Death and The Kings Horseman

(Utopia Theatre)

A play by Wole Soyinka based on a real incident that took place in Nigeria during British colonial rule: the horseman of a Yoruba King was prevented from committing ritual suicide by the colonial authorities. In addition to the British intervention, Soyinka calls the horseman's own conviction toward suicide into question, posing a problem that throws off the community's balance. The play is celebratory and demonstrates the need for interaction between African and European cultures.
