Case Studies

Improving the Environment and empowering communities

Hellaby Ward Councillors are committed to working towards improving the environment in their ward. They have purchased a Handi- cart for the Hellaby litter picking group who are volunteers that carry out regular litter picks keeping their streets free from litter. Councillors have funded a community skip which has allowed local residents to dispose of bulky items.

Supporting local groups to reduce social isolation

Hellaby Ward Councillors have supported local groups who improve the lives of people of all ages. For example The Dodgers and Forget-Me Not are groups that support older people to tackle social isolation and they have received funding towards a summer trip and Christmas lunch. Wickersley Musical Theatre group support younger people and they have received funding towards children's costumes for forth coming shows.

Crime prevention products

Residents told the Councillors that they needed to feel safe so in response to this and emerging hot spot areas the Councillors purchased a range of security items such as shed alarms, mobility scooter alarms, window alarms, card defender wallets and dusk till dawn lights. A series of safety events have been held in local community centres where in partnership with South Yorkshire Police residents have been able to speak to the police about how to keep themselves and their homes safe and take away their free security items.
