Entries to be received on or before Friday 31st August, 2018.

**Staging Times: 12 noon to 10pm, Friday, 7th September 2018 and
7.30am to 8.30am, Saturday, 8th September, 2018.**

Judging:

All exhibits must be completed by 8.30am on the Saturday ready for judging at 9am. Competitors' cards must be placed face downwards and remain in this position until after judging.

All Floral Art Classes will be judged in accordance with the NAFAS Competitions Manual 3rd Edition (2015) by NAFAS qualified judges.

- No artificial plant material allowed.
- Plant material to predominate over everything else, unless otherwise stated.
- Any drapes must be free standing. No drapes to extend over front of staging.
- All exhibits must be the unaided work of the competitor and must be assembled in the marquee unless otherwise stated.

Staging:

Except where stated the space allowed for each exhibit is width 2' 6", depth 2', height 3'. The stage covering will be tops covered in white with backing and skirting of magnolia.

Staging as well as quality will be considered in awarding points.

(Twenty kinds of vegetables will be taken into consideration for points and these must be indicated on the pointing sheet. An exhibitor may stage other vegetables, flowers and fruit and these will only be considered by the Judges in assessing the additional 70 points which are awarded for display only).

£35 will be awarded to any Society which enters but does not win first place or runner up.

(Class 87 will be judged in accordance with the suggested pointing and assessment of Merit referred to in the "Judging of Vegetables" as set out in the R.H.S. Horticultural Show Handbook and prospective exhibitors may obtain a copy of the pointing sheet from Leisure & Green Spaces Admin Team, Clifton Park Garden Building, Clifton Park, Clifton Lane, Rotherham. S65 2AA

The display must be the joint effort of at least four Society members – the full names and addresses of whom must be shown on the entry form and must be completed by the Society Secretary. Only one entry from the same four society members will be permitted.

No Society names to be displayed on the entries or pointing sheet until after judging is completed.

ONLY FOUR SOCIETY MEMBERS MAY ENTER THIS CLASS FROM EACH ALLOTMENT SITE.

Rotherham Show

Regulations

1. All exhibitors must complete the Entry Form in ink and return it to **Leisure and Green Spaces Admin Team, Clifton Park Garden House, Clifton Park, Clifton Lane, Rotherham, S65 2AA** on or before Wednesday, 5th September, 2018. Although further entries can be accepted at the Garden House Reception on Friday 7th September, 2018, it would be appreciated if the majority of entries are made prior to Wednesday 5th September, 2018, to assist in the layout and setting up of the Show.
Entries made on Friday 7th September will be charged at an extra 15p fee per entry.
2. **The closing date for entries in Floral Art and Tom Heath Display of Vegetables (Class 87) will be Friday, 31st August, 2018.**
3. **A maximum of 2 entries per exhibitor is allowed in each class except in classes 8, 29, 30, and 87 where only 1 entry is allowed.**
4. The Marquees will be open for the staging of exhibits from **12 noon to 10pm** on the Friday and all entries for exhibition must be in the marquees by 8.30am on the morning of the opening day but, in the interest of exhibitors, and for the convenience of the Show Organisers, it is hoped that all entries, will be staged on the Friday. Stewards will be provided throughout both days of the Show.

The marquees will be cleared in readiness for judging by 8.30am on the morning of the opening day of the Show by which time all exhibitors and their assistants must leave the marquees. Marquees will be open to the public at 12 noon on the Saturday and 10am on the Sunday.
5. **No exhibit may be removed before 5.45pm on the last evening of the Show. The Competitive Marquees will be completely cleared of people by 5.30pm – Only exhibitors in possession of a pass will then be allowed into the marquees from 5.45pm to collect their exhibits.** Any vegetables or cut flowers not collected by 6.15pm will be put in an auction to members of the public. All monies raised from the auctioning of produce will be donated to The Rotherham & District Allotments Association.
6. On receipt of entry forms, exhibit cards will need to be collected from **Leisure and Green Spaces Admin Team, Clifton Park Garden House, Clifton Park, Clifton Lane, Rotherham, S65 2AA**. Exhibitors will be responsible for the proper placing of these cards (face down) on their exhibit(s) and should satisfy themselves that the cards correctly describe the exhibit.
7. All grown exhibits for prizes must have been grown by the exhibitor for at least two months before the date of the Show, unless a distinct exception is made in the condition published in the schedule under which any particular prize is to be awarded.

8. Please note that the classes contained in the schedule are only open to amateurs with the exception of the 'Open' Class in the Floral Art section. An amateur is a person who does not, and never has, practiced as a nursery person, seedsperson, florist or professional gardener and one who does not earn their livelihood at gardening.
9. Objection to any exhibit must be lodged in writing with the Show Officials before 4pm on Saturday, 8th September, 2018, with a deposit of £5. If the objection is upheld the deposit will be returned. An official receipt will be given for the deposit.
10. Exhibitors having an objection upheld against them will be disqualified from the Show.
11. The decision of the Judges is final in all classes and they will be empowered to withhold any prize in any class if the entry does not warrant it.

PLEASE NOTE:

12. **Prize money will be paid out from Clifton Park Garden House Reception on Sunday 9th September from 12 noon to 6pm. Money will then be paid out from Clifton Park Garden House Reception from Monday 10th to Friday 14th September. Any prize money that has not been collected by 5pm on Friday 14th September 2018 will be forfeited.**
13. Any other items not included in these Regulations will be dealt with by the Horticultural Officer whose decision will be final.

14. Disclaimer of Liability

In this clause the term Exhibitor shall include persons taking part in any competition or display arranged by the Show Organisers, and the owner of any animal, plant, machinery or other thing involved in any such competition or display or otherwise exhibited on the Showground. Save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the Show Organisers, its servants or agents, the Show Organisers will not be responsible for death, injury, disease, damage or loss caused to any exhibitor or to his or her servant or agent or to any animal, article, plant, machinery or thing of whatever nature brought on to the Showground by the said exhibitor from whatever cause death, injury, disease, damage or loss arises.

(Save as aforesaid) the exhibitor shall indemnify the Show Organisers against all claims, damages and expenses whatsoever in any way arising out of the presence of the exhibitor, his servants, agents, exhibits, vehicles or equipment on the Showground and shall assume full responsibility therefore.

Acceptance of the foregoing provisions shall be a condition of entry.

Exhibitors are advised to insure against fire, theft and other appropriate risk not only as regards their own property but also against any third party claim.

15. Security

Professional night security will patrol the park over the weekend period.

Stewards will be provided throughout the Horticultural Marquees during both days.

There will be no admission to the Competitive Marquees during the judging on Saturday, 8th September, 2018, between 8.30am to 12 noon and no public admission after 5.30pm on Sunday, 9th September, 2018.
