#### Case study

Treeton Village Picker Litters

Residents in Treeton have come together to form a new group that aims to keep their village clean and tidy. Members of the group met during a Ward Funded Community Skip and litter pick day in Treeton.

The day was part of the Great British Spring Clean campaign, which involved a wide range of people all working together to host a skip and clean-up day.

The Neighbourhoods team, supported Treeton Community centre to host the event at their centre, the skip was located outside and everyone was invited to use the skip or meet at the centre to collect litter picking equipment to go out in the village to gather litter.

Streetpride love where you live officer provided the equipment on the day and brought along local residents that were already part of a litter picking scheme in the area.

The event was held on a Saturday to enabled adults, families and children to attend. The day was a great success and as a result we have managed to support the development of a new group 'Treeton Village Picker Litters'.

The group now meet monthly and attract new people each time. Streetpride have worked with Ward members to secure them their own litter picking kit and cart. They are now planning to carry out weeding, moss clearing and sweeping as well as picking the litter as they go.



The group also identify environmental issues and hotspot areas whilst out in the vollage, this information is fed back to RMBC and discussed with Neighbourhood team and ward members to look at solutions and further projects.

The picks are held on the first Saturday of each month, meeting at 10am at Treeton Community centre, Pit Lane. Each litter pick is followed by refreshments and snacks for everyone who took part
