Dinnington Ward Profile 2017

Description

Dinnington lies in the south east of Rotherham Borough, with a population of 13,230 (2016) and an area of 3,581 hectares. The ward is based on the small town and parish of Dinnington (population 9,240) as well as the villages and parishes of Laughton on le Morthen (population 1,250), Firbeck (population 290), Letwell and Gildingwells (population 210). Also included is the village of Laughton Common (population 2,120) which is part of Thurcroft parish. The ward is very varied with extensive rural areas as well as an industrial area, a deprived former mining community and modern suburban housing estates, popular with commuters.

The population of Dinnington ward has increased since 2011, at a significantly higher rate than the Borough population. The age structure of the population is very similar to the Rotherham average.

3.6% of Dinnington residents were from a BME community in 2011, less than half the Borough average of 8.1%.

The number of dwellings in Dinnington has increased by 288 (+5.2%) since 2011 and there are 279 more households (+5.3%).

Housing in Dinnington is mainly owner occupied with a large proportion of detached houses. Private rented housing outnumbers the social rented sector, being mainly semi-detached and terraced, with relatively few flats.

Economic Activity and Employment

Total Employment by Workplace (2011): 5,536

Dinnington had fairly average proportions of people aged 16-74 in employment (63.4%) and workless (10.2%) in 2011. The number of jobs in the ward is equivalent to 87% of the local workforce.

Households claiming Housing or Council Tax Benefit (2014): 1,326 (23.4%) (Rotherham 25.6%)

The proportion of people claiming benefits of all types in Dinnington is at or just below the Rotherham average.

General Health and Disability

General Health bad or very bad (2011): 7% (Rotherham 7.6%, England 5.5%)

Limiting Long Term Illness or Disability (2011): 21.4% (Rotherham 22%, England 17.6%)

Claiming Disability Living Allowance (2015): 6.9% (Rotherham 7.6%, England 4.7%)

Dinnington had rates of poor health and disability slightly below the Borough average in 2011 but higher than the national average, reflected also in DLA claims in 2015.

Lifestyle and Specific Health Issues

Around half of health and lifestyle indicators are better (have lower rates) than Rotherham average and half worse. Around 5% of measures are significantly worse than Rotherham: emergency admissions in under 5s; hospital admissions for injuries in young people aged 15-24 years; and deaths from all causes (all ages). The period the data relates to is shown as (a) to (e) below and explained in the notes.

Compared to Rotherham average, Dinnington ward is **better** for (has lower rates/less): hospital admissions for injuries in under 5s (b); emergency hospital admissions for CHD (d); obese children in Year 6 (aged 10-11 years) (b); incidence of lung cancer (a); elective hospital admissions for knee replacement (d); and premature death from cancer (aged less than 75) (a).

In contrast, Dinnington ward is **worse** for (has higher rates/more): obese children in Reception Year (aged 4-5 years) (b); young people smoking occasionally (aged 11-17 years) and regular smokers aged 11-15 years (c); deliveries to teenage mothers (d); emergency admissions in under 5s (b); hospital admissions for injuries in young people aged 15-24 years (d); emergency hospital admissions for hip fracture for persons 65+ (d); premature deaths (aged less than 75) from circulatory diseases and coronary heart disease (CHD) (a); and deaths (all ages) for all causes, particularly from circulatory diseases, CHD, and stroke (a).

Key Stage 2 attainment in 2014 was below the Rotherham and national averages but secondary attainment was above average.

Crime and Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)

Recorded Crime (2016/17): 1,111 (84.0 per 1,000 population) (Rotherham 81.9) Recorded ASB (2016/17): 419 (31.7 per 1,000 population) (Rotherham 48.5)

Levels of recorded crime in Dinnington are just above the Rotherham average although ASB levels are lower. There is a concentration in the central area where 38% of crimes in the ward were recorded.

Index of Multiple Deprivation 2015

The Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) is a Government index for all areas in England. The 2015 index uses 37 indicators across 7 deprivation domains (themes) with a 2013/14 baseline. The IMD is only produced for Super Output Areas (SOAs) of which there are 167 in Rotherham (around 8 per ward) and 32,844 in England, each with around 1,500 people. SOAs are ranked across England where 1 is the most deprived. Any rank below 3,285 indicates that an area is within the 10% most deprived areas of England.



Deprivation in Dinnington

Deprivation in Dinnington is slightly below the Borough average although this fact hides a very wide range of variation within the ward. Central Dinnington is one of the most deprived parts of the Borough and areas to both sides of Lordens Hill are within the most deprived 10% of England. Most of Laughton and south Dinnington have deprivation well below the Borough average, most notably the modern private housing estates in South west Dinnington (around Limelands Road) which is the least deprived area in the ward.

Income deprivation overall is slightly below the Borough average in Dinnington although children in the ward are slightly more deprived than average.

The IMD is not published for wards but the average SOA score in Dinnington is 26.6, slightly below the Rotherham average score of 28.3, with an SOA equivalent rank of 9,909 (30th percentile).
