003 with an invisible historic character of Enclosed Land: Surveyed Enclosure (Parliamentary/Private) 1770-1949 and Unenclosed Land: Commons and Greens 1066-1769. The Site is assigned to the Surveyed Enclosure character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the Site was contained within two fields with a single field boundary running in a north-south alignment through the middle on the First Edition OS map. The Site remains relatively unchanged throughout the 19th and 20th centuries with a housing estate constructed to the north of the Site in the 1970s and 1980s.

Post-1990 APs show the Site to be two fields currently used for agricultural purposes. The field boundary within the Site appears to have been reduced in length and does not meet the surrounding boundaries at ether the northern or southern ends.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Due to the proximity of the Site to known heritage assets and those identified through the AP Mapping Project there is an increased likelihood of encountering remains from the Iron Age/ Romano-British periods which would be of at least regional significance. A linear cropmark feature is recorded in the Site which is also presumed to be of Iron Age /Romano-British date, however a date for this feature has yet to be confirmed so its significance is recorded as unknown. Although there are no known heritage assets from the Anglo-Saxon period, such remains are difficult to predict or exclude, especially in areas with no previous ground disturbance. The possibility of disturbing remains relating to these periods is uncertain with the significance being recorded as unknown. From known heritage assets identified through aerial photography, the HEC and historic OS maps evidence of agricultural activity from the medieval period to the early 20th century can be expected but would be of negligible significance.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets on this Site is considered to be good due to a general lack of previous disturbance.





There are no statutorily designated or undesignated heritage assets within the Site or the Study Area

Within the broader landscape, 500m, the SMR records the location of a medieval moat and pottery finds approximately 350m south-west of the Site.

The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project records earthworks relating to post-medieval ridge and furrow within the Site with earthworks relating to a 20th century spoil heap/pond located immediately adjacent to the north-eastern edge of the Site.

The HEC records the present character of the Site as Enclosed Land: Surveyed Enclosure (Parliamentary/Private) 1781-2004 with an invisible historic character of Unenclosed Land: Commons and Greens 1066-1780. The Site is assigned to the Surveyed Enclosure character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the Site was split between four fields with a railway line along its south-eastern edge on the First Edition OS map. Little changes within the Site until the 1930s OS map when one of the field boundaries is removed leaving only three fields. By the 1958 OS map, two ponds are noted as lying long the south eastern edge of the Site, adjacent to the railway. The Site remains relatively unchanged throughout the rest of the 20th century.

Post-1990 APs show the Site to be contained within one field with the majority used for agricultural purposes with approximately a fifth of the south-eastern section of the Site under tree cover one of the ponds still present.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Although there are no known heritage assets from the prehistoric, Romano-British or Anglo-Saxon periods, such remains are difficult to predict or exclude, especially in areas with no previous ground disturbance. The possibility of disturbing remains relating to these periods is uncertain with the significance being recorded as unknown. 



There are no statutorily designated heritage assets within the Site or the Study Area.

The SMR records two undesignated heritage assets within the Study Area. The site of medieval moat and pottery finds is located approximately 50m south of the Site. The site of Meadow Pottery Works, potentially the site of an earlier brick works, is located approximately 100m north-west of the western edge of the Site, and was founded in 1835 but had closed by 1904.

The SMR records an archaeological evaluation immediately adjacent to the western edge of the Site which revealed the presence of at least one building, constructed of fire bricks, two kilns and brick floor surfaces likely linked to the Meadow Pottery Works.

The Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project records earthworks relating to a medieval/post-medieval moat, approximately 50m south of the Site, post-medieval ridge and furrow immediately to the north of the Site and 20th century spoil heap approximately 70m north-east of the eastern edge of the Site.

The HEC records the present character of the Site as being split between Enclosed Land: Surveyed Enclosure (Parliamentary/Private) 1781-2004 with an invisible historic character of Unenclosed Land: Commons and Greens 1066-1780; Industrial: Metal Trades (Heavy) 1953-2005 with an invisible historic character of Enclosed Land: Strip Fields 1540-1952 and Enclosed Land: Open Fields 1066-1539; and Ornamental, Parkland and Recreational: Golf Course 1983-2005 with a fragmentary historic character of Enclosed Land: Agglomerated Fields 1930-1982, Enclosed Land: Piecemeal Enclosure 1540-1929 and Enclosed Land 1066-1539. The Site is split between the Surveyed Enclosure, Industrial and Sub-Rural Fringe character zones.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the Site comprised nine fields with the buildings of 'Roundwood Farm' within it on the First Edition OS map. Little changes within the Site until the 1900s OS map where several of the field boundaries have been removed, leaving seven fields, and a 'Sewage Works' has been constructed within the northern section of the Site. By the 1920s OS map the 'Sewage Works' has been expanded. By the 1930s OS map the 'Sewage Works' has been expanded further and now encompasses the majority of the northern section of the Site. Elsewhere, further field boundaries have been removed, a process which continues into the late 1950s. At this time the 'Sewage Works' has also been expanded. Little changes within the Site throughout the rest of the 20th century.

Post-1990 APs show the Site to be mainly under grass with patches of trees and the 'Sewage Works' has been removed.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Due to the proximity of the Site to known heritage assets from the 19th century related to pottery production, there is a high likelihood of encountering similar remains which are considered to be of low-local significance. If these remains are found to relate to an earlier phase of brickworks dating to the post-medieval period or early-19th century, these are considered to be of medium-local significance. The buildings associated with 'Roundwood Farm' are still present on the Site and are considered to be of low-local significance. Due to the evidence from historic OS maps there is a high likelihood of encountering modern remains relating to the former sewage treatment works which are considered to be of no significance. Due the proximity of the Site to known heritage assets from the medieval period, there is a medium likelihood of encountering similar remains which are considered to be of medium-local value. Although there are no known heritage assets from the prehistoric, Romano-British or Anglo-Saxon periods, such remains are difficult to predict or exclude, especially in areas with no previous ground disturbance. The possibility of disturbing remains relating to these periods is uncertain with the significance being recorded as unknown. From known heritage assets identified through aerial photography, the HEC and historic OS maps evidence of agricultural activity from the medieval period to the early 20th century can be expected but would be of negligible significance.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets on this Site is considered to be good due to a general lack of previous disturbance except in the area around the Sewage Works where survival is considered to be poor.

Note

Due to the presence of the sewage works and the potential for ground contamination, no archaeological work is recommended in this area of the Site.





There are no statutorily designated heritage assets within the Site or the Study Area.





The HEC records the present character of the Site as Enclosed Land: Agglomerated Fields 1950-2003 with a fragmentary historic character of Enclosed Land: Strip Fields 1540-1949 and Enclosed Land: Open Fields 1066-1539. The Site is assigned to the Agglomerated Enclosure character zone.

Comparison of historic OS maps indicates the Site was primarily comprised of two fields with a very small section within a third field on the First Edition OS map. Little changes within the Site until the 1940s OS map when a trackway has been constructed, likely to serve the anti-aircraft emplacement. The anti-aircraft batteries are shown on the 1950s OS map, however they are absent on the 1970 OS map. By the 1970s, the motorway has been constructed along the western edge of the Site and all of the field boundaries have been removed leaving a single field. Little changes within the Site for the remainder of the 20th century.

Post-1990 APs show the Site to comprise one field currently used for agricultural purposes.

Known and Potential Heritage Assets

Due to the proximity of the Site to known heritage assets and assets identified through the AP Mapping Project, there is a high likelihood of encountering remains from the Iron Age/Romano-British period and mid-20th century which may be of up to regional significance. Although there are no known heritage assets from other prehistoric periods or the Anglo-Saxon period, such remains are difficult to predict or exclude, especially in areas with no previous ground disturbance. The possibility of disturbing remains relating to these periods is uncertain with the significance being recorded as unknown. From known heritage assets identified through aerial photography, the HEC and historic OS maps evidence of agricultural activity from the medieval period to the early 20th century can be expected but would be of negligible significance.

Survival

The likely survival of heritage assets on this Site is considered to be good due to a general lack of previous disturbance.

The Site was not included in the Magnesian Limestone in South and West Yorkshire AP Mapping Project, so no information was available on the extent of any cropmark features in or adjoining the Site.

The HEC records the present character of the Site as Enclosed Land: Agglomerated Fields 1973-2005 with a fragmentary historic character of Enclosed Land: Strip Fields 1540-1972 and Enclosed Land: Open Fields 1066-1539. The Site is assigned to the Agglomerated Enclosure character zone.







There is one statutorily designated heritage asset within the Study Area, the Blue Man's Bower moated site, located approximately 70m south of the Site. The moated site was excavated in 1939 which failed to locate any definite remains of structures or dating evidence.
