Are you an avid reader?

Unable to get to your local library? Well, Rotherham Libraries can help!

Rotherham Libraries deliver books and talking book CDs to all areas of the borough to anyone who is unable to access a library due to health, caring or disability issues and has no one who can go to the library on their behalf.



Library staff will find out what kind of books you like, will then pick books or talking book CDs from library stock, and deliver them free of charge, straight to your door.

Deliveries are on a monthly basis and you are able to borrow up to 20 items at a time, so don't worry if you haven't finished them all after 4 weeks, as you can have the same items for 8 weeks.

Rotherham Libraries have stocks of fiction, non-fiction, large print books and talking book CDs and you can request stock held by any library in the borough.

Grimm & Co

The events of last year have not stopped Grimm & Co from championing the writer in every child. They have continued to deliver workshops to children and young people and have offered a wide variety of programmes online. Switching over to a digital platform can bring with it a number of challenges, but Grimm & Co has produced over thirty free workshops since lockdown and these can still be accessed via the website: (www.grimmandco.co.uk/activities).

The focus of these activities explore the use of the imagination as a tool of escapism and also the power of writing for wellbeing. The charity strives to support children and young people to develop their voice and ensure they are heard. In the middle of December, Grimm & Co was awarded a £500k Capital Kickstart grant as part of the government's Cultural Recovery Fund. This means that they are now in a position to push forward and complete phase 1 of the transformation of Talbot Lane Methodist Church. Although they are waiting for further funding news that would secure phase 2 (this would see the whole of the construction work secured), it means that no matter what, Grimm & Co will be able to reopen to the general public in some capacity by the end of 2021.

It is in this new building where they plan to expand their reach, working with more children and young people in Rotherham and throughout the region.

Hope Fields


