Any person making a claim will be required to produce proof of identity and address. They must also produce a valid certificate of motor insurance, also containing the correct name and address.

The Authority may be of the opinion that it is necessary to retain the seized property for the duration of an investigation or criminal proceedings.

A seizure authority may sell, destroy or otherwise dispose of seized property where a seizure notice has been published and—

(a) the claim period has ended and no claim was made; .

(b) a claim was made within the claim period but the seizure authority did not determine that the claimant was entitled; or .

(c) a duty to return arose but has ceased.

A copy of this notice has been served on the local chief officer of police, and in the case of a vehicle, the registered keeper and any other person identified as entitled to possession. This notice has also been published on the seizure authority's website.
